







2020 - A Year of Celebration and Remembrances

We are looking for volunteers to serve in this capacity. You are not required to sing, or wear a robe if that is what is holding you back. You can speak the Kyrie, and the congregation would sing the responses. Ideally, a team of 4-5 would help us cover each month without relying on 1 or 2.

The Joy Pack Ministry provides weekend food bags to 10 children at the Clarkdale-Jerome School and 35 children at the Cottonwood-Oak Creek School in Cornville who are food insecure. These children qualify for, and rely on, the school's free breakfast and lunch programs during the week but lack sufficient food on the weekend.

In November, the Joy Pack Ministry received a donation of \$1,000 from Country Bank thanks to Mark Tufte, bank manager. A big thank you to Randy Boardman, a friend of Spirit of Joy, for helping with the application process.

Thank you to Thrivent Members who have sponsored monthly Thrivent Action Teams for the Joy Pack Ministry in 2019. The cost of the Joy Pack Ministry runs between \$400-\$450 per month. Each Action Team Activity provides \$250 to be used to purchase needed items for the weekend bags.

Thrivent members are needed to sponsor a Thrivent Action Team in the months of January–May 2020. Requesting funds for an Action Team Activity is easy and can be done online or by phone. Request the funds and file an end of activities report. Every Thrivent Benefit Member can sponsor two Action Teams per year allowing you to help others. Having had the opportunity to see the smiles and excitement of several children who are receiving the weekend Joy Packs, we know the extra food is greatly appreciated.

Each Joy Pack includes 13 items: 2-Entrees (Mac N Cheese, Soup, Chili, etc.), 2-Breakfast Items (cereal, oatmeal, breakfast bar), 1-Shelf Stable Milk, 1-100% Juice Box, 2-Protein Items (Vienna Sausage, Tuna, Nut Butter, etc.), 2-Individual Fruit Cups, 1-Individual Vegetable Cup, 2-Snacks (cookies, granola bars, fruit snacks, etc.).



Our participation in the Verde Valley Neighborhood Food Project's bi-monthly Green Bag food collection event, other direct food donation from members and friends of our congregation, and community action grants (Thrivent and Country Bank) help keep the cost of this ministry down. However, some food items (above) must be purchased to meet the need. Monetary donations to help with the purchase of these items are greatly appreciated. Checks/cash marked "Joy Packs" will be used for this ministry.

Want to lend a hand? Join volunteers on Wednesdays, 3:00 pm in Bible Study 2, to fill the bags. Volunteers are needed to help with the Verde Valley Neighbor Food Project collection event the second Saturday of even months through the year (Feb., April, June, August, Oct., Dec.) from 9:45—11:30am at the Mountain View United Methodist Church parking lot on 12th Street in Cottonwood. The next collection event will be Saturday, December 14th.



Did You Know?

If you have a qualifying IRA Account, you can reduce your gross income by having your Required Minimum Distribution sent directly to Spirit of Joy Lutheran Church as a contribution. By doing so, you may possibly reduce your tax burden, but to be sure, you would need to consult with your tax advisor on how to properly handle this contribution relative to your tax return. Check with your bank or financial institution to determine if your IRA can be reported to the IRS as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) for this tax benefit.
