June has been a busy month. Glena and Tom Atkins and I attended Grand Canyon Synod Assembly, June 13-15. The main business of the Assembly was electing a bishop, approving the budget and electing representatives for Synod Council, the Discipline Committee, and voting attendees for the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, which will be held July 28 – August 2, 2025. Even if you are not a voting member, this would be an opportunity to attend the national Assembly, as it is being held in Phoenix. More news will be forthcoming as we get closer to the date.

The bishop's election was decided on the first ballot. Ecclesial balloting is a process of discernment of the call. All voting members nominate one person on the first ballot. A 75% majority is needed to elect on the first ballot. Otherwise, they go through a process of multiple candidates answering questions and more voting to get down to the top two candidates. Here is the result of the first (and only) ballot:

Verde Valley Homeless Coalition Needs List

Greatest Needs:

- Blankets or comforters (twin and full size)
- One or two-person tents and tarps
- Sleeping bags
- Backpacks
- Men's pants/jeans waist size 28-34
- Men's and women's undergarments
- ♦ VOLUNEERS! A couple of hours a week is so helpful to the facility. When you sort and put away donations, or greet people at the door, every kind word and action counts!

Always helpful for those experiencing homelessness: reading glasses (only \$1.25 at Dollar Tree!), earbuds, can openers, pens, small pads of paper, slime for bicycle tires, razors, period products, band-aids and antibiotic ointment (or small first aid kits), foot powder, towels, washcloths, fingernail clippers, small sewing kits, lip balm, hair brushes, toothbrushes, "instant" any food product (oatmeal, noodles, soup, hot chocolate, single serve crackers, cookies, etc.)

Always helpful for the shelter: 13– and 35–gallon trash bags, coffee, sugar, disposable plates, bowls, disposable utensils, (real) coffee cups, dish soap, laundry soap, salt and pepper, mayo, mustard, ketchup, hot sauce, salsa, jam, jelly.

What we have no need for at this time:

- Socks
- Clothing, for now, unless a special need has been identified.
- Large bottles of shampoo/conditioner (travel size is always welcome). Remember, they have to carry these things.



GRAND CANYON SYNOD ASSEMBLY— JUNE 13-15, 2024

Glena and I felt privileged to represent Spirit of Joy at the 2024 Grand Canyon Synod Assembly in Mesa.

It was all new for us as we had never attended a Regional Synod Assembly. Not knowing what to expect we just followed the agenda, helped with the service project, visited with exhibitors and attendees and participated in the Workshop sessions.

The highlight was the re-election of Bishop Deborah Hutterer on the First Voting Ballot receiving 75% of the qualified ballots.

We attended three of the workshops:

Getting Your House in Order—The workshop focused on End-of-Life Preparation. We all have good intentions but fail to plan ahead. This puts added burden on our family and our pastor. Neary half of Americans over 55 do not have a Will. We need to encourage estate planning which includes Wills, Power of Attorney, funeral arrangements, endowments and planning for ways to support the mission of Christ and your Church.

Hands on Church Physical—This session was led by people from Las Vegas, Yuma and Scottsdale that had closed their church, sold their property or merged with another congregation. They centered on three signals of trouble: 1) elderly aging congregation, 2) fewer giving members & 3) growing budget deficit annually. Recognizing that many congregations are faced with having to identify and make major changes, the sooner the required information is gathered and analyzed the better chance of long-term survival. Most of the information can be obtained through ELCA's website. Even though funding seems to be the center of discussions, growth of the membership needs to happen. They provided a copy of a Congregational Assessment Survey that can be found on the website and recommended that it be used as a beginning point to identify strengths and weaknesses. The average age of serving pastors is 70. Ministry is changing its looks from the old traditional way in order to attract the younger generation. The overall feeling I got from the attendees was: "How are we going to survive!!!" It was recommended that a church start by having all of the members and guests complete a Congregational Assessment Survey, then check the ELCA website or Grand Canyon Synod reports for vitality. There are many reports available about your church that can be analyzed to help support decisions to be made.

The Station Coffee Co.—Crossroads Lutheran Church of San Tan Valley was brainstorming ideas to create a steady source of income for the Church and also benefit the community. The idea of a Coffee Shop in Florence surfaced and with assistance from various locals, found a historic building on Main Street in Florence, obtained a loan from the ELCA Foundation, and after remodeling opened the coffee shop with paid employees and an office manager. They are presently utilizing an area in the shop for outreach to meet with local people and also streaming the service on Sunday's during the winter months. So far, the shop has been profitable after debt servicing and paying all expenses. Thus providing funds to the Church monthly.
