

Twenty-Five Years: Spirit of Boldness and Hope

As is the way of DRAFT schedules, they are likely to go through some revisions. During the anniversary month of March, we remember the **boldness** and **hopefulness** of our charter members as they moved forward into a new future.

On October 1, 1994, Pastor Peter Rose-Kamprath arrived in Cottonwood to minister to Spirit of Joy as our first called pastor; worship size was approximately 40. Pastor Rose-Kamprath was installed on August 13, 1995. Our Living Charter was signed January 29, 1995, and the congregation was recognized as an ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America) congregation in the Grand Canyon synod on April 23, 1995.

Worship was held in the Seventh Day Adventist Church up until 2010, when we moved to 101 S. Main Street in Cottonwood. Our office was in Suite D; Suite E was the Fellowship Suite, and Suite F was the Worship Center. This was the first time in our history that our office and worship space were located in the same building!

GUEST SPEAKER

To coincide with the theme of boldness and hope, we have invited Charlotte Shurtz from Lutheran Social Services (LSS) of the Southwest to speak between services on March 15th, and an additional community-wide presentation at 1:00pm, including ways to advocate for fair and compassionate policies and treatment for those fleeing harm's way and a better life. She will share with us the ministry to refugees and asylum seekers being done by LSS offices in Phoenix and Tuscon.

We are a church formed from and by immigrants. Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS) and LSS have been doing refugee resettlement for over 80 years, and quite possibly assisted one of our own ancestors when they came to this country. Boldness and Hope certainly describes the attitude needed as a refugee.

SERVICE PROJECT OPPORTUNITY

We will be assembling much needed diaper kits for Charlotte to take back with her. We will assemble them during Sunday School and fellowship hour beginning March 1st. Cash contributions to help purchase items for these kits are needed. Just mark your offering envelope – LSS Kits. Charlotte says they "also always need <u>gently</u> used toys that can be collected from people's home if your kids/grandkids no longer use them. Or Good-will always has good toys for a few dollars. Please sanitize toys with Clorox-like wipes before donating. We then deliver the toys to families. Many refugee children have their vital needs met, but few receive toys. So this is a great opportunity to spread joy and foster development in little children. NO SMALL PARTS OR SMALL TOYS PLEASE, AS THEY CONSTITUTE A CHOCKING HAZARD :)"

We need more items for the treasure table in fellowship hall...then we'll get more sales! Our check for over \$3000 went to Lutheran Disaster Response. Thanks for your support.



Summary

Winner, 2009 Pulitizer Prize

At times stern, at other times patient, at times perceptive, at other times in sad denial, Olive Kitteridge, a retired schoolteacher, deplores the changes in her little town of Crosby, Maine, and in the world at large.

But she doesn't always recognize the changes in those around her: a lounge musician haunted by a past romance; a former student who has lost the will to live; Olive's own adult child, who feels tyrannized by her irrational sensitivities; and her husband, Henry, who finds his loyalty to his marriage both a blessing and a curse.

As the townspeople grapple with their problems, mild and dire, Olive is brought to a deeper understanding of herself and her life–sometimes painfully, but always with ruthless honesty. *Olive Kitteridge* offers profound insights into the human condition–its conflicts, its tragedies and joys, and the endurance it requires.
