







Dear Community of Spirit of Joy,

It certainly was with a Spirit of Joy that our community Blessed and Sent on their way over 100 quilts to be used around the world by Lutheran World Relief for the comfort of refugees, people who are homeless, and those who are victims of violence and disaster. And that's not all the story – you will read further in this issue of an impact you are making across the church through our Quilters. Indeed, it is "God's work, and our hands." This is made possible by people working together, each doing their own part, in the Beloved Community. Our congregation is a precious gift to be nurtured, supported, and celebrated.

In the Beloved Community we have the privilege of learning about God's love for all his creation, and the continuing saga of God's redeeming Grace. It is a chosen environment through which we grow in faith, understanding and the stewardship of our lives – to live with Christ as our Lord and Redeemer.

A number of learning options have begun - a study of the Book of Job is being led by Pr. Niomi Barcanic, the Wednesday evening Worship-Bible study is beginning to work with the book of Genesis through video presentations by Dr. Craig Koester, Professor of New Testament at Luther Seminary, and a Spiritual Growth Group has begun a six-week journey reading Paul's letter to the churches in Galatia.

At the very beginning of that letter Paul writes: "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, who gave himself for our sins to set us free from the present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father..." Paul is calling us to hear a Gospel of Freedom – Freedom in Christ; freedom 'from' and freedom 'for'. What is that all about today? What would it be like if each one of us could give a studied and personal witness to what that freedom in Christ means – to us, and to the world. Think about it.

One of those freedoms has to do with how we are stewards of our time, our talents and our 'treasure'. In the coming weeks we will be highlighting 'stewardship'......stewardship with a Spirit of Joy....stewardship as a choice we make day by day...the stewardship of our lives in the Beloved Community. We do this as we set our hearts and minds to the challenge of finding and calling a new pastor to lead our Beloved Community. We will find that our response to such a challenge begins within each one of us doing business with the Lord.

I look forward to sharing that challenge with you as we continue our 'transition journey' together. In this we are not alone: We are led and guided by the Spirit of Joy. Amen?


Jesus taught about the responsibility of managing God-given resources and the importance of generosity and tithing.

### **QUILT SUNDAY—SEPTEMBER 21, 2025**

The Joyful Crafters have had a busy year. On Sunday, September 21, they displayed the quilts made since March, and the total number of quilts made this year adds up to 107. Pr. Braaten blessed the quilts and they will be sent to Lutheran World Relief in October. Laura and Kip Stransky and Elizabeth Tavasci will take the boxed quilts to Atonement Lutheran Church in Glendale for the Ingathering on October 17. From there they will go to Denver, then on to Minneapolis to be distributed around the world to refugees, those needy in war zones, and to those who have lost their homes due to severe weather. Last year Lutheran World Relief sent out over 370,000 quilts to 16 different countries including the US.

On October 17 and 18 there will be a quilt show at SOJ by the Quail Country Quilters. They will be showing some of their handywork and also have a boutique where items will be sold. The Joyful Crafters will be serving a sack lunch both days, also coffee and baked goods mid-morning. Please donate some cookies or bars to sell for this fund-raising event and enjoy the show.

Thanks to all the crafters for their giving of time and talent, thanks to all who have donated fabric and sheets for making quilts, and thanks to all of you who have bought a quilt and donated money so that we can afford to buy batting for the quilts. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.
