Advent begins a new Liturgical year, at least for us Lutherans. The primary Gospel we will be reading in our worship during the next 12 months is the witness of Matthew.



Matthew introduces a name for the Christ Child – **Emmanuel**, which means "God with us". It is a theme we highlight as we surround the lighting of our Advent Candles each Sunday with a familiar hymn: "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel".

Jennifer and I look forward to celebrating Advent and Christmas with you this year. May we all together be warmly embraced by the meaning and beauty of this wonderful name for the mysterious reality of God's divine presence: **Emmanuel!**


