Bishop Mike will celebrate the 10:30 am.Mass.


Father Bill Quinlivan will concelebrate. Led by the AOH and KOE Color Guard, members of Buffalo Irish and Irish

2022 marks the 100th anniversary of the publication of James Joyce's novel *Ulysses*, widely acknowledged as one of the most important publications of the twentieth century. The University at Buffalo James Joyce Collection is looking forward to the centenary as an opportunity to honor Joyce's literary legacy and to promote the UB James Joyce Collection worldwide.

THE JAMES JOYCE COLLECTION comprises more than 10,000 pages of the author's working papers, notebooks, photographs, correspondence, portraits, publishing records, important memorabilia and ephemeral material, as well as Joyce's private library and the complete body of significant Joyce criticism. The Collection distinguishes UB as the leading resource for Joyce scholarship.

We will welcome James Maynard PhD and Alison Fraser PhD from the UB Libraries, who will give two special presentations based on the internationally renowned UB Joyce Collection.

The mom reached out to me as past director, said she had 2 children and several friends with children who would be interested in Gaelic and Irish cultural music, and the 2nd generation of the Celtic Angels was formed.



We currently practice one weekday a month in the early evening in a host home and join in the BIC Saturday Singing sessions once a month to learn from our community. We have 4 members, ranging in age from 4 to 8 years old, with a deputy member under the

We will be starting in the Kids' Tent crafting St Brigid's crosses, followed by an interactive performance in the cultural tent.
