

## Soap box veteran finally gets win

Three times proved to be the charm for soap box derby racer Angelique Arcala yesterday at Golf Links and Pantano roads.

Racing for her third time in as many years, the 16-year old Arcala won the Kit Car division by edging second place finisher Brandon Sallaway in the final race of a double-elimination event.

"This morning I got a twinge - I felt tingly - and I though I might win, but I didn't want to get my hopes up," said Arcala, a junior at Salpoint Catholic High School.

This was Arcala's last year because of her age.

Thirty-two Kit Car drivers between the ages of 9-16 raced down a 1,200 foot hill for the chance to go to the World Championships in Akron, Ohio, on August 7.

"It's unbelievable," said her father, Barry, who helped her build the Sonic Boom, her derby car.

"She just wanted to keep trying each year. I think what finally did it was all the practice. She really kept the car straight," he said.

"Angelique was the first girl to register three years ago," said Don Clor, race director.




### **Directions**
