AGENT ORANGE

Information has been received from Rep. Jim Kolbe's office that he is a cosponsor of H. R. 1129, which helps to protect any settlement Vietnam Veterans received from Agent Orange. Under this bill veterans would not have to declare the settlement as income for federal tax and program purposes. This legislation currently has 72 sponsors and has been referred to the House Committee on On the State level, Barry Arcala and I have met with Rep. Government Affairs. Ruth Solomon and she plans to either sponsor legislation herself or to work with Rep. Jim Hartdegen in doing so. The State legislation would shelter the Agent Orange Payments from State taxation. Barry has also requested that this item be placed on the agenda for the next Tucson City Veterans Affairs Committee.

RETIREMENT

Last year we were very active in lobbying for the passage of the Senate Bill which would allow Veterans to buy back time (spent in the Military Service) in the State Retirement System. Everyone was elated when this was included in the retirement package, passed at the end of the last legislative session. However, it was soon discovered that the formula for the buy back was at no cost to the Therefore the cost to the individual Veteran is so exorbitant that it is prohibitive to most. The formula cannot be changed as it is consistent with preceding buy backs. This year the strategy is to join forces with the Arizona Education Association and others who are lobbying for a bill that would allow a person in the State Retirement System to retire with 80 points rather than 85. Recently letters endorsing this plan have been sent to Sen. Doug Todd and to Rep. Jane Hull, who are the Co-Chairpersons of the Retirement Committee. report is due the end of this year.

EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE

On December 31, 1989, educational benefits will expire for some 750,000 veterans which the VA estimates are still potentially eligible, some of whom ar

There are approximately 60,000 enrolled in schools and receiving assistance. veterans who are currently enrolled in educational or training programs and they have been notified that their payments will terminate the end of the year. We have been in support of Senate Bill 945, introduced by Senator McCain, as it would "ensure that all veterans eligible to receive educational assistance unde

the Veteran' Educational Assistance Program have 10 years after discharge or release from active duty in which to pursue a program of education with such assistance."

PTSD

H.R. 3037 has 43 sponsors in the House of Representatives. It calls for adding at least 15 inpatient PTSD units by 1991 and 15 more by 1994, for a total of 30 additional units. The Vet Center is expanded by adding at least 20 centers by 1991 and 20 more by 1994, for a total of 40 more units. encourages the DAV to recruit qualified professionals to administer PTSD care. It gives statutory authority to the Advisory Committee on Readjustment of Veterans. It creates a research program for the treatment of PTSD. Also it establishes a pilot program for PTSD in halfway houses.
