#### **TOWNSHIP ORDINANCES / PERMITS**

#### **ORDINANCE # 522**

Smoke & Carbon Monoxide detectors must be installed in all buildings.

#### **ORDINANCE #557**

House numbers must be displayed three inches high in front and rear of all buildings.

#### ORDINANCE # 162 AS AMENDED STREET PARKING

No on-street parking between 3:00 AM to 6:00 AM (except by permit). Parking permits must be renewed January 1<sup>st</sup> each year, or as soon as you move into the Township, **if eligible**. The application for permits can be printed from the website (www.darbytwp.org) or picked up at the Township Building or Police Department. Permits must be affixed to the **LEFT REAR BUMPER**. No on-street parking of commercial vehicles from 6:00 PM to 6:00 AM. Parking permits may be purchased at the Police Department, 2 Studevan Plaza, Sharon Hill, Monday-Friday, 10 A.M. to 12 NOON and 2 P.M. to 4 P.M. or Darby Township Municipal Building, 21 Bartram Avenue, Glenolden, PA, 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. **Handicap parking spaces require a parking permit. The cost is \$20.00 for yearly permits and \$10.00 for monthly permits**.

#### **ORDINANCE #385 CURFEW**

Children under 18 years of age
Friday & Saturday 11:00 PM
Sunday to Thursday 10:30 PM
If not accompanied by a Parent.

#### ORDINANCE # 664 SCHOOL DAY CURFEWS

No children of school age shall remain in or upon any public place or establishment, outside any school ground between the hours of 8:30 AM and 3:00 PM Monday to Friday while school is in session.

#### SUBDIVISION AND LAND DEVELOPMENT

The Township follows the County of Delaware ordinance regulating the subdivision of land, adjustments of lot lines and the development of lots for single family, multi-family or all non-residential development. Plans are subject to review by the appropriate planning board, zoning hearing board and ultimately approval or rejection by the Board of Commissioners.

#### ORDINANCE # 483 ANIMALS, BARKING & LOOSE DOGS

This ordinance states that it is unlawful to permit a dog to run at large upon a public thoroughfare, private property other than that of the owner. Owners are responsible for immediate removal and proper disposal of all animal waste from their animal which is on any public or private property. To report any stray animal call the Police Department at 610/583-3245 or 911, or the Township office 610/586-1514. If an animal has to be destroyed it is the resident's responsibility and not the Township to bear the cost. Please do not feed stray animals as they will become your responsibility.

#### ORDINANCE # 511 AS AMENDED

Use and occupancy permits are required whenever anyone new moves into the Township.

#### ORDINANCE #741 AS AMENDED RECREATION FIRE PITS

Recreation Fires are permitted only between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. The following devices are permitted: a portable, above ground commercially manufactured wood burning or propane or natural gas fire pit lined with a non-combustible material. A wood-burning chiminea made of a non-combustible material. A permanently constructed fireplace or fire pit lined with a non-combustible material such as brick, rock, concrete or heavy gauge material.

No recreational fire may have a burning area that exceeds seven square feet or a three foot diameter circle. Any spark arrester screens required by the device manufacturer need to be in place when in use. The use of a fire screen is required to prevent hot sparks from flying into the air.

Recreational burning must not take place within twenty five feet of any combustible materials, residence, shed, fence or other structure, trash, wood storage, trees and/or brush or tall grass. An extinguisher source must be readily available and close by while fire is burning; garden hose, fire extinguisher, water bucket. A responsible adult over the age of 18 must be present at all times while fire is burning; and no fire shall exceed approximately 2 feet in height. Must be placed on stable ground and on non-combustible surface. Must not be conducted underneath any branches, roofing, porches, awnings or any similar overhead covering. No burning is allowed on any streets or sidewalks within the Township.

The fire and/or police department shall have the authority that burning be extinguished immediately if such usage is not compliant with this ordinance.

#### **PERMITS**

Permits are required by the Township for a number of activities which include, but not limited to the following: new construction, heating and central air conditioning, plumbing, electrical, additions, alterations, sheds, swimming pools, concrete work, fences, driveways, patios, decks, sewer work, sewer tie-ins, signs, including temporary signs, banners. Please call the Township to see if a permit is required.

Completing a permit application does not mean your permit has been approved. Your application is the first step in the permit process. You will be notified within 7-14 days of the status of your permit. Apply early!

All plans must be reviewed for compliance with the township building code and zoning ordinance # 670. The cost of a permit is nominal and could avoid significant cost later on, which may be incurred, if ordinances are ignored. Fees will be doubled if work begins before the permit is issued. All permits can be downloaded from the website (www.darbytwp.org)

For your protection, as a resident and homeowner, when hiring a contractor, make sure they are licensed and insured. Have them provide you references, a copy of their PA State License and liability coverage. You should check with the PA Attorney General's Office at 717-787-3391 to ensure their credentials are up to date. This will also disclose if there are any complaints or incidents against them.

All contractors must be licensed by the Township, if not licensed by the State of Pennsylvania.

#### **TRASH COLLECTION**

Trash and garbage will be collected twice a week year round. Garbage should be wrapped or put in separate plastic bags and mixed with the trash. When outdoors, trash and garbage must be in suitable containers with lid firmly attached. Trash must be placed outside of fences and hedges to be collected.

Building material, automobile parts and truck and auto tires will not be picked up. Wood, tree limbs, bushes, rugs etc., shall be cut into three foot lengths and bundles for pickup. Do not put partially filled metal or plastic paint or oil containers in with the regular trash. MATTRESSES MUST BE WRAPPED IN PLASTIC

Trash and garbage will be picked up in accordance with the following schedule:

#### WARDS 1, 2, 3, 4 (1-500 Block Stratford Road Odd Side)

Regular Pickup – Monday and Thursday Bulk pickup every Thursday

#### Wards 4 and 5 (except 1-500 Block of Stratford Road odd side)

Regular pickup – Tuesday and Friday Bulk pickup every Friday

Friday after Thanksgiving – Regular Friday Trash will be collected, no other Trash will be collected.

Christmas trees will be collected on the following four (4) Wednesdays, January 4<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, and the 25<sup>th</sup>.

#### GRASS CLIPPING AND LEAF PICK UP

When cutting your grass in the spring and summer, please do not allow grass clippings to be thrown in the street. If you have someone cut your grass, please inform them as well. Warnings and citations will be issued.

Residents are reminded that burning of leaves and the sweeping of leaves into the streets is prohibited, except for the collection of leaves from November 1 to November 30. Follow the street sweeping schedule.

#### YARD WASTE & LEAVES

Delaware County Compost Farm will be available the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month from January to September at 895 Sussex Avenue, Marple, PA from 7:00AM to 4:00 PM., daily. The compost is free and must be picked up. Leaves should be placed curbside for collection from November 1<sup>st</sup> to November 30<sup>th</sup>. In the rear of homes the leaves should be placed in plastic bags for collection. **Leaf collection will follow the street sweeper schedule.** 

#### **TREES**

Any tree on your property that is creating a safety hazard for pedestrians must be trimmed. Also, tree branches must be eight feet (8') off the sidewalk. All dead branches should be removed from the tree.

#### **EVENT PERMITS**

Block parties, Tag Days, Parades, Yard Sales and Township Park Events all require a permit at no cost. We do this so that police, fire and ambulance personnel are aware of all events. Please apply for the permit 30 days in advance, and no less than two (2) weeks prior to the event, to ensure proper approval.

#### **POOLS**

Upon removing water from a pool, the water may not go into the sanitary sewer, but must go into the storm sewer.

#### RENTAL LICENSE

Effective January 1, 2013, all rental properties in the Township of Darby must complete an application for a rental license from the township administration office. This includes all single family dwellings, multi-family dwellings, apartment complexes, industrial units, businesses, and cell towers. Each property will be inspected to ensure that they are in compliance with all Township ordinances and codes.

#### **SNOW REMOVAL**

Snow removal Ordinance # 560 states that all sidewalks (including side of homes) MUST be cleared of all snow within twenty-four (24) hours after the snow has stopped falling.

During winter storms, we have a difficult time in keeping the streets clear of snow. After the streets are plowed, the residents clean off their vehicles and sidewalks and throw the snow back into the streets creating a hazardous condition, not to mention ice ruts in the street. Please be considerate of the efforts of the township to keep the streets clear and place the snow on your front lawn.

#### **OBSTRUCTION OF ROADWAYS**

The vehicle code of Pennsylvania states that anything placed in the street to save a parking space during a snowstorm, or after, is considered an obstruction of roadway.

The Township will remove any items that are placed in the street and take them to the Darby Township Highway Garage, 1011 Clifton Avenue, Darby Township, PA (Sharon Hill Post Office) where they can be picked up by the owners.

#### **RECYCLING CONTAINERS**

The Township provides recycling containers to assist residents in recycling. Please check your schedule each week for what is being recycled. (See Page 18)

By order of the Township of Darby Board of Commissioners, effective immediately, regular trash disposed of in recycling containers will not be picked up by the trash company. Please place regular trash in trash receptacles, not in the blue recycling containers. If you continue to use the recycling container for trash, a citation will be issued. Thank you for your cooperation!

#### RECYCLING

Aluminum, bi-metallic cans, newspapers and plastic will be picked up in the recycling containers that have been provided by the Township. **Trash does not go into these containers.** Newspapers may be placed in brown paper bags or tied and bundled. #### **SEWER CONCERNS**

The Township has been receiving an increased number of complaints related to SEWER BACKUPS into the basements of homes. Those backups are the result of backflows into bathroom facilities that were installed into the basements and/or lower floors. These bathroom facilities were not permitted by the Township and in fact would not have been permitted by our plumbing inspectors due to this type of problem. While we realize that these backups create UNSANITARY CONDITIONS, the Township DOES NOT accept responsibility for this condition. In addition to such bathroom facilities being in violation of our various building codes, it places an undue financial burden on the Township and those residents who abide by the permitting requirements and building codes of the Township.

Please be advised that the Township of Darby and/or the related sewer authorities (Muckinapates and Darby Creek Authority) WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE for any sewer backups into any home basements that maintain bathroom facilities in the lower floors of the home.

The Township has not issued any such permits for these facilities, and furthermore, an issued Use and Occupancy Certificate is not an authorization to maintain those bathroom facilities in the lower floors of the homes. Any such facilities and resulting damage, due to flooding or sanitary sewer backups, are thesole responsibility of the homeowner.

It is our suggestion to remove the bathroom facilities from your basement and to cap any and all sanitary drain pipes in accordance with the plumbing and building codes to alleviate this potential problem. We are asking for your cooperation and understanding in dealing with this problem. The Township hopes that such corrective measures will alleviate these types of issues.

SEWERS: The disposing of grease into your sanitary sewer is ILLEGAL.



# Clean Water Starts With You





Stormwater is runoff that comes from hard surfaces including roofs, walkways, driveways, and lawn grasses. The stormwater that leaves our properties enters the storm sewer system where it is discharged into our local waterways. Runoff from our properties can carry pet waste, oil, fertilizer, road salt, pesticides and large volumes of water into our streams. These lead to reduced water quality and flooding.



### **Green Stormwater Management**

Taking small steps to manage some or all of the stormwater on your property can improve water quality and reduce flooding. Steps include: replacing lawn area with native plants; planting trees and shrubs; installing rain gardens; rain barrels and downspout planters; and reducing the use of fertilizers and road salt. It is also important to pickup pet waste that can wash into the street and fix any leaks from automobiles.

# Solutions to Stormwater Pollution



**Install Rain Barrels** 

Collect rainwater from your roof in a rain barrel for later use in your yard.



#### Install a downspout planter

Planters that connect to a downspout reduce runoff by allowing plants to absorb stormwater.



#### **Plant Trees and Riparian Buffers**

Trees absorb large amounts of rainfall. Buffers are vegetated areas along creeks that protect streambanks and help improve water quality.



#### **Rethink Landscaping Practices**

Reduce fertilizer and pesticide use as well as increase the use of native plants in the place of lawn.



**Build a Rain Garden** 

A rain garden is a depressed garden that collects and infiltrates runoff from your roof and paved surfaces.



#### **Reduce Pollution**

Pick up pet waste. Never put yard clippings in the stormsewer system as this can create water pollution and clog pipes. Prevent leaks from cars and pick up any litter.



Only Rain in the Storm Drain

The stormsewer system is for rainwater only. The storm sewer system drains directly to our streams so anything dumped into the system that isn't rainwater will create pollution to our local waterways. If you see anything discharging from an outfall pipe that is not stormwater call your local municipal office. If after hours you can report the situation to the PA Department of Environmental Protection at 1-800-541-2050.


