While preparing the 2023 budget, holding the line on taxes was the top priority for the Board of Commissioners. Keeping in mind how the increases in the cost of food, gas and energy rates have affected families bottom line, not increasing taxes was the goal. Any increases in sewer and trash are pass through fees, meaning, those increases are directly from the supplier not the Township.

We thank you for honoring your obligation to pay your Township taxes, sewer and trash fees, which is vital for the townships sustainability and to meet its financial obligations.

In 2022, we were faced with some unimaginable situations, that we hope will never happen again. With that, we will continue to work on our plan for fire service in the Township so that our residents feel protected. With our aging police force, the Board is committed to hiring new police officers as our current officers reach their well-deserved retirement. Residents want to live in safe neighborhoods and our Police Department is committed to providing that security.

We will continue to apply for grants to improve our parks and look for ways to increase recreation for all Township residents.

Finally, the Township Administration remains steadfast in responding to the daily request of our residents with the objective of resolving all concerns.

Noteworthy Achievements of 2022

Grants Awarded:

- DCNR Grant was awarded in the amount of \$313,700 for improvements to Studevan Field. This is a 50% Match Grant
- DELCO GreenWays Mini-PROS Grant was awarded for a Comprehensive Open Space and Recreation Plan awaiting contracts from the County (up to \$250,000)
- DELCO GreenWays Mini-Pros Grant was awarded for a Comprehensive Open Space and Recreation Plan in the amount of \$42,100.
- 2022 CDBG was Awarded for Madison Avenue Pedestrian Improvements, in the amount of \$57,875. This
 grant was used as leverage for the DCNR grant match
- Demolition of 608 Clifton Avenue

Administration:

- Maintained an operations staff of 7 Full Time staff members
- Increased our Part Time staff to 6 members
- Permits Issued: 495 as of October 31, 2022
- Responded to 223 Right-to-Know requests
- Responded to 222 resident concerns (began tracking in September 2022)

Public Works/Highway Dept:

- Maintained 4 full time employees with the addition of 1 new employee, we are now a staff of 5
- ARPA funds have allowed the Township to order a new dump truck with an estimated delivery date of fall 2023
- Purchased a generator for use by both the Highway and Police Dept.
- In the process of completing the 2022 Road Program through Liquid Fuels funding

License and Inspections:

- 1 New Part Time Certified Code Official
- 1 New Part Time Property Maintenance Official
- Installation of the iWorQ Software with an "Go Live" date of January 1, 2023

Police Department:

- Promoted a Part Time officer to full time now we have 15 Full Time and 4 Part Time officers
- Retired two Police vehicles
- ARPA Funds allowed the Township to purchase 3 new police vehicles that are currently in use and 2 chief units that are expected to arrive in 2023
- Senator Anthony H. Williams provided the Police Dept with a \$10,000 grant

Emergency Management:

 Appointment James Childs, Retired Chief of Police, as the Township Emergency Management Coordinator

Fire Service:

- Appointment of the Fire Marshall Rufus Stokes
- Appointment of the Assistant Fire Marshal James Childs

- 5 Members are appointed to the Board, with each member representing a Ward
- Meetings are held as needed
- Members attended 2 training seminars
- Held 2 meetings for introduction of new members to discuss roles and responsibilities
- The ZHB heard 5 cases this year for special exceptions and/or variance appeals
