




- ✓ US , UK and Australia have major chunk of international student according to a report 40% of Indian student go UK and US for there Higher Studies.

Diversify social reform is one of the key drivers for the students enrolling for international higher education. understanding, the national cultural identity are still significant Some countries are interested in the export of education institutions for nation building purposes. 	Human Resource Development	The knowledge economy, demographic shifts, mobility of the labour force, and increased trade in services are factors driving nations to place more importance on developing and recruiting human capital or brain power through international education initiatives
	Strategic Alliances	The international mobility of students and academics as well as collaborative research and education initiatives are being productive ways to develop closer geopolitical ties and economic relationships.
	Student and Staff development	There seems to be renewed emphasis on internationalization as a means of enhancing the international and intercultural understanding and skills of students and staff
	Commercial Trade	In the last decade, more emphasis has been placed on economic and income-generating opportunities.
\$ E k	Income generation	On the other side of the ledger from human development is the motivation of economic development.
	Nation Buildings	While some countries are interested in the export of education, others are interested in importing education programs and institutions for nation building purposes


















Number of student enrollments has been increased in last decade. The key reason for it working preference after study they get in Host nation



Between April 2000 to December 2018, inflow of \$2.21 billion has been witnessed as a foreign direct investment (FDI) in education sector.





