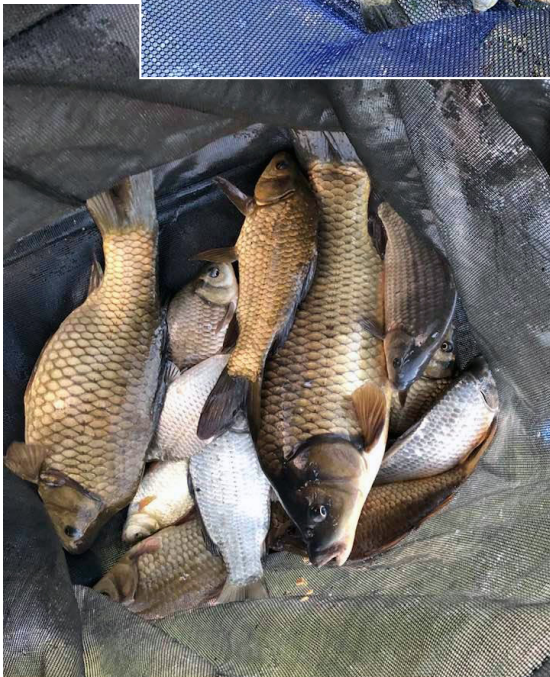


FISHERY REPORTS
