A warm welcome to our new members and returning existing members for this new season. We remind all members new and old of our basic fishery rules.

Barbless hooks only, no braided line under any circumstances, maximum breaking strain of 8lbs, no fixed bolt rigs except for Guru X Safe rigs, no fish over 2lbs to be kept in keep nets except in matches (special rules apply) and not nuts or beans as bait. We have found banned tackle at our fisheries and as a consequence, tackle checks will be made and if the rules have been broken your membership may be terminated.

Fishery News

February marked the 15th anniversary of the start of the construction of our Beauchamps Fishery in Shopland Road. Below are photographs of the field that it used to be, during construction and as it is now. A lot of work has gone in over the years by our members and all should be proud of what has been created from an unused field to both a great fishery and environmental "paradise". A big thank you to all members, past and present who have helped over the years to achieve and construct our own fisheries.



We have all been complaining about the recent amount of rain we have been having, although for the club it now means that Beauchamps lake is is on the way to being full which sets us up well if we have another dry summer. To

assist in this we have been removing some more willow trees, as a mature tree they can drink over 150 gallons per day. However, we will be replacing them with more appropriate plants as and when finances enable us to purchase them.

Fishing this winter on the whole has been very good on all our


