## Security

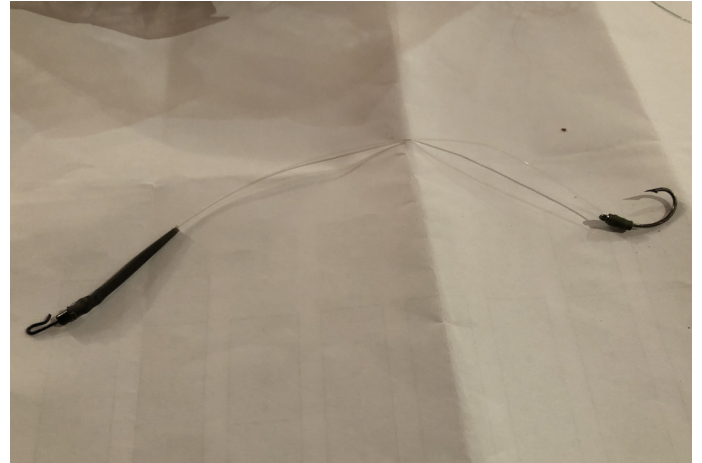

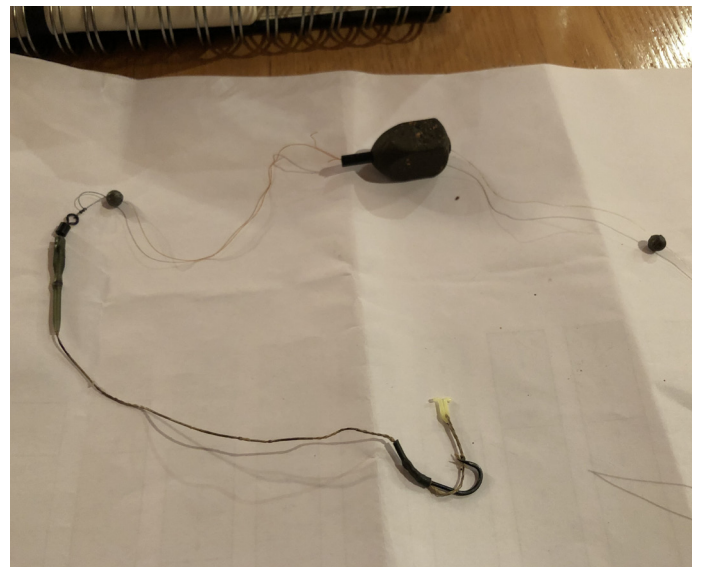

## Illegal Tackle

Once again illegal tackle has been found at our Lambourne fishery and no doubt at our Beauchamps fishery too.



Barbed hooks are banned as is any type of braid, even short lengths. It should be noted that most shop bought carp rigs i.e Korum end tackle, have braid. Please take time to read our rules, failure to comply with our rules could lead to suspension from our club. Another thing to remember if you are in a swim alone and your partner or friend is fishing in another swim you both must be in possession of a landing net and if putting fish on the ground an unhooking mat must be used.





## Club Open Day

The club is holding a club open day for club members and guests on 25th May 2020 at our Beauchamps Fishery. The money raised from this event is going to two charities, Havens and the Cancer wards at Southend Hospital.

The Open Day starts at 9.30am and will run until 4.00pm.
