Flag Facts



As we see the flags out for Columbus Day, here are some flag-facts to think upon, from the editors.

Francis Bellamy was chairman of a committee of state superintendents of education, in the National Education Association. As chairman, he prepared the public school programs for the Columbus quadricentennial celebration, which took place on Columbus Day 1892.

He structured this public school program around a flag raising ceremony and flag salute. The flag salute would be his own Pledge of Allegiance. He had given a great deal of thought to the choice of words used, and what he decided on was: I pledge allegiance to my flag and the Republic for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all. It was published in the September 8th issue of *The Youth's Companion*, a leading family magazine of the day, and so was available all over the country for the Columbus Day programs. In October, it was decided that "to my flag and (to) the Republic for which it stands" was better.

In 1923 and 4, the National Flag Conference under the "leadership of the American Legion and the Daughters of the American Revolution" took a look at the Pledge's wording and changed the words "my flag" to 'the Flag of the United States of America', without the approval of the writer.

In 1954 The Knights of Columbus staged a campaign to add the words "under God" to the pledge. Congress took it upon itself to declare that official.

Several groups now use their own adaptations of the Pledge and would like theirs to become the version of choice for general use.


