





1876 Map of Broome County, the red star is the location of Maine, NY










Todd has been exploring the Nanticoke Valley with his magnetometer for years. He will inform you of his quest for our hidden "treasures."



The Gazebo is a ½ size replica built in 1976. The lot behind it, on Church Street, used to house Lincoln General Store. It burnt down in 1893.



1907 - Fourth of July Main Street (Route 26). The large building was the Tymeson Brothers



1893 Fire destroyed the Lincoln Store. Corner of Church and Main Streets . The Gazebo sits in front of where the store was.







Original Gazebo Maine NY circa 1903. It sat in the middle of the road. The Maine Community Band, first organized in 1861, would often play concerts in the Gazebo.





The empty lot north of this house used to have a General Store which burnt down around 1900. A recent need for a new septic system exposed its stone foundation along with artifacts.






Plat Map -1876

The **Taylor House** on Nanticoke Road. Was built in the **1820**'s. The house is a mile north of Bowers Corner. When Gardner Bowers arrived in Maine in 1822 from New Hampshire, to start his new life, the Taylor family lived up the road, they had five daughters. Gardner Sawin Bowers married Ashcah Taylor. They married in 1827, had six children. Bowers Corner (Tiona and Nanticoke Roads is one mile south.

Driving North on Nanticoke Road, 229 Nanticoke is the on the left.





The Taylor House on Nanticoke Road. Was built in the **1820**'s. The house is a mile north of Bowers Corner. Andrew Taylor Sep. 16, 1766 Beverly Essex County MA - Feb. 29, 1840 Maine NY. Jane *Dinsmore* Taylor 1777 – 1829 (second wife).

Many locations today have different names or are just a bare crossroads. If you use old documents or maps the town might have a different name in the past or is no longer there. Example Allentown was a busy community with a creamery, saw mill and even it own school house. Today the name is known due to the cemetery on route 26.

Allentown was named after the Ebenezer Allen Family that settled here in 1836



The <u>Allentown School</u> house still stands across Route 26 from the cemetery. It is now a home. "All early teachers had to do the janitor work as well as teaching. In the 20's and 30's there were many children from immigrants or children of foreign-born parents. Mr. Clarence Berry was a teacher 1930 – 31 Elton Parr taught all the grades from 1931 -33." from Shirley Woodward <u>A</u> <u>Short History of Maine</u>, 1973.



The Agricultural Fair existed for eight years in the 1870's at this location. This site was located next to where the current Maine Memorial Elementary School is found.

In case of locations that are adjacent to a school I suggest you contact the school principal as to what you are doing. You might want to volunteer to come into the school and show students what you have found.

Norton **Carriage Shops** Ca. 1840. on **Nanticoke Road.** The lot, in warm weather is rarely mowed and becomes very overgrown and therefore hard to work.



" The wagon shop was started by Henry Norton. He not only made wagons but made guns, fixed musical instruments. He pulled teeth, rubbed headaches away, and prepared bodies for burial. As a blacksmith he could make anything out of iron or steel. He was succeeded by his son George."


"The advertisement, printed by Republican Print in Binghamton advertised a combination spring platform wagon as the 'best carrying, easiest riding and most durable wagon in use." This wagon was patented by L.A. Davis & Bro. and manufactured by Geo. E. Norton. Mr. Norton was asking for dealers to sell these wagons. He also made heavy and light lumber wagons, platforms, carriages, buggies, and cutters. Repairing and painting of wagons was also done at the Norton wagon Shop." PITCHER'S MILLS

It is Open for Viewing in the summer months on Sunday from 1-4



The grist mill ground local grains and was powered by a water wheel located in the basement. It turned to an electrical motor to turn the belts in the 1930's. 1837 map showing location of mill pond and other features





Columbia Block General Store no longer standing however its former location is now a **paved parking lot**. Behind it was a creamery and tannery. The tannery property is now grown over with bushes and trees.



The **tannery** operated for over forty years ceasing production in 1893. Photo c. 1890. Located using the 1866 Plat Map of Maine.



E. H. Clark tannery began in 1832 enlarged in 1875. Painting by Clarence Stratton. 1976. Stratton recreated over 300 paintings of the Town of Maine.
