*Note there is a 10-15 min delay starting Rotary hall class as others use the hall before us.*






Don't worry about getting old, worry about thinking old.

I sent that 'Ancestry' site some information on my Family Tree. They sent me back a pack of Seeds, and suggested that I just start Over.


