Concerns of safety due to over growth of foliage at entrance of Big Elk/I-64

- ADOT will be contacted to determine who the responsibility is to maintain, ADOT or POA
 - In short-term neighbor Brian Marsh volunteered to weed whack and cut off rebar from a previous project that was left over.

Discussions of relationship between POA and Ranchers

- Melinda O'Neal is interested into finding grants for seed to help regenerate foliage due to overgrazing. The concern is viability of ranching moving forward and keeping them in business and not selling to developers.
