I had the police dispatcher direct Mr. COSTA to meet with me at Hull St. at Leonard Ave. (he had reported that the house was on Hull St.). After I met with Mr. COSTA we responded to his girlfriends house, we were subsequently let into the house by the tenant ~~XXXX~~ living on the second floor. When I got into Mr. COSTAS' girlfriends' apartment I found her on the bathroom floor, she had apparently died there.

On Friday, February 26, 1993 my sister, Lori Mariano had my mother bring over her daughter to my house. She had asked me a couple of days before that if I would take Lauren for about one week. Lori told me that she had not been feeling well, and that her daughter was getting on her nerves. Her daughter is one and one half years old. I told her that I told Lori that I would babysit for her since she was sick.

I last saw my sister on Monday March 1, 1993. She came over with my mother to bring some extra clothes for the baby. She told me that she was still not feeling good. On Monday my sister went to the doctors because she had some type of flu. I don't know what doctor she went to, or what medicine she was given for it. On Monday, she told me she went to the doctors, the day she went to the doctor was either on Friday or Thursday, February 25, or 26.

On March 2, Tuesday I called Lori three times with no answer. I tried in the morning, and in the afternoon, and finally around 5:00PM I reached her. I asked her how she was doing and she told me that she was really tired and that she had been sleeping all day. She asked me if I could pick her up the next day, which would have been Wednesday March 3, 1993. She wanted to cash her welfare check, and to go back to the doctor. I told her that I would pick her up on Wednesday.

Around 9:00AM or 10:00AM I went over to Lori's house but nobody answered the door. I knocked and rang the bell, but nobody answered. I checked the mail box, but the check was not in there. I called her all day and night but

nobody answered.

I called Henry around 7:00PM and asked him if he had heard from Lori and he told me that he talked to her on Monday or Tuesday night.

Between Wednesday and Saturday I kept on calling Lori's but nobody answered. Around 12:00 noon, Henry came over to my house and asked me if I had heard from Lori, and I told him no. He said that Lori must have gone out because she wasn't answering. I thought that it was possible because she used to do this before she had her child. I asked Henry what he was going to do, and he told me that he would go by the house.

Within one hour Henry came back to my house and told my boyfriend, Richard Duarte that he had gone by the house and Lori did not answer the door. I was not home at that time.

I don't know what friends of hers have keys to the apartment, I don't, and when I asked Henry if he had keys, he told me that he didn't either.

Today, Henry came over to my house around 11:00AM. He asked me if I found out anything new, and I told him no. Henry told me that it was not like Lori to be gone for so long. He asked me what I was going to do, and I told him that I was going to go by the house and check again. He told me that he had already been, and was not going back.

My sister had a drug problem with Cocaine, and other things that I am not sure of. She was being treated by East Bay Mental Health for depression and Schizophrenic symptoms. I don't know what drugs she was taking now, but my mother could tell you.

After reading this I want to change one thing. The baby was not getting on my sisters nerves, she was just acting up for the past couple of days.

I have known Lori Lee Mariano for about seven years. I knew her before she got married when her maiden name was Malloy. I was introduced to her by my mother Assunta Lescarbeau, who often took in people who were referred to her by mental health clinics. My mother took in Lori sometime in 1984 or 1985.

I was living at home at the time and Lori lived with us for about two years and then went out on her own. My mother had told me that Lori had a drug problem with cocaine, pills, and alcohol. To my knowledge she stayed clean during the time that she lived with us. After she moved out I still stayed in touch with her and I saw her as recently as maybe a month ago. She popped in over my house and stayed about ten minutes. She appeared straight to me.

This past Tuesday or Wednesday I received a phone call from Lori at home. She sounded groggy to me and giggled alot and I thought that she was high on some drug. I asked her what she had taken and she told me she had taken some pills but that she didn't know what they were. She said that they made her feel good. She continued to slur her words and I had trouble understanding what she was saying. I talked with her for about half an hour to forty five minutes. We talked about things in general and I think that she said someone was there with her but I can't say for certain. She also spoke with my mother. I wasn't all that alarmed because Lori had

told me in the past that she had been doing drugs since she was fourteen and doing tricks since then also. I figured she had been doing drugs all those years and nothing had ever happened. I knew that her baby wasn't with her so I didn't have to be concerned about that.

She told me that she had gone shopping with her mother on Monday and that her sister had her baby. I knew that her daily routine was to have tricks come to the apartment and that she never went out to socialize. Basically she was supporting her habit. This past Tuesday or Wednesday is the last time that I spoke with her.

This past Sunday morning at about 10:00 I received a telephone call from a good friend of Lori's named Henry. He asked me if Lori was with me or if I had seen or heard from her. When I told him no he said that he was worried about her because they had gotten into a small argument over her wanting cocaine so much. He didn't say when they had the argument but he did say that he had been trying to call her for a week but that she didn't answer the phone. He seemed really worried and concerned, and said that she hadn't come to get her check. My mother had told me that she was on social security and he may have told me too. I figured that was the check he was talking about, but I didn't ask him specifically.

He told me he had seen her the previous Monday when he picked her up somewhere. I think that he said that he took her to cash her check and then took her to buy coke. He said that after that she did coke for four days straight. He also said that he talked with her again because she called him for cigarettes sometime after that Monday, but he didn't say what day. He said he brought her cigarettes up to the door but didn't go in because he was still mad at her.

He told me that one day he and Lori were just about to go into the bedroom and she had mentioned she wanted more coke. He disagreed and walked out and as he was walking out another man was coming into her apartment. I'm not certain what day he was referring to.

After I got through talking with Henry I felt something was wrong and telephoned the East Providence Police Department. It was sometime in the afternoon. I talked to a male and I think it was a dispatcher. I told him that Lori Malloy was missing for a week and gave her address and telephone number and any information I could think of. I believe it was after one o'clock in the afternoon.

I waited about half an hour and then called the police back to see if anything had been done and a dispatcher told me that Henry was there and they had found Lori. He didn't give me any information but asked me my name and where I

At approximately 1300 hours on 03-07-93 Mr. Henry J. COSTA D.O.B. [REDACTED] of #10 Willett Ave. Apt #10, Riverside R.I., came in to the police station to report that he was concerned for the welfare of his girlfriend whom he had not seen or heard from since 03-01-93. Mr. COSTA told dispatcher Michael WALSH that he did not know the exact adress of his girlfriend, he just knew that it was on Hull St, and he knew which house it was. I directed dispatcher WALSH to have Mr. COSTA meet with me on Hull St., and I then met Mr. COSTA at the intersec-tion of Leonard Ave. at Hull St., we responded to Mr. COSTAS' girlfriends' house which is #134/136 Hull St.. Mr. COSTA said that his girlfriend lived on the third floor there. We rang her doorbell but got no response, so we rang the doorbell of the people on the second floor, who Mr. COSTA said were related to the landlord.

We were let into the house by Mr. Pasquale BOTELHO who lives on the second floor. When we explained to Mr. BOTELHO why we were there he said that we could go up the stairs and try knocking on Mr. COSTAS' girlfriends' door, and in the meantime he would call up his sister and see ifhe could get the key to the apartment.

I went up the stairs first, ahead of Me. COSTA and when I first saw the door to the third floor apartment I noticed that the door was slightly open. I knocked on the door and said hello, asking if anyone was in there, and at that time I could hear the sound of water running from a faucet somewhere in the house. I got no answer to my call and I walked into the house.

The front door of the apartment lets into the living room, and off that there is the kitchen and beyond that the bathroom and a bedroom, there is also a bedroom on the south side of the kitchen. The sound of the running water appeared to be coming from the bathroom, so I walked toward there, at this time Mr. COSTA was behind me.

As we got closer to the bathroom we could see a persons head lying on the floor on the doorway to the bathroom, the person was aparently in the bathroom, on the floor. Mr. COSTA remarked "Oh my God". I was closer to the person than he and I saw completely into the bathroom before he could and I immeadiately notieed that the person on the floor was a naked caucasion woman, and she had obviously expired. Before Mr. COSTA could get into a proximity to see the body I asked him to step outside the apartment and wait for me there.

I called the police station on my portable radio and asked them to send a rescue and the road sergeant to my location. I had the station go to the private channel and Lieutenant Broadmeadow came on and I informed him that I had a 10-56 there(the department code for a sudden death).

The rescue workers arrived and took a look at the body and they realized that the person had expired, therefore there was no need for them there and they did clear the scene.

The dead woman is apparently Mr. COSTAS' girlfriend, Ms. Lori Lee MARIANO D.O.B. [REDACTED] IT was not readily apparent what the cause of death was and there were apparently enough suspicious conditions present that Sergeant Barlow called for the detective division to process the scene.

Some of the suspicious conditions were the fact that the door was apparently left open, there were small tufts of the victims hair found all around the apartment, she was found in the nude on the bathroom floor, with slices of bread all around her. The victim herself had pieces of hair wrapped around her left hand and around one foot. The refridgerator in the kitchen was found to be unplugged and there was food still inside. There were two empty glasses found on the table and a small tub (plastic) of some sort of food salad, also the faucet in the bathroom was running freely.

At this time, until the investigation should perhaps prove otherwise, the detective division is investigating this matter as a homicide, as such the following facts should be noted:

As well as finding the above named conditions on my arrival, the temperature in the apartment according to the thermometer was 72 degrees. I called in the discovery of the body at 1313 hours and called for the Sergeant and rescue. Sergeant Barlow arrived on the scene at 1319 hours, and detective Lieutenant Lynch shortly thereafter. Lieutenant Lynch notified the state medical examiners office of the incident at 1321 hours and Dr. Charles MEDERIOS of that office called back a few moments later and spoke to me for the preliminary information. The medical examiner later placed the time of death pronounciation at 1437 hours.

The detective division responded immediatly and detectives began investigating and speaking to witnesses and the neighbors in the building. The victims sister later arrived and she also was interviewed by the detective division. Detectives involved in the investigation are Detectives Arthur CLARK, Ken BILODEAU, Robert PACHECO and James DUBE.

CIRCUMSTANCES

At approximately 13:13 hours on Sunday, March 7, 1993, the body of a naked white female was discovered by Patrolman Antonio J. Britto of the East Prov. Police. The discovery was made at the third floor apartment of 136 N. Hull St., upon a request to check on the welfare of the apartment resident. The body was identified as that of the aforementioned apartment dweller, Lori Lee Mariano, dob: [REDACTED]. Following an initial investigation by members of the Patrol Division Detectives were summonsed to the scene. 



On this date, at 1321 hrs., I responded to 136 Hull St. to assist with scene of a reported sudden death. I arrived and went to the third floor apartment where I met Sgt. Barlow in the apartment. He instructed me not to let anyone into the apartment with the exception of detectives. I had learned that the body of a young female was found in the bathroom of the apartment. We had been summoned to the scene by the supposed boyfriend of the deceased, Henry Joseph Costa, Costa was on the front porch when I arrived. Shortly after I had secured the scene at the apartment entrance, Detective Lieutenant Lynch arrived. Ptl. Wyrostek was also present in the apartment.

Sgt. Barlow instructed me to go downstairs and speak with Costa and obtain his vital data. I did so and stayed with Costa on the porch. I was then joined by Ptl Wyrostek who informed me that Sgt. Barlow was instructing us to take Costa to headquarters so a statement could be obtained. We transported him to the station, cellblock area, and completed the necessary data forms. He was given his Miranda warnings as listed on a printed rights form. He signed this form and indicated that he understood them.

He explained that he and the deceased, Lori Mariano, had been involved for the last seven years and he referred to her as his girlfriend. He states that he met her during his stays at the IMH, Cranston. He also stated that Mariano was treated as a schizophrenic. Costa states that he last saw Mariano on March 1st, when he went to her apartment. He was there briefly and gave her cigarettes. He claims that that was the last time he spoke to her or saw her. He further stated that he had been trying to call her during the week but her phone went unanswered. Costa also mentioned that he had an argument with Mariano and indicated to me that he was upset with her frequent use of cocaine. He stated that Mariano had a child by another man approximately 14 months ago. She supposedly is not involved with this man and Costa believes that he doesn't know where she lives. Costa states that the child has been staying with Mariano's sister for the past week. Costa stated that after not being able to contact Mariano during the week, he then visited her sister to seek her whereabouts.



Costa states that when he went to Mariano's apartment, he was able to walk right into the apartment. When he did, he saw human hair scattered everywhere and ventured no further into the apartment because he was afraid of what he would find. He then called the police, who entered the apartment and found the body.

While I was at my position in the apartment at the doorway entrance, there was an athletic shoe on a small table to the left of the doorway. On this shoe was a large clump of light brown hair. It looked as if it had been pulled out of someone's head. There was a baby sock next to these shoes and the hair was also in the sock, partially.

After we spoke to Costa at the station, he was placed in holding cell A-1 for detectives. His belongings were stored in traps locker 129. He made a phone call at approximately 1415 hrs.

He ordered me to take the boyfriend into the police station.

Ptl. Hogan and I transported the suspect into the cellblock and processed him. He was identified as; Henry J. Costa, of 10 Willett Avenue, A-10, in Riverside, Rhode Island. The suspect was processed and read and signed a Miranda rights form.

Ptl. Hogan and I asked him when was the last time he had seen or spoken to the victim Ms. Mariano. He stated that he had seen her last Monday, 3-1-93 at her apartment. He stated that he brought her cigarettes, and spoke of an argument they had over her use of cocaine. The suspect also stated that his girlfriend had a child by another man but he desn't think he even knows where she lives. He stated that he had been calling the victim all week, and then finally went over to the sisters house in Providence looking for her.

The suspect then made a phone call and was placed in holding call A-1 for detectives. His traps, including;\$62.61, a watch, wallet, credit cards, and a license, were placed in locker 129.





