



ADD COSTA RICA TO YOUR GAP YEAR

A Planning Guide for a 2-, 4-, 6-, or 8-Week Costa Rica Experience

Explore how a 2-, 4-, 6-, or 8-week Costa Rica stay could fit into your larger gap year.

WHERE DOES COSTA RICA FIT?

A gap year does not have to be one program, one destination, or twelve months of travel.

Your year might include work, study, travel, volunteering, time at home, or several shorter experiences. Costa Rica can be one part of that larger plan.

START WITH YOUR YEAR

Before deciding how long to spend in Costa Rica, look at the year as a whole.

What commitments do you already have?

When do you need to be home?

Will you work or save money during part of the year?

Are there other places you want to visit?

Do you want structured programs, independent travel, or a mix of both?

How much of your year do you want to spend away from home?

FIND THE SPACE FIRST

Once you know where Costa Rica might fit, you can decide whether 2, 4, 6, or 8 weeks makes sense.

A shorter stay can add a focused experience to a year with several other plans. A longer stay gives you more time to settle in, participate in service, explore the country, and experience daily life in Costa Rica.

You do not need to plan your entire gap year before considering Costa Rica. You do need to know what you want this part of the year to add.

WHAT DO YOU WANT FROM YOUR TIME IN COSTA RICA?

Start with what you want to do and learn. That will help determine how long to stay and how to structure your time.

SERVICE

Do you want to contribute to an ongoing community or conservation project?

CONSERVATION

Are you interested in wildlife, ecosystems, environmental education, or hands-on conservation work?

CULTURE

Do you want time to experience Costa Rican communities, food, traditions, and everyday life?

SPANISH

Would practicing Spanish be an important part of your stay?

NATURE

Do you want to explore rainforests, beaches, wildlife areas, mountains, or other ecosystems?

TRAVEL

How much of the country would you like to see beyond your primary location?

INDEPENDENCE

Are you looking for a highly structured experience, more independent time, or a combination of both?

CHOOSE YOUR PRIORITIES

Pick the three that matter most to you.

Then ask:

What would I need to do, see, or learn in Costa Rica for those priorities to be met?

CHOOSE YOUR LENGTH

The right length depends on what you want Costa Rica to contribute to your larger gap year.

2 WEEKS

A focused stay.

Good for:

Service-learning experience

A small number of excursions

A first introduction to Costa Rica

A year that includes several other destinations or commitments

4 WEEKS

More time to settle in.

Good for:

More consistent participation in service

More cultural and nature experiences

Time to explore beyond one location

A better balance between structure and free time

6 WEEKS

More time to participate and explore.

Good for:

Longer involvement with a project

More travel within Costa Rica

Greater independence

Time to explore several interests

8 WEEKS

A substantial part of your gap year.

Good for:

Service as one part of the experience

Travel across more than one region

More time for culture, nature, language, and independent exploration

A slower pace with fewer rushed transitions

ASK YOURSELF

How much time can I realistically give to Costa Rica?

How much structure do I want?

How much travel do I want within the country?

Would I rather go deeper in one place or see more of Costa Rica?

What else needs to fit into my gap year?

Choose the length that fits your goals, budget, and larger plan.

BUILD YOUR COSTA RICA EXPERIENCE

Think in three parts:

SERVICE

Connect with an ongoing community or conservation project.

Consider:

What type of service interests me?

What skills can I bring?

What do I need to learn first?

How much time do I want to commit?

LEARNING

Choose a few areas you want to understand better.

Consider:

Spanish

Wildlife & biodiversity

Conservation

Costa Rican culture

Sustainability

Education

Environmental science

EXPLORATION

Decide what you want to experience beyond your primary location.

Consider:

National parks

Wildlife areas

Beaches & rainforests

Mountains

Local communities

Birding & hiking

Cultural activities

FIT COSTA RICA INTO YOUR LARGER YEAR

BEFORE COSTA RICA

Will you be working?
Studying?
Traveling somewhere else?
Living at home?

AFTER COSTA RICA

Start college or work?
Join another program?
Continue traveling independently?

PLAN YOUR TRANSITIONS

Leave enough time between major experiences to travel, rest, reorganize, and adjust plans.

Think about:

Travel days
Laundry and repacking
Changing climates
Flights and transportation
Visa or entry requirements
Managing money
Staying in contact with family
Time to rest before the next commitment

DON'T OVERPACK THE YEAR

You do not need to fill every week.

Leaving some open time can give you room to change plans, recover from travel, stay longer somewhere you enjoy, or decide what you want to do next.

Does this schedule give me enough time to experience Costa Rica without making the rest of my year feel rushed?

WHAT CAN LTSCR HELP COORDINATE?

You do not need to plan the Costa Rica portion of your gap year on your own. Based on your interests, length of stay, and budget, Learning Through Service Costa Rica can help coordinate the details.

SERVICE & CONSERVATION

Connect with appropriate community or conservation projects based on your interests, timing, and the needs of local partners.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Explore lodging options that fit your location, length of stay, and planned activities.

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

Coordinate transportation connected to arrivals, service activities, excursions, and travel within Costa Rica.

LEARNING EXPERIENCES

Build in opportunities around interests such as wildlife, biodiversity, Spanish, culture, birding, nature journaling, conservation, or outdoor learning.

TRAVEL & EXPLORATION

Explore options such as national parks, wildlife areas, cultural activities, guided experiences, or travel to other regions of Costa Rica.

THE RIGHT BALANCE

A shorter stay may be more structured. A longer stay can include more travel, independence, and flexibility.

The balance can change based on your interests, length of stay, and budget.

BEFORE YOU REACH OUT

You do not need a finished itinerary. A few basic decisions will help us explore what could work for you.

Exact dates are helpful, but a general month or season is enough to start.
