WAIVER OF FEES IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST

Up to \$60 of fees for searching for, segregating and reviewing records may be waived when the waiver would serve the public interest as described in section 2-71-32, Hawaii Administrative Rules. If you wish to apply for a waiver of fees in the public interest, you must attach to this request a statement of facts, including your identity as the requester, to show how the waiver of fees would serve the public interest. The criteria for this waiver, found at section 2-71-32, Hawaii Administrative Rules, are:

- (1) The requested record pertains to the operations or activities of an agency;
- (2) The record is not readily available in the public domain; and
- (3) The requester has the primary intention and the actual ability to widely disseminate information from the government record to the public at large.

AGENCY RESPONSE TO YOUR REQUEST FOR ACCESS

The agency to which you addressed your request must respond within a set time period. The agency will normally respond to you within 10 business days from the date it receives your request; however, in *extenuating circumstances* the agency must respond within 20 business days from the date of your request. REQUESTER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

You have certain responsibilities under §2-71-16, Hawaii Administrative Rules. You may obtain a copy of these rules from the Lieutenant Governor's Office or from the Office of Information Practices. These responsibilities include making arrangements to inspect and copy records, providing further clarification or description of the requested record as instructed by the agency's notice, and making a prepayment of fees, if assessed.

Whereas, the EE&C (Ethics and Conflicts Committee) *Representation Recommendation Memo Drafting Guidelines* (rev. August 2019) specifies in section E¹ that the Department of the Attorney General may represent state employees when they are sued in their individual capacity if the claims are based on events that occurred while the employee was acting in the scope and course of his or her state employment; and

Whereas, the primary function of the EE&C² is to develop a consistent process and forum through which the department reviews, evaluates, and makes recommendations concerning requests for Attorney General representation from state employees who have been sued in their individual capacities; and

Whereas, I am aware that the Department of the Attorney General has represented at least one State of Hawai'i Department of Education Teacher in his or her individual capacity in a matter concerning defamation;

I request the documentation that details the scope and course of employment for all State of Hawai'i Department of Education Teachers that the EE&C uses when making recommendations concerning requests for Attorney General representation from State of Hawai'i Department of Education Teachers.

Note: None of the exceptions cited in HRS §92F-13 apply to this Request for a Government Record. This government record applies to all recommendations made by the E&CC concerning all State of Hawai'i public school teachers who are sued in their individual capacities for actions taken while on the job.

E. ATTORNEY GENERAL'S AUTHORITY TO REPRESENT INDIVIDUAL STATE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

The Attorney General is authorized, but not required, by § 662-16, HRS, to defend state officers and employees when they are sued in their individual capacities for damages resulting from property loss or bodily injuries, including death, in connection with their performance of their state duties and responsibilities.

The Attorney General may offer representation if the Attorney General is satisfied that the claims are based on events that occurred while the employee was acting in the scope and course of his or her state employment.

D. FUNCTION OF THE ETHICS AND CONFLICTS COMMITTEE (E&CC)
The primary function of the E&CC is to develop a consistent process and forum through which the department reviews, evaluates, and makes recommendations on issues relating to attorney ethics, and conflicts of interest generally. This includes evaluation of requests for Attorney General representation from state employees who have been sued in their individual capacities.
