Tips for an Effective Comment



Writing effective comments to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection during the rule-making process can influence the final regulation.

Here are some tips to ensure your comments are persuasive & effective:

BE CLEAR & CONCISE

- Stick to the Point: Focus on the specific issues or regulations being proposed.
- Organize Your Thoughts: <u>Use bullet points</u> to make your comments easier to follow.

BE INFORMED

- Read the Proposal: Read thoroughly and <u>understand the regulation's potential impact</u>. Review any supporting materials or background information.
- Research: Look into similar regulations in other states or federal guidelines. This can help you provide informed comparisons or <u>suggest alternative approaches</u>.

PROVIDE EVIDENCE & DATA

- Support Your Claims: Use scientific data, studies, or expert opinions to back up your arguments. Concrete <u>evidence makes your comment</u> more credible.
- Share Local Impacts: If the regulation affects your business or community, <u>provide specific examples</u> of how it will impact you or others in your area.

BE SPECIFIC

- Address Specific Sections: If possible, <u>refer to specific sections</u> or clauses of the proposed regulation. Suggest specific changes or provide detailed feedback on particular aspects.
- Offer Alternatives: If you disagree with a proposal, <u>suggest an alternative</u> approach
- and explain why it might be more effective or less burdensome.
- Share Your Experience: If the proposed regulation affects your daily life or work, <u>share</u> your personal story. Real-world examples illustrate the practical implications of the rule.
- Highlight Positive and Negative Impacts: Balance your comments by <u>acknowledging any positive aspects</u> of the proposal, even if you primarily have concerns. This shows that you've considered the regulation from all angles.

STAY PROFESSIONAL & RESPECTFUL

- Maintain a Professionalism: Avoid emotional language; Keep your <u>comments issue focused</u>.
- Be Respectful: A <u>respectful tone</u> increases the likelihood that your comments will be taken seriously.
- Ask for Clarification: If there's something unclear in the proposal, ask for clarification within your comment.

FOLLOW SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

• Adhere to Deadlines: Make sure your comments are submitted by the deadline.

REOUEST FOLLOW UP & STAY ENGAGED

- Request a Response: Politely <u>request that FDEP address your concerns</u> in their final rule-making report or in a follow-up communication.
- Follow Up: Stay informed about the rule-making process. Attend public hearings if available, and <u>continue to engage</u> with FDEP as the process unfolds.
- Engage in Further Advocacy: Until the rule is finalized, <u>continue advocating</u> for your position by engaging with other stakeholders, legislators, or the media.
