Case Closed: Investigation Leads to Dismissal with Prejudice

Last month, we shared an update on an ongoing criminal defense case after our client's bond was reduced from \$100,000 to \$25,000 at an adversarial bond hearing.

This month, we can share the final outcome: **the charge was dismissed with prejudice, meaning it cannot be refiled.**

The client had been facing a serious felony charge and the possibility of a substantial prison sentence if convicted.

One Logic Source Investigator **Laura Gallardo-Chandler** worked alongside defense attorney **Sadik Morshed of Morshed Law, PLLC** to investigate the allegations and develop a more complete picture of the case.

As the investigation progressed, significant evidence emerged that was inconsistent with the original allegations. This included extensive text communications between the complaining witness and the client, photographs and videos showing them together at multiple events, and conflicting accounts regarding when and where the alleged encounter occurred.

The investigation also uncovered additional information and witnesses that provided important context to the allegations. As each piece of evidence was examined and compared, inconsistencies emerged that required further investigation and corroboration.

Ultimately, the case was **dismissed with prejudice**.

The outcome is a powerful example of why thorough criminal defense investigation matters. A serious criminal accusation can change someone's life immediately. An investigator's job is not to assume what happened, but to follow the evidence, test the allegations, identify inconsistencies, locate independent corroboration, and make sure the defense team has the information it needs.

Sometimes a text matters. Sometimes it is a photograph. Sometimes it is a video from an event that no one thought would become important. And sometimes one inconsistency leads to another.
