

## ONE QUESTION INTERVIEW

## Process:

- 1. Give students the above handout
- 2. Ask students to develop a question that they can ask their classmates. The topics can be related to topics under study in the classroom.

Ex: What is the true definition of being in love?

- 3. After the questions are developed, give students 5 minutes per person interviewed. Ask students to write down what they hear. Instruct students they should not exchange papers--this is about practicing a discussion and active listening
- 4. Go one or two more rounds
- 5. Have students synthesize the answers from the interview. Decide how the answers are similar or different and what they learn from the interviews
- 6. Have a whole class discussion and share point made in the interviews
- 7. Make connections to text or topic under study



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
