Jan opened the meeting at 5 p.m. with prayer

Treasurer's Report

Linda reported that the current total in the Outreach checking account is \$2621.70. Made \$560 on pie fundraiser, including pies, cobblers, and donations. Continue to have an automatic payment of \$43 to Compassion Child each month. Paid quarterly donations to NESAP and Westminster Rescue Mission. Jan asked if we used funds from the Harrell Camping Ministry for Helping Up Missions camp. Michelle will ask Dave about it. We would like to continue supporting that camp. Report accepted by all present.

Meals

- No one is receiving meals at this time

Night By Night Shelter

- Janet reported that there is nothing new. Still collecting items but donations have slowed down.

Wesley Pantry

- Being well-used. More donations are always needed. Linda asked a visitor to the pantry what he would like to see available. He said canned chicken, juice, and toilet paper. She will provide these the next time she stocks the pantry. Jan often stocks up on spaghetti sauce, etc., and would like one shelf in the closet inside the double doors to be labeled “Wesley Pantry” for extra items. Linda asked Janet if the Westminster Rescue Mission could provide some non-perishables for our pantry once a month. Linda will call Stephanie Halley to ask.

New Business

- **Back packs for NESAP.** Rev. Jerry at the Caring Parish meeting stated he would like the whole parish to participate. Will advertise soon in the Wesley Announcements and Journal. Linda will call NESAP for a list of items and discuss the same with Jerry. Vicky ordered the backpacks, but will check to see if they need them for next year.
- **NESAP** is very low on food. The Caring Parish Committee is trying to restock its little community pantry. They are planning on doing a drive for NESAP this summer. NESAP is trying to give out a “Summer Food Set” for this year.
- **“The Best Christmas Party Ever” camp** will be sponsored by Wesley this summer. It will be held July 14-17, from 9 a.m. – 12 noon. Will need volunteers. NCCP also sponsors other camps throughout the summer.
- **There will be a potluck after worship on Choir Recognition Sunday.** This is a churchwide effort. Will make sure we have beverages, paperware, tablecloths, etc. Outreach will provide hot dogs. Ask Cherie to put out an email to the congregation.
- **Christmas Bazaar** – Need to set up a meeting and email the congregation to participate. Need All Hands On Deck! Connie and Linda will coordinate the kitchen and meals. Open meeting up for the congregation. Need to organize committees: advertising, vendors, bake table, crafts (have many in storage.) Bazaar date will be **Saturday, November 1, 2025.** Vendor flyers will be sent

out in August. **Churchwide Bazaar meeting will be Tuesday, June 24, 2025 at 7 p.m. in person.** Linda will ask Cherie to run the "Save the Date" for the Bazaar itself, and also the Bazaar meeting in June in the June Journal. Will also ask Cherie to send out a congregational email as a reminder of the meeting a couple of weeks ahead of time. If folks have any questions, they can contact Connie or Linda. The dates on the yard signs need to be changed. These signs should be out earlier than last year. Someone needs to write an article for the Northern News. Will ask around for any pictures that could be sent as well for publication. Need to publicize on Facebook and our church website. Also, we can write a blurb for the Grow Guide. Brenda and Janet will get an Agenda list together for Jan to cover at the Bazaar meeting.

- Discussion ensued regarding the new Districts and our North Carroll Hub.
- **Ad Council will be held on July 23, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. in person.**

The meeting adjourned at 5:55 p.m. **Next Outreach meeting Wed., August 13, 2025 at 10:00 a.m. in person.**

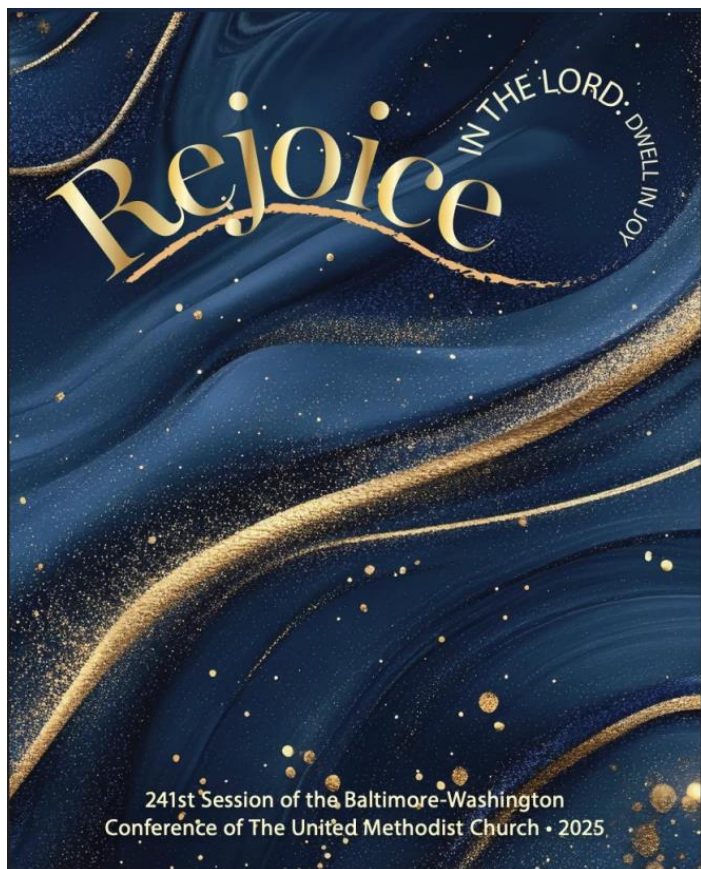

"Claiming joy as a mindset, a discipline, and a way of life, the members of the 241st session of the Baltimore-Washington Conference met to worship, witness and celebrate the glory and possibilities of God, May 13-15 at the Hilton Hotel in Baltimore.

With ribbons soaring over their heads during opening worship, members sang, danced and embraced the theme of 'Rejoice in the Lord: Dwell in Joy.'

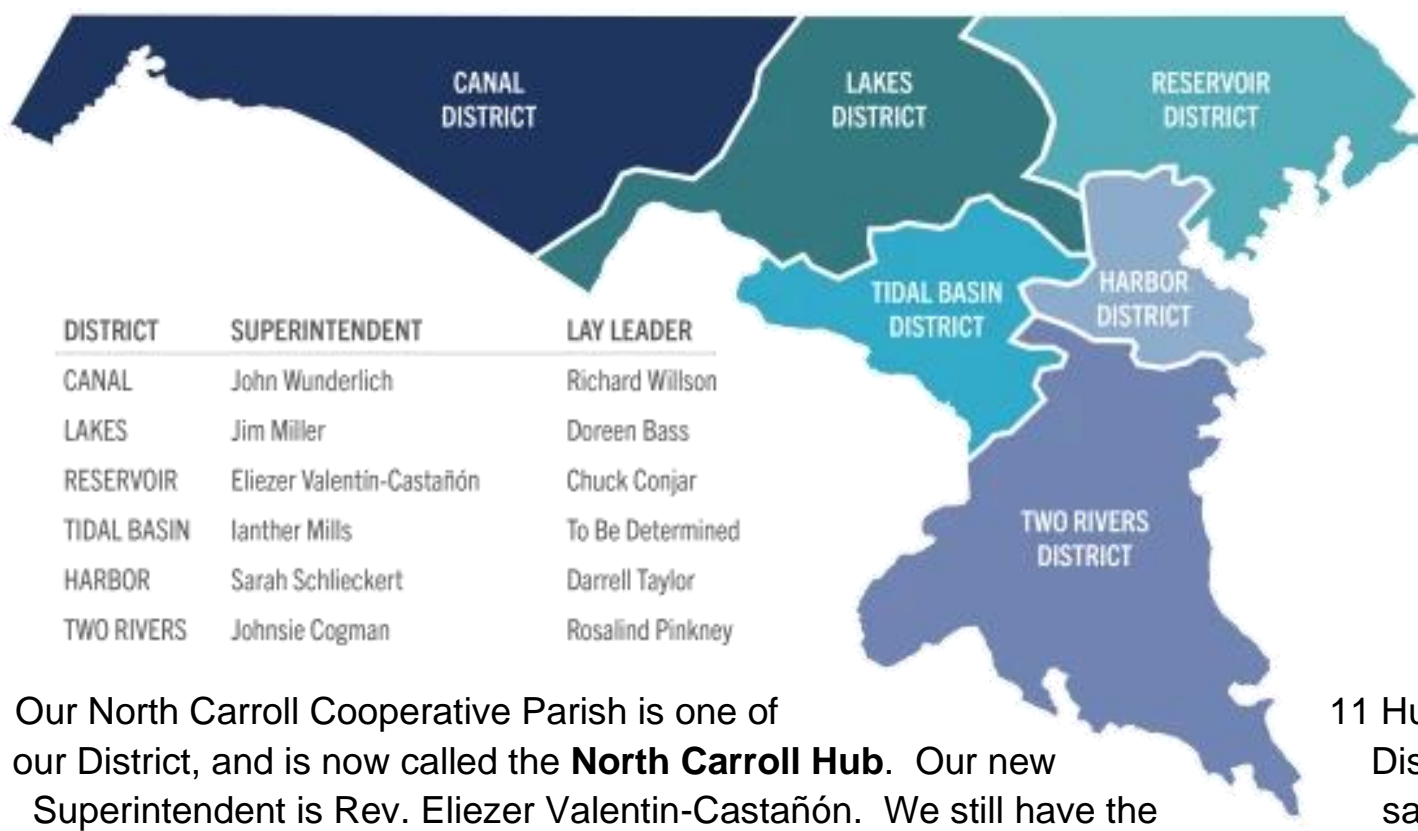
Throughout the opening worship, the themes of joy and pain were woven together. The church now stands at a cultural and political crossroads, where civil rights and justice feel threatened.

'Joy is always a courageous counterpoint,' the bishop concluded. 'Let the world see a church unshaken, not because we're blind to the pain, but because we're rooted in a deeper promise. ... The God of peace is with us, and that's why we dwell in joy,' she said.'

As your Lay Member to Annual Conference, I enjoy attending this very important event every year. This year, along with the joy-filled worship services and voting on resolutions and budget, we were introduced to the new District configuration. There are now 6 Districts (reduced from 8) and all have new names related to water, baptism and new beginnings. Our District is now called the **Reservoir District** (formerly Baltimore Suburban.) Our North Carroll Cooperative Parish is one of our District, and is now called the **North Carroll Hub**. Our new Superintendent is Rev. Eliezer Valentin-Castañón. We still have the churches in our new Hub.

11 Hubs in District same

In a presentation that lifted up the BWC's new six districts and 64 Collaborative Hubs, which go into effect July 1, members joined in a presentation that delivered a powerful blend of storytelling, music, and testimony.

Throughout the Baltimore-Washington Conference, United Methodists, now connected in HUBs, are entering a bold new chapter in collaborative ministry — one rooted in deep listening, faithful improvisation, and shared values. This 241st session of Annual Conference explored the work of the Hubs in building relationships and engaging in Missional Action Planning (MAP) as a Spirit-led journey toward congregational vitality.

We, as the North Carroll Hub, need to build relationships among our fellow HUB churches, discern what our community needs are, and then create new ministry that means something to both our members and the community at large. This will take courage on our part as we aim to transform our ministry and mission.

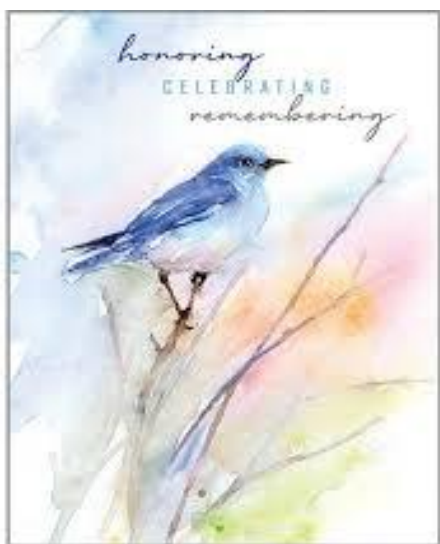
One collaborative effort which our Hub churches may wish to participate in would be to make [hygiene kits](#) for the United Methodist Committee on Relief to use in disaster relief efforts and with the poor.

The goal for this Conference-wide effort is to collect 10,000 hygiene kits between July 1 and Thanksgiving Day. Perhaps Wesley could be the sponsoring church and organize a Hub event to put some kits together.

Let me conclude with encouragement from Paul's letter to the Philippians, chapter 4:4-9, which was the Biblical theme for this year as we gathered for holy conferencing: "Always be full of joy in the Lord. I say it again – rejoice!" Let us claim joy and the fullness of the Spirit as we think on all that is true, honorable, just, pure, pleasing, commendable, and worthy of praise."
