Pastor's Message (Continued from Page 1)

Had we gathered together at Wesley UMC this morning, I would have preached on Exodus 17:1-7. In this passage, the Israelites are in the wilderness of Sin. As they look around, they are troubled by lack of water, even though God has already delivered them from bondage in Egypt, given them manna and quail to eat, and given them signs of His presence prior to and during that wilderness time. They are mistrustful of Moses' leadership. They quarrel against Moses and test God by saying, "Is the Lord among us or not?" Moses asks God what to do with this quarrelsome people who are ready to stone him, and God tells Moses to strike the rock at Horeb. Moses does so, and water comes pouring out of the rock. Once again, the people of Israel bear witness to the power of a God who provides for their basic needs, even as they drink their fill of Living Water.

One of my favorite hymns that attests to God's presence and provision, even in troubling times, is this one, written by William Williams. It was written in 1745, but its words are timeless and soothing. I offer them to you as a meditational tool for you, even as we miss being physically present in worship:

Guide me, O Thou great Jehovah. Pilgrim through this barren land; I am weak, but Thou art mighty. Hold me with Thy powerful hand. Bread of heaven, Bread of heaven, feed me 'til I want no more; Feed me 'til I want no more.

Open now the crystal fountain, whence the healing stream doth flow; Let the fire and cloudy pillar lead me all my journey through. Strong Deliverer, strong Deliverer, be Thou still my Strength and Shield; Be Thou still my Strength and Shield.

May you feel the guided by our Great Jehovah during this wilderness time, and may the God who walks with us and provides for us be your Strength and Shield.

After all, He loved us enough to send His only Son to save us from ourselves. He wants us to truly KNOW Him in all of His love, glory, mercy, and grace. If God had a refrigerator, YOUR picture would be on it!! While you search your soul for your knowledge and belief, you can shore up your faith in our Mighty Father by reading some of these texts we have discovered in our library.

Please note that we have a collection of donated inspirational pamphlets on the shelf next to the violets: Strength and Grace, Our Daily Bread, and Mornings With Jesus. You may take them to keep and read at your leisure!

A Search for What Is Real: Finding Faith by Brian D. McLaren (232). There have been times when you have felt that if there is not a God, there ought to be. McLaren helps you sort through the questions, objections, and concerns that arise when you consider God not as some theological abstraction, but as someone you can actually connect with...and want to connect with, perhaps more than you know.

A Place of Quiet Rest by Nancy Leigh DeMoss (240) The God of the universe created us for fellowship with Himself! We realize this and even long for that sweet intimacy with God, but it often seems so out of reach. Nancy Leigh DeMoss demystifies the process of coming to know God intimately. In A Place of Quiet Rest, she shares form her heart and life how a daily devotional time can forever change your relationship with Jesus. She addresses the common frustrations and pitfalls most of us encounter in our devotional life and makes practical suggestions for overcoming them.

The Case for Christ by Lee Strobel (230). Retracing his own spiritual journey from atheism to faith, Lee Strobel, former legal editor of the Chicago Tribune, cross-examines a dozen experts who are recognized authorities in their fields of history, archaeology, and manuscript studies. Strobel's tough, point-blank questions make this bestselling book read like a captivating, fast-paced novel. But it's not fiction. It's a riveting quest for the truth about history's most compelling figure.

Coming Home by Joseph M. Stowell (232) Do you feel alone in the universe? Is God a distant figure in your life? Does nothing seem to satisfy your heart's restlessness? As revealed in this timely book, there's a reason for that. God meant us for intimacy with Himself, and when we settle for less, we find only meaninglessness and vanity. All the things of this earth are inadequate to fill the void.

Reaching For the Invisible God by Philip Yancey (232) From the preface... "Christians hold out the bright promise of "a personal relationship with God," as if to imply that knowing God works the way a relationship with a human person does. Yet one day a curtain descends, the curtain separating the invisible from the visible. How can I have a personal relationship with a being when I'm never quite sure he's there? Or is there a way I can be sure? I have written the book in a progression from doubt toward faith, which recapitulates my own pilgrimage."

Tell Them I Love Them by Joyce Meyer (232) Every bit of God's power is available to you—today! And you aren't just one of the crowd. God loves you as if you were the only person on Earth. The problem is that, like most people, you may not understand it...or if you know it with your head, you may not feel it with your heart. Now you can. Sharing her insights and the revelation that transformed her own life, Joyce Meyer brings you Scripture and other words of wisdom that can open up the window to God's love...and let its light shine on you, personally!

Westminster Rescue Mission / Addiction Healing Center



Dear Ministry Partner: We want to keep you up to date on efforts at the Mission to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and protect our clients, staff and the community we serve. In keeping with the guidelines provided by the CDC and recommended by Maryland state and local health departments, the Mission will alter or temporarily suspend operations in the following ways:

Addiction Healing Center: Intake for clients seeking treatment is currently suspended March 14th – March 28th; Visitors and volunteers will not be admitted to buildings on the campus. Measures in-line with CDC guidelines and our CARF accreditation continue to be taken to sanitize our campus and maintain safe health conditions.

Sparrow's Nest Food Pantry: Food will be boxed and distributed outside of the pantry, by appointment only, from gam – 12pm Monday through Thursday. Every effort will be made to continue to safely collect and distribute food locally, to the extent possible.

Mission Store: The store will be closed March 14th – March 28th. Donations will not be accepted onsite between March 14th – March 28th.

Maryland Easy Enrollment Health Insurance Program

This tax season, Marylanders will be able to sign up for health coverage through an innovative new pilot program. Beginning in 2020, you can indicate on your tax return if you would like the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange, the state agency that runs Maryland Health Connection, to estimate your eligibility for coverage. This selection launches an easy process that will help you enroll.

How it works:

On your 2020 Tax Forms 502 and 502B, you must indicate whether you, your spouse, and/or your dependents have health insurance coverage.

If you are uninsured, then select to authorize the Comptroller to share information from your tax return with the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange (MHBE) to determine pre-eligibility for free or low-cost health care coverage.

After filing your taxes, MHBE will send you a letter indicating whether you are preliminarily eligible for coverage through Maryland Health Connection (Maryland's health insurance marketplace) and asking you to take further steps to confirm eligibility and enroll.

To complete enrollment, you can visit <u>MarylandHealthConnection.gov</u>, call 855.642.8572, or receive free in-person assistance from trained experts throughout the state.

NARCAN Training: John Sies said that the NARCAN training went very well. Many people showed up.


Finance Secretary:
