From the desk of the Pastor...

"When a Pastor *REALLY* Falls in Love with a Church"

We are trained as United Methodist clergy to "expect the unexpected," and so we hold our breath during appointment season. Will the District Superintendent call or not? Having served four churches inside the Baltimore beltway, it felt different to be going to a rural church. Yet, in

her infinite wisdom, Virginia Dailey of Good Shepherd UM Church said to me shortly before my departure, "We are going to miss you, but I think this is going to be a very good move for you." When I asked her why, she said, "I simply have a feeling."

Serving at Wesley has been one adventure after another. Who knew I would meet my husband here? I had completely sworn off men, for the rest of my natural existence. Who knew I would have a farm, where I could keep my rescue horses? Who knew we would start a contemporary service or mission trips or an endowment fund or a renovation of aging buildings? All of these have been innovations we have been through together.

And then, along came Covid-19.

They say women are like teabags. You don't find out what we're like until we get into hot water. Maybe churches are the same way. I spend a lot of time conversing with other clergy of different denominations. What I have learned from them is that this coronavirus epidemic has rocked the church/clergy world beyond our wildest imaginations.

A **devotional** was offered regarding the sea of Galilee, which is 600' below sea level and has violent and unexpected storms. Jesus calmed the storm; why are we so afraid? ~ Art Monroe, Chaplain at Hospice

More people in Maryland have died due to Covid-19. To Laura – **thank you so much** for getting us connected via Zoom. Sunday, there was a women's class, Lana led some worship, and Rev. Amy had a "Fireside Chat." One good thing about Zoom is that it is good for bad weather.

Finances:

- Things are positive despite not having a Spring Supper; finances are in a similar place to last year.
- We are very close to the budget; doing well at the end of February.
- As of 3/25, our Total Operating Cash is about \$5,500; about half since last year. There has been an uptick in VANCO giving and we are receiving contributions by mail. Folks have been mailing and can mail the contributions to church or to Laura. Text will also be an option soon.
- So far, so good. Not using heat in the church building; the temperature was turned way back.
- The decision was not to hold the mail; Laura is handling the money with help from others with the mail.

Outreach:

- Everything is postponed (pretty much)
- Outreach is taking on a new Compassion child
- The Rummage Sale is scheduled for Fall Oct. 2/3. Brenda suggested that stuff for the Rummage Sale be accumulated now. The Parsonage garage is partially used at the moment.
- Alpha bottles will eventually be turned in
- Vicky & Gary took 20 baskets to Shepherd's Staff
- The Pie/Tart sale, Greene Turtle fundraiser, and Taste of Spring have all been postponed
- Jan will be checking into Habitat for Humanity
- Laura is fairly sure the Mission Tea is not going to be held.
- We are collecting for people in need in our area canned good sand such can be taken to Vicky's back porch or Janet Martin's house (not NESAP). Money can be used for the "frontline" folks in Nursing Homes and the Hospital. Vicky is collecting this. Golden Crest Assisted Living, Longview Nursing Home, the Hospital, and Dove House felt loved and appreciated when we provided them with gift certificates for local businesses, food, and such.
- Sewing masks from fabric. These are not so good for hospitals, but something with a filter can be used by Westminster Rescue Mission (can't find filters, though.)

- If anyone has needs, contact Vicky. She was able to see the fear on some of the younger adults' faces. We need to reach out to each other send cards, texts, etc.
- Vicky & Davona will work on having an Outreach meeting on Zoom.
- One person is receiving a meal once a week. We should be aware of anyone who lives alone.

UMW (Linda Yost): The UMW will meet the next time they can, maybe via Zoom. Everything that Linda has been involved with has been postponed or cancelled. (See UMW Notes in the April 2020 issue of The Wesley Journal.)

Christian Education (Linda Yost):

- A small group got some Easter bags together very quickly [thank you from the kids!]
- It is possible that Christian Ed. might restart in May.
- We may have to change or cancel Vacation Bible School. The school system plans are in question; there are still some

questions about all of this. A decision about VBS will possibly happen at the end of April. Vicky suggested "Camp in a Box;" "VBS in a Bag" was another suggestion. It is not the same as a regular VBS, but it is important to get the Gospel in folks' hands.

- Sandy Cole will print out the most recent copy of the directory. Davona and Vicky will split up the pages.
- People can sign up (we can put it out via email). Anyone can be involved.

Trustees:

- Linda noted that last week, she visited the church to check on leaking and there was none.
- Roof Right repaired the Tower. The choir room is okay.
- Two quotes have been received for repairs to the church; Trustees will go over the quotes tomorrow on Zoom.
- Working on bid(s) for floor waxing over the next week.
- Due to the age of the facility, someone should check regularly on the facility.
- The sensor on the pole light in the parking lot has been changed.

Lay Member to Annual Conference (Matt Sichel):

- General Conference is postponed until 2021. The Minneapolis location will remain the same.
- The budget runs out this year, but contingencies may be used.
- To have the General Conference, the group must meet in person, not via Zoom.
- There has been a Protocol for Separation endorsed by all caucus groups in the denomination.
- The Annual Conference has been transitioned to a one day session to do the budget and have ordination/commissioning.

Candidate for Ordained Ministry (Matt Sichel): Matt sees the District Committee on Ministry (DCOM) at the end of April. He was able to meet with his candidacy mentor and received a lot of support from him.

Preparing for Palm Sunday/Easter, Jess and John Sies have been discussing putting recordings of our choir online. For some publishers, there are legal ways to do this. Pam thinks that this is a great idea, and Jan is fine with using past cantatas.

Administrative Council Minutes • April 22, 2020

The meeting opened at approximately 7 PM (via Zoom).

Attendees: Janet Martin, John Sies, Pam Phillips, Vicky Wilmer, Linda Hollman, Jess Sichel, Matt Sichel, Rev. Amy Sarah Lewis-Rill, Denny Rill, Linda Yost, Jonathan Yost, Brenda Hess, Brenda Kennedy, Laura Waltrup, and Davona Palmer.

Brenda Hess shared a devotional about having peace through our faith. [Thank you, Brenda!]

Rev. Amy:

- Led Billy Harris' service yesterday; the weather made the service more complicated.
- Rev. Amy has been connecting with people via phone.
- As it stands today, it looks like the church might [start reopening] around May 15th. The Executive Committee has been discussing how to "reopen."
- Rev. Amy has been writing papers. Her comprehensive exams are in May. This is leading up to her dissertation.

Finances:

- The Cemetery balance has not really been affected by the stock market; it is in a safe (conservative) investment.
- Congregants are still donating to WIP (Wesley Improvement Projects)
- The COVID-19 payroll and utilities grant/loan was awarded to us (all of the moneys used for payroll and utilities within a certain timeframe are "forgiven" as part of the grant; what goes unused becomes a loan to be repaid.) It was given through F&M Bank. The goal/loan for the grant is to keep employees and utilities intact. The loan is at 1% with no payments. The small business administration made the loan very easy. Laura is grateful for the blessing. Jonathan noted that we have eight weeks to file paperwork on how the money from the small business administration was used and asked if some will need to be return as unused. Laura replied not necessarily; we just have to prove that 75% was used for payroll and 25% was used for utilities. Laura also said that she has to give judos to the BW Conference for giving us info. In short order over Easter.
- Not too much in the way of liabilities.
- We are a bit behind, but a good chunk of that is due to the supper not being held.
- Laura is so proud of the congregation, as we haven't really seen a reduction in income due to COVID-19. Thank
 vou!
- We are under budget; furthermore, Calvin offered not to continue temporarily.
- Brenda Hess asked why the utilities are so high; Laura replied that the budget billing had been cancelled and that we are now on a "pay as you go" plan. This helps with the bills over the summer months, when giving typically slumps. The oil will not be refilled until the fall. It was recently topped off and has not been used since.
- Rev. Amy brought up apportionments based on notice that she had received from the conference. Laura stated that we
 are paid through March (late, but paid) and that she is on a schedule of paying bills about once a month. It is possible
 that we had received notice due to our great track record of paying apportionments in the past and that we were contacted to make sure things were okay. Matt theorized that there is sensitivity to some folks withholding apportionments.

Outreach:

- Outreach met on April 8th [via Zoom]. Next meeting will be on May 13th via Zoom from 6 to 7:15 PM (Davona indicated that Outreach may move to a different night).
- Gift cards and baskets of snacks have been provided to local frontline staff.
- Face masks are being made as requested by local frontlines. Also, if you have neighbors who need masks, please let Outreach know! Children's masks can be provided, as well.
- NESAP provided elastic that it had in the store to us for masks [thank you!] Accepting money and donations to NESAP. The drive is going well; Vicky was able to take three shopping cart-fulls to NESAP
- The Westminster Rescue Mission was provided with 29 face masks; more will be at church tomorrow. \$100 was provided for perishables and water. Also, the freezers at church were cleaned out, with appropriate donations of frozen items going to WRM. The freezers downstairs were propped open, empty, and off.
- At the last Ad. Council meeting, there was a decision to reach out to everyone in the directory. 13 people volunteered.

• Calls and notes have been made/sent; this is also helping to update the directory. People are also being asked if they are staying in contact with Wesley, and some had no idea when services were held and how to find services.

A lengthy discussion about efforts of the leadership and responses of the congregation ensued, some of which included:

- YouTube was put in place this week.
- Vicky's father is able to call in and hear a recorded sermon, which is simple to provide. We could send a letter saying something like, "after _____ time, dial this number and hear _____." Vicky's father's church uses phone-livestreaming.com for \$30/month.
- o Prayer conference calls are being established around 6/6:30 PM on Thursday evenings starting next week [this has been modified to Thursdays at 1 PM.] This needs to be publicized for next week.
- It is a priority for Jess to send some things out snail-mail, but it is important to know who the recipients would be [some folks have provided advice/names for this purpose.]
- o It is important to recognize that no one is intentionally being remiss and to be careful of being critical. However, it is also important to recognize that folks are feeling lonely in the church.
- People are tired of being in home and isolated; words may come out harsher than normal. Make sure to treat each other accordingly.

SPRC: No April meeting. Will meet via Zoom May 13th at 7:30 PM; however, staff reviews will not be conducted on Zoom.

Trustees: Will meet next on 1st Wednesday in May via Zoom.

- The floors at the church will be cleaned and waxed Thursday, April 30, and Friday, May 1. Please stay away from the church during this time [through May 3rd.] Notification will be sent out about being away from church during that time.
- Vicky and Gary have been helping with the leak situation at church, which is currently on hold. Leaking does not seem to be occurring in the choir room right now. Roof Right fixed the aluminum on the tower on Monday and replaced a shingle on the roof, as well. More will be discussed at the Trustees meeting.
- Calvin Lucy can absolutely cone on in May. He is wonderful and cares about the church.

UMW: [see notes in this issue (May 2020) of the Wesley Journal]. Question for Rev. Amy about camperships; Rev. Amy said that the BWC and Wesley UMC have opportunities to help provide funds for kids attending church camps. She also said that the Lucy Harrell campership fund recently gave two children scholarships for Manidoken.

Matt Sichel:

- The District Committee on Ministry meeting has been postponed until June. He was able to have one meeting with his candidacy mentor and received a lot of help preparing for the conversation about becoming a Deacon.
- Matt is slowly slogging through the beginning of his doctoral work. He needs to submit his application for the London School of Theology/Asbury Seminary, Wilmore, KY doctoral program and will hopefully be accepted for the fall. His dissertation and defense would be through the London S. of Th., and he would be assigned supervisors in both KY and London. He would also have residency every year in London.
- All conferences of the UMC are postponed. The BWC will meet for a one-day session for necessary business in September. The General Conference will be held in Minneapolis from 8/24 through 9/10/2021. This is a blessing, in a way; some felt pressed to get the details of the separation hammered out before this year's scheduled General Conference.

Possible date for resuming church services – May 17th.

Upper Room Devotionals: These booklets were brought up during the meeting. They will be offered on a first come, first served basis. Jess will put them where they normally belong in the downstairs education wing hallway. Denny Rill had offered to mail them out; Jess said that she will send out the email saying that they are first come, first served and that some can be sent out.


