From the desk of the Pastor...

Happy New Year! As I contemplated what to write about for a brand new 2021, I was reminded of something Dr. Emora Brannan, the former Senior Pastor of Grace UM Church in Baltimore, MD told me. It seems that every morning, when he and his wife, Nancy, sat down to their oatmeal breakfast in the church's parsonage, he would turn to Nancy and say, "Well, I wonder what today will bring?" It is a good question. For pastors, one never really does know what will happen from one day to the next. I guess much of life is like that.

I do wonder what 2021 will bring. Since 2020 was a year very few could have predicted, it is tempting to think 2021 might be relatively easy. On December 15, 2019, I was diagnosed with Stage 4 Pancreatic Cancer spread to my Liver. Tomorrow marks the one year anniversary of that diagnosis. This is a monumental anniversary. I am grateful to be here one year later. I am grateful to the doctors, nurses and scientists working on and researching cancer. I am grateful to the doctors and nurses that have provided care to me over the past year. I am grateful for the treatments that were prescribed to remove the tumors. I am grateful to so many people that have reached out to support, help and pray for me and my family.

Today there is no evidence of the tumors that were on my pancreas and liver. I still need to be scanned approximately 4 times a year and, I have another scan coming up in January. There are no guarantees that I will continue to be evidence free of cancer, but I feel good today and I am grateful for the extended time I have been given.

I am looking forward to the Christmas holiday this season. Last year I was very sick on Christmas Day. Sick enough to the point of having to go to the hospital emergency room for fluids. I was in the middle of my first round of Chemotherapy during those days. This year I expect to feel good and to be able to celebrate with my family during the holidays.

Thanks to everyone for all of the support over the past year. This year has been one of growth and fulfillment. It may not seem possible. This year I have been able to grow closer to God and realize the love and fulfillment I have been able to receive and give.

A Testimony from Dana Walton, Recently Baptized at Wesley UMC

I grew up going to Wesley Church. I walked in the door for the first time in many years, August 25, 2019, took a breath, and along with the familiar scent of the sanctuary, all the memories of love and belonging flooded into me. As I sat in the pew, listening to "You Say,"

*I keep fighting voices in my mind that say I'm not enough
Every single lie that tells me I will never measure up
Am I more than just the sum of every high and every low?
Remind me once again just who I am, because I need to know, ooh oh*

*You say I am loved when I can't feel a thing
You say I am strong when I think I am weak
And You say I am held when I am falling short
And when I don't belong, oh, You say I am Yours
And I believe, oh, I believe
What You say of me
I believe*

the words resonated in me and for the first time as an adult, I felt cradled in the hands of Jesus. I left the service and made it a point to return to Wesley when our travel allowed. I wanted that feeling back. Even though I had the desire to feel Jesus's love, I was busy doing all my tasks and never stopped to think what it required of me to receive that feeling. Life continued and I kept in my busy-ality life.

From my time at Wesley, I knew God and I also learned that Jesus is love and that he loves us. During my middle school years, our family left Wesley and we attended the Baptist church which left me feeling fearful of God. I remember being in the pews and thinking, "I don't think God is calling me to go up front. But maybe I better go up? Because what if I die tonight?" From high school on, church attendance was intermittent. I was married in a church and all 3 of my children were baptized. I always felt, there was something missing. By what my son's Godfather wrote, I knew he knew God in a way different than I knew, but I wasn't inquisitive enough then to find out what it was.

Another time I felt the "something more" was when I was younger and babysitting. There were 2 families and in their home there was a different warmth and love of the Savior than I knew. Also, our neighbors, the Baker's had the same warmth and love of God abound in themselves and in their home. Again, I was curious but did not take any actions to seek the peace and love they had as a result of their relationship with God.

Fast forward to 2019: was blessed to be in town for A NIGHT OF HOLIDAY MUSIC and see Wesley filled to capacity with the joy of music (& lights!) fill the sanctuary. It was a monumental night and once again I felt the Spirit I felt back at the August piano and keyboard concert. Because of my time at Wesley, I started seeking churches in the Augusta area. I used to think praying and observing the beauty of the world was enough, but thanks to being around Billy and others I knew there was something I was missing.

This was most evident when I was able to be in town and watch the Praise Team practice. I would hear the same words, yet I could tell they felt them different than I did. I sat in the pew wondering, "What is it that they have that I don't?" I could sense Billy, Jess, Paul, Lisa and Lana had "something" more and they heard the words in a much more meaningful way. Since I knew of God but didn't really know God, I also noted their prayers were relevant and changing and said at times in earnest, and not the repetitive type prayer I said for decades with only slight variation.

Once again, though I noticed the difference, I did not actively seek to discover what that "something" was. I got closest the day Billy and I went to Wesley the first Sunday it was closed due to COVID. We sat quietly for a while, then Billy looked up and around and exclaimed, "Isn't this the most beautiful church!?" "Yes, it is." I asked him to explain the story behind each stained glass because I didn't remember. I recall thinking, *I still have never read the Bible. I should do that.* as Billy explained in detail the meaning behind each stained glass painting.

Not long after that Billy passed away and I found myself in a deep dark place. For quite a while, I felt formless. I struggled to get through each day. My mom gave advice that became my default when all I wanted to do was hide "Sing *Jesus Loves Me*" That song sustained me. Thankfully, God put Alyse Resh in my path. She told me, God placed it on her heart to give me a call. I wasn't sure what she meant but I was happy to hear from her (17 years ago we were neighbors). She called me and we set up a day and time to meet for a walk. I now realize the evil one attempted to prevent our meeting. On my way to meet her, the truck stalled and I couldn't get it started. I called Alyse to tell her not to leave her house, but the call failed. I tried one more time and it started. I was on a time limit because I had a conference call in 1 hour. I then drove to the wrong park. I texted Alyse, 'I parked near the bathrooms', and she wrote back, 'there aren't any bathrooms.' Despite the struggle, we met nonetheless for a brief walk. Alyse listened and shared and she prayed with me before leaving. That was the first time I felt a prayer rise up to heaven. I led the conference call in the parking lot of Panther Park (a park where Billy & I shot baskets). Alyse came back and placed the book Jesus Calling in the passenger seat.

Reading Jesus Calling I found comfort in the devotions and the references to scripture got me to open the Bible. Via Zoom, I took a Starting Point class and began learning about God.

On a Sunday, I planned to do what I usually do, go for a long bike ride and take in the beauty of this world. I kept getting the sense that that was not what I needed to do. So I slowed down and listened more. That became the first time I opened the Bible without prompting from anyone or anything else. And I began reading the Gospel. I never went for a bike and thanks to listening to the Spirit, I gain so much more than the benefits of a 60 mile ride.

I began to understand who Jesus was and what he did. I realized that knowing Jesus is more than knowing he was born in a manger and died on a cross. In fact, at that time, I thought, his being born from the virgin Mary was the big deal. It wasn't until after reading the Gospel that I realized it is the cross that matters most. The fact that he bore all our sins and died on the cross and was resurrected. I started reading more of the Bible and then went back and reread Matthew, Mark, Luke & John. My understanding deepened. I was still grieving deeply from Billy's death, which also raised my struggle with losing my dad. Though from this grief, I was getting to know God, I was hating myself for it taking another death to wake me up to God. I felt ashamed that I didn't realize who God was when my dad passed away. One day, feeling very lost and unguided, fell to the floor and cried out, "God! I need you!" Immediately, I heard Him say, "I've been here all along." And I felt his arms wrapped around me.

Prior to this it was the parable of the lost sheep spoke loudest to me. I realized that God didn't care that I was now seeking Jesus. He wasn't keeping score. He wasn't shaming me for not seeking a relationship with him after my dad died, I was. I now realize it was probably the accuser putting those thoughts in my head as well. "Why did it take this long?" "Why bother now?" I now know all those thoughts were not from God. God was happy I turned so that I could see him and he loves me the same as all his children.

Since accepting Christ as my Savior and really knowing God I have experienced numerous blessings. He has continued to put people in my path. Lisa Kemp spent an entire afternoon with me sharing her faith journey and the story of the prodigal son, which opened the door to me realizing what I shared above, that God has no time and as long as we seek him, he is waiting and wanting us to find him but we have to initiate the seeking. One day I prayed for a connection, for someone to reach out to me. Within a handful of days, I received a text from an acquaintance from 8 years ago. We since have zoomed, texted and talked and she too has helped me on my faith journey. I've prayed to God and asked for help from small to large things – and he has answered – our bunny was found...alive. My daughter's horse recovered from a potentially mortal colic (& it didn't require the anticipated surgery), I received healing of a severely strained muscle, my retainer appeared, a just right song played, I turned to just the scripture I needed to read. God hears and answers our prayers. I've been praying for a friend's grandson who is battling leukemia. He is 4 years old and wanted to be able to go home. I found out that right after prayer and laying on of hands with the grandad sitting in for his grandson, the numbers declined and Luca was going able to go home. Hallelujah! Our God is good. I now know why Mrs. Audrey and Mrs. Kathy always sung a little different than any other choir directors I had. They both had that joy, joy, joy down in their heart. I thank the Lord that I have that joy too.

Thank you Rev. Amy for supporting and performing my baptism. And thank you congregation of Wesley United Methodist Church for witnessing and supporting my proclamation of faith and new life in Jesus.



If you are looking for texts about miracles, angels, and heaven, we have some suggestions:

90 Minutes in Heaven by Don Piper (236) On the way home from a conference, Don Piper's car was crushed by a semi that crossed into his lane. Medical personnel said he died instantly. While his body lay lifeless inside the ruins of his car, Piper experienced the glories of heaven, awed by its beauty and music. Ninety minutes after the wreck, while a minister prayed for him, Piper miraculously returned to life on earth with only the memory of inexpressible heavenly bliss. His faith in God was severely tested as he faced an uncertain and grueling recovery. Now he shares his life-changing story with you.

Angels by Billy Graham (231) Somehow it has always been easier for people to believe in demons than in the brighter side of the unseen world—the world of God's protecting angels. Yet. "...angels have a much more important place in the Bible than the devil and his demons," says Dr. Billy Graham in this best-selling classic. With over a million copies sold, *Angels* records the experiences of Dr. Billy Graham and others who are convinced that at moments of special need they have been attended by angels.

Chasing Heaven by Crystal McVea (236) On December 10, 2009, Crystal McVea was being treated in a hospital for pancreatitis. Her heart stopped pumping for nine minutes before doctors managed to revive her. In those nine minutes, she went to heaven, stood with God, and was forever changed. Before she left heaven, God told her to share her experience. Ever since Crystal's incredible experience occurred, her life has been profoundly different. She has been completely transformed and has become a brand-new person in every conceivable way—heart, mind, soul, and spirit. By dying, Crystal learned how to live.

Embraced By The Light by Betty J. Eadie (236). At the age of thirty-one, Betty Eadie died in a hospital after undergoing surgery. The events that followed have been called "the most profound near-death experience ever." Her life was changed forever. Her experience was so powerful that it remains with her every hour of each day. In sharing it, she hopes that it may touch the hearts of others, bringing them closer to the Love that awaits us all.

Miracles and Other Wonders by Charles Sellier (233). The marvelous events described in this book actually happened. In story after story, you will discover how the lives of ordinary people are saved – or changed forever – by the intervention of something that can only be called a miracle. Beginning with the author's own moving experience in the mountains of Utah to mysterious feats that defy time and death itself, all of these real-life accounts are strange, wondrous, and true.

Touched By Angels by Eileen Freeman (231) In this enlightening book, the author movingly recalls her personal encounters with angels, and shares what she has learned about who they are and why they are so concerned about the human race that they frequently come to earth to help us. She offers illuminating eyewitness accounts of men, women, and children who have also been touched by these celestial beings.



- DO:** Praise God for each other and for being with us through these difficult times. Alleluia!


