From the desk of the Pastor...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord:

The other day at breakfast, I asked Denny what he is "giving up for Lent." What he answered is confidential information, but I thought I would ask you, the Wesley congregation, what each of you is giving up for Lent?

The practice of "giving up" during the Lenten Season is self-denial. It is making a sacrifice and bearing in mind the (far greater) sacrifice Jesus made for us. If you cannot think of something to sacrifice, I would like to make a few suggestions. Most of these are behaviors that hurt you or those around you. All of them keep us from being the people God wants us to be. If we are being honest, we are guilty of at least some of these practices. Sacrifice is not really sacrifice unless we *know* these behaviors and make



a firm decision to change them. What better time than Lent to do a "spring cleaning of our souls?"

Here is my list:

- Gossip. One of the best quotes I have ever heard is, "big minds discuss ideas. Small minds discuss people." Enough said.
- Negativity. No one likes a Debbie Downer.
- Complaining. This is so habitual with some of us, we don't even realize we are doing it. Put an elastic band or bracelet around one of your wrists and, when you find yourself complaining, switch the band or bracelet to the other wrist. Be self-aware!
- Spending too much time in front of the news or The Weather Channel. Talk about stress!
- Staying up too late. Yes, we night owls might be productive in the wee hours, but we are short-changing people and good practices in the daylight hours.
- Social media. Do we find ourselves spending lots of time scrolling through Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, Snapchat, Tik-Tok, etc. etc...Guess what? We are

- Attendees: Rev. Amy Sarah Lewis-Rill (Acting Chairwoman), Dennis Rill, Cherie Hughes, Rose Sichel, Matt Sichel, Jess Sichel, John Sies, Jonathan Yost, Linda Yost, Jennifer Ejk, Linda Hollman, Vicky Wilmer, Janet Martin, Brenda Kennedy, and Jackie Otwell.
- The **meeting started** at approximately 7:09 PM. Rev. Amy opened with a **devotional** based on part of Thessalonians 5. We are children of light – we can keep awake and be sober, wearing the armor of God. We should encourage and build up one another. Cherie Hughes spoke about being "hopeful" for 2021. Linda Yost talked about supporting local businesses. Jackie Otwell told a story about how a kid who was squeegeeing in the city drew a heart on the window in the midst of everything. Matt Sichel said that the prayer requests were coming hand over fist; lost of prayer is happening there. Jess Sichel said that the Sichel family would need some encouragement over the next five or six years as Matt completes his doctorate.

Prayer was offered.

- Hosting a Shrove Tuesday Takeout Supper with sausage, pancakes, applesauce, and muffins.
- Takeout Tuesdays will be restarted on March 16th.
- Outreach is providing a meal for the mission and Takeout Tuesday one Tuesday a month.
- Outreach has begun working with Habitat for Humanity at the ReStore. The next planned workday is Saturday, February 6, when the group will be stocking.
- The next Outreach committee will be February 9th at 7 PM.

Church Website: We have a new, live website, which works well with mobile phones. [Check it out!]

So, how are we doing?

- We started in-person worship on 6/14/20
- There was the Live Nativity
- We have had online material/worship
- Takeout Tuesday was started

What has your experience been?

What would you like to see?

- Linda Hollman: It has been wonderful to meet in person (it was later noted that the Episcopal Church is not "opened" as of now). Rev. Amy's weekly devotional is a really good idea. Jessie's weekly notes are also a really good thing to keep us connected.
- Rev. Amy reported that Donna Brown really liked the devotional (we are not sure who this is, which is a neat thing because it means we are reaching people we do not know).
- There was some feedback from a member who is not currently attending in-person worship: things are getting a bit more difficult as COVID goes on, and life circumstances plus COVID has made things interesting.
- Linda Yost reported that many UMW officers in Baltimore City are fearful of reopening their churches due to COVID -19.
- Matt Sichel is very proud that we can be open, as many mainline churches are closed. He shared that the last place you want to close is a church; to be in community is great. In his case, he has people in his Sunday School class in a hybrid form.

Rev. Amy shared that the Women's Sunday School class is meeting with social distancing.

When might post-COVID be a "thing" for our church?

Waiting for a majority vaccination (most people vaccinated)

Linda Hollman suggested next Fall.

In the summer, we will likely be holding outdoor services.

Perhaps we can ease into something near-normal by Fall; two services with Sunday School in between.

Linda Yost stated that she is missing interactions with the Sunday School kids

Cherie Hughes said that post-COVID is regional; maybe "normal" will be Spring 2022, but in this area, maybe the Fall. Cherie said that it is amazing that the church is together more than anything else she's seen.

Matt Sichel said that he would not discount the power we have seen in outdoor worship. He is amazing at the outdoor worship accomplishments. He suggested that we keep the idea in focus for when we try things in the future and that we remember the joy of people.

Rev. Amy mentioned how much people enjoy being outdoors; we can even minister to folks who go by. However, she did not realize that it would be so much on the contemporary team.

Jess Sichel addressed the strength of the contemporary team and the motivation of/by them. Also, this has been a time of Sabbath rest; we don't want to lose this.

Matt Sichel gave a report for the general United Methodist Church:

- There is a very big question as to whether General Conference will happen in August.
- At General Conference, the group will be discussing the Protocol for Separation of the United Methodist Church.
- At the end of February, the commission on General Conference is to decide how to move forward with the Conference itself. Will it be in person or virtual? People in certain areas may end up gathering and connecting virtually to people in other conferences ("divested") with a very limited agenda (the Protocol for Separation and the budget). General Conference may be postponed, which "nobody" wants. The continued postponement of the division is causing issues on both ends.
- There will be a press release in March.
- At this point General Conference has been postponed for 15 months, but that may not be enough.
- The Lutherans and possibly the UCC did/may have done this semi-virtually

Linda Yost reported that Laura Waltrup had another commitment and the **financial report** will be given next month.

Linda will be offering devotions/insight for next month's meeting on February 24th.

The meeting was **closed in prayer** at 8 PM.
