



Library Notes

During this month, we celebrate mothers and all that they do. Women, both mothers AND grandmothers, are so important in the day-to-day teaching of children. At the end of the day, these caretakers make such a difference in the lives of babies, juveniles, and older youth. In the following suggested books, there is provided support, encouragement, prayers, and SMILES! "You may not be able to leave your children a great inheritance, but day by day, you may be weaving coats for them which they will wear for eternity." --Theodore L. Cuyler--

Children Are From Heaven by John Gray (173) Based on the idea that children respond better to positive rather than negative reinforcement, the *Children Are From Heaven* program concentrates on rewarding, not punishing, children and fostering their innate desire to please their parents. Central to this approach are the five positive messages your children need to learn again and again: It's okay to be different. It's okay to make mistakes. It's okay to express negative emotions. It's okay to want more. It's okay to say no, but remember Mom and Dad are the bosses.

Seven Words to Change Your Family by James MacDonald (173) Family is one of life's greatest joys, but sometimes heart-felt laughter is hard to come by. Has your family been going through troubled times? Do you need a word of encouragement, a lift in the right direction? In a humorous, yet challenging way, James MacDonald teaches words from Scripture that, if applied, can truly transform your family...from top to bottom!

The Five Love Languages of Children by Gary Chapman (173). Children need to know how much you love them. Every child expresses and receives love best through one of five communication styles: quality time, words of affirmation, gifts, acts of service, and physical touch. If your love language is different from your children's, you need to learn to translate or you may miss the chance to meet their deepest emotional needs. Discover how to express unconditional feelings of respect, affection, and commitment that will resonate in their souls and inspire them for the rest of their lives.

Life Management for Busy Women by Elizabeth George (232) Do you feel as though you're falling behind in your schedule? Do you long for your life to be simpler and more focused? Are you wondering about your purpose in life—if perhaps you've missed it? You're not alone—these are the concerns that tug at the hearts of many women today. And author Elizabeth George, a busy woman herself, can identify completely. Through the years, she has looked to God's Word for answers about a woman's priorities and purpose in life; and, in this book she shares her discoveries.

Chicken Soup for the Grandma's Soul by Jack Canfield (240) This book celebrates the memories we make and the times we cherish with grandmothers: the women who can both spoil and be stern; who provide unconditional love and invaluable wisdom; who can share sage advice while sharing ice cream.

Children Learn What They Live: Parenting to Inspire Values by Dorothy Law Nolte (173). If children live with criticism, they learn to condemn. If children live with acceptance, they learn to love. Nolte offers a simple but powerful guide to parenting – by inspiring values through example. Addressing issues of security, self-worth, tolerance, honesty, fear, respect, fairness, patience, and more, this book of common sense will help parents find their own parenting wisdom and draw out their child's immense inner resources.

The meeting opened at 7:02 PM with a devotion offered by Rev. Amy based on 1 Corinthians 3:5-9: ⁵What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you came to believe, as the Lord assigned to each. ⁶I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. ⁷So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. ⁸The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labor of each. ⁹For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building." We are each workers and each of us has gifts, but we are on the same team with the same God. We are co-workers in God's service. We can pass the Message because someone gave it to us.

Trustees: Linda Yost

- The Trustees met on March 3rd and discussed lots of things.
- If someone is interested in using the church, permission should be requested from the Trustees
- The Trustees received a \$6,300 bid for the repair of the west-side tower's badly rotted louvre and leaking mortar. They are still looking for a cheaper estimate. The Trustees requested that this be a Wesley Improvement Project (WIP) item. There is \$17,200 currently in the WIP account. The motion came from a committee, so no second was needed. It is not new and/or improvement to the church, but it is an emergency. John Sies asked if there are other funds available; no, there are not funds available. **The official motion was to use up to \$6,300 from WIP funds to repair the aforementioned items.** It was noted that "cheaper" is not necessarily "better." **The vote was none opposed, non abstained, all in favor; the motion passed.**
- There is still a leaking problem in the choir room, which has to do with downspouts/gutters. Another bid will be sought after from Owen Rill/C3 Construction. It should be about \$500. Trustees will discuss and vote next month.

SPRC: Linda Yost

- Met in March, discussed SPRC goals.
- SPRC has taken on composing leadership descriptions for each committee. Sandy Cole and Matt Otwell will discuss further.
- The SPRC wants to educate the congregation about needing to fill roles.
- The SPRC and the Administrative Council will need to prepare themselves to deal with the impending [possible] world-wide split of the denomination.
- Rev. Amy's goals include:
 - September: new youth group leader
 - Fall 2021-Spring 2022: Confirmation Class during Sunday School for the academic year
 - Work on doctoral dissertation
 - Get the congregation through the pandemic
 - Guide the congregation through the church division
- The representative to Finance from SPRC is Roger Daugherty.
- Jess Sichel thanked Roger Daugherty for his help in the church office.

Communications: Sandy Cole has the ad for the Rummage Sale timed for the newspaper, WTTR, and any other free ads in papers.

Membership: Sandy Cole is keeping up with congregational information changes.

Spring Drive-Thru Fried Chicken Supper:

- 520 pieces of chicken were sold (7 dark meat pieces were left over). 381 meals were sold, with 132 extra pieces, 17 quarts of potato salad (with meals) and 17 additional quarts of potato salad (kitchen sales) were also sold.
- The net profit from the supper was around \$3,000. The fall supper brought in about \$2,600, so the income was up.
- There was lots of fellowshiping and people were appreciative. The plan is to have another supper on November 13th.
- Feedback says that the potato salad was a amazing.

Finance/Treasurer: Michelle Hudgins/Laura Waltrup

- Laura forwarded the financial reports for the meeting ahead of time.
- A letter was sent out in early March/late February. At the last meeting, we were tracking pretty far behind. Things were tight; apportionments, medical, and pension bills were not paid on time. However, we have had a fairly good response to the letter, with our income being much better. At the end of February, the bank balance was back up a bit, and outstanding bills were paid in March. March's bills were paid on time.
- We are still behind. Laura is hoping that we get close to the budget. We are running under budget for expenses.

- Laura is curious to see what happens moving forward. Will income giving levels be more consistent? Also of note is that the summer is usually difficult, financially. As for now, she is feeling much better, but things will need to be taken month to month.
- Michelle will put together another letter. She will work with Laura about a statement and get together by the end of the week.
- It was noted that communication happening before the pandemic (Town Halls) is no longer happening.

United Methodist Men: Denny Rill announced that the UMM will be meeting with dinner on April 26th at 6:30 PM. Denny will send out notices.

United Methodist Women: Linda Yost reported that Wesley is one of the few open and operating churches. We have been that way since last June. Other people from other churches are flabbergasted, as they are just now organizing. Rev. Amy and everyone were praised for working the way we have. Rev. Amy noted that things are similar multi-denominationally, as well. John Sies noted that people are getting shots; he stated that if ANYONE over 75 has not been contacted about shots, Ed Singer in the health department can be contacted personally. John has his phone number.

Lay Member to Annual Conference: Matt Sichel

- There were no questions about the report that Matt sent around [regarding the current/future UMC situation]. Thanks were offered to Matt.
- It is worth mentioning that there was to be a specially called General Conference in May called by the Bishops, but it was cancelled due to outcry from African and other delegates. The Council of Bishops will discuss pushing up issues like retiring Bishops and electing Bishops, etc. Bottom line, the situation is fluid, and we should keep our eyes out for changes.
- Rev. Amy seconded the fact that the situation is fluid. She also said that we will [as a church] eventually need to vote.
- Discussion continued on what divisions would be like under the Protocol for Separation with the vote. Clarification was made by John Sies that the Global Methodist Church would be the traditionalist expression.

The meeting closed at 8:07 PM with prayer by Matthew Sichel. The next meeting of the Administrative Council will be on the fourth Wednesday in April [April 28th] at 7 PM. Janet Martin will do devotions for that meeting.
