

A Letter From the Pastor



Dear Confirmation Age Friends:

Do you want to join Wesley United Methodist Church? Do you want to confirm the promises made on your behalf by your parents when you were baptized? If you haven't been baptized yet, would you like to be? If you answered yes to any of these questions, you might like to take confirmation classes this upcoming school year (2021-2022). In confirmation classes, you will learn what it means to be a Christian, and especially a United Methodist Christian. It will be an interesting and fun part of your spiritual journey. You will know so much when you are confirmed on Pentecost Sunday 2022. I promise! It is a wonderful experience you will never forget.

That said, confirmation is a serious step. It will require commitment on your part, and there are some rules that go along with the process. First, preparing to join a church takes time and confirmation will need to be a priority. Second, you must be available on a couple of weekends when we take field trips. You will also need to visit three churches outside of the United Methodist tradition, and you will need to be present at Wesley UMC worship services every Sunday except when you are visiting another church. Third, you will need to attend class every week. I will do my best to accommodate your schedules, but please know that there are only two (2) *excused* absences allowed per school term and these absences will need to be made up outside of class time. Fourth, you will need to find a mentor who will "travel" the confirmation journey with you. This is someone you admire in the church, who will pray for you and help you learn about what it means to be a Christian. Fifth, and perhaps most importantly, confirmation should be something *YOU* want to do. If your parents are making you do it, you won't enjoy the process nearly as much. Please think about and pray about whether this is the right step for you and the right time to do it.

There will need to be at least two students in a class for confirmation classes to happen this year. Please let me know by e-mail: revamys@aol.com if you are interested. I am looking forward to getting to know you better, and helping you learn what it means to be a United Methodist Christian. I hope to hear from you soon!

[FOR MEMORIZING] 100 Bible Verses Everyone Should Know by Heart by Robert J. Morgan (232.1) With the immediacy of Internet searches and ease of handheld devices, the custom of memorizing Scripture may not seem necessary, but best-selling author Robert J. Morgan makes an airtight case for reviving this rewarding practice in 100 Verses Everyone Should Know by Heart. In a series of brief opening chapters, Morgan prepares us for this old way of thinking and then presents his experienced list of 100 crucial verses, providing sidebar notes, quotes, and memorization tips for each. Betsy Sennett was inspired by this text and used it for her Ash Wednesday devotional in our Wesley Lenten Devotional Book.

[FOR RESTORING] A Disciple's Heart: Growing in Love and Grace by James A. Harnish (232). This two-book set (Daily Workbook and Companion Reader) facilitates the process of restoring a relationship with God and others, and reshaping life into the likeness of Christ. It can help you develop your own daily spiritual practice and define next steps for growth. The Workbook contains six weeks of daily readings (five per week), each including a scripture, a message for the day, questions and prompts for personal reflection, and a guide to prayer and action. The Companion Reader offers a deeper understanding of each week's theme from a distinctly Wesleyan perspective.

[FOR DISCOVERING] Anonymous: Discovering the Somebody You Are to God by Cindi Wood (232). This Bible Study is for the person who feels anonymous: overlooked, rejected, or discounted. It explores the stories of four anonymous women of the Bible who were known and remembered not by their names but by their circumstances, and who were judged, hurting, ordinary, and felt shame. As you consider their stories, experience the life-changing power of God's mercy and grace. Our library set includes a student's book and leader's kit.

[FOR TEACHERS] Apples and Chalkdust by Vicki Caruana (240) These true-to-life meditations, compiled by a veteran educator, are glowing with extraordinary insight and practical inspiration to help you renew your perspective. As you reflect on your calling and balance your outlook, you'll be encouraged to meet each day's classroom challenges with fresh energy. It will carry you the whole year through.

[FOR THOSE WHO LIKE TRIVIA] Bible Trivia Book: New Testament – Church by Barbara Morse Priest and Wayne Priest (226). These are 420 Bible Trivia questions on the New Testament with an emphasis on the early church. Answers are at the back of the book.

[FOR ALL OF US] Cast of Characters by Max Lucado (232) Common people...story after story marked by scandal, stumble, and intrigue. Who are these people? They're the people of the Bible. And they're us. In the midst of them all...hovering over them all... is the hero of it all: God. Maker. Shaper. Rescuer of sinking hearts. God. Passing out high callings, second chances, and moral compasses to all comers and takers. In this gathering of inspiring stories from his numerous best-selling books, master storyteller Max Lucado revisits some of his favorite biblical characters-all of whom were very human and imperfect, just like us.

Our library is for you to use and enjoy. Remember to sign your name and date to the card found in the back of the book. File the card in the yellow box under the letter that begins your last name. When you return a book, find the card, put the return date on the card, and put the card in the pocket of the book. You can stack books on the shelf beside the yellow box or on the desk; the librarians will re-shelve them. Please return borrowed items within 6 months.

Administrative Council Meeting Minutes • May 26, 2021

Attendees: Rev. Amy Sarah Lewis-Rill (Chairperson), Linda Yost, Jonathan Yost, Matt Sichel, Jessica Sichel, Rose Sichel, Dennis Rill, Jackie Otwell, Sandy Cole, John Sies, Michelle Hudgins, Vicky Wilmer, and Janet Martin.

The meeting opened at 7 PM. Matt Sichel offered a devotion from My Utmost for His Highest by Oswald Chambers. The devotion he used was for March 12th and was based on Mark 10:28. Essentially, we want things for our own good and things in return for our "abandonment" to God, not for God's Good. We need real abandonment for Jesus Christ. Matt then led us in prayer. Linda Yost will lead us in June devotions.

Last Month's Minutes: No corrections were offered by attendees for the previous month's minutes.

Issue Needing Vote:

- Outdoor Food Pantry: The Outreach committee came with a proposal to set up an outdoor food pantry. It would measure 5 feet by 32 inches by 2 feet. It would be outside of the glass doors against the wall under cover of the eave. It would have a plexiglass cover on the front. The pantry would be for anyone who was in need of something (whether that be something someone can't afford or something someone was missing from his/her kitchen).
 - ♦ Jess Sichel noted that it will block part of the camera facing the parking lot at eye level; however, it was also noted that the camera would pick up any issues that might come up.
 - ♦ The pantry would be stocked by all of the congregation.

A vote was taken: All were in favor with none against and no abstentions.

Outreach: Vicky Wilmer

- Takeout Tuesday will end on June 29th. Last night, 140 fried chicken meals were served.
- Back-to-Church/School Picnic will be on 9/12/21, which is the first Sunday we are scheduled to be back to Christian Education (and hopefully, our regularly scheduled Sunday morning program). Rev. Amy is planning for two services with Sunday School.

Christian Education: Jackie Otwell

- It was good to have Sunday School come back in-person. At the end of the "school year," there was a small group that went to the strawberry patch at Baugher's.
- Linda Yost, Patty Harris, and Bonnie Catron will continue teaching next year.
- We have had our last scheduled Sunday School of the year.
- Christian Education was to meet on June 8th, but will reschedule.
- Vacation Bible School (VBS) will be "Rocky Railway," and the meetings will be in the evenings from 6:15 to 7:30 PM on August 2nd, 4th, and 6th.
 - ♦ The thought at the moment is that there will be three "rotations" between singing, a craft, and a lesson, with a take-home snack, as well.
 - ♦ The service project to be supported is "Operation Kid to Kid" [https://mycause.worldvision.org/index.cfm? fuseaction=donorDrive.event&eventID=1444]. (Jackie also suggested that donations be taken up for the new food pantry, as well, which was agreed to.)
 - ♦ Live alpacas will also be visiting at VBS (Rev. Amy was very excited).
 - There is a Google Form for registration (<u>click here</u>). There is also a Google Form for volunteers (<u>click here</u>). Volunteers will be needed to prepare materials, work on woodwork/crafts, help with a singing station, help with a lesson station, (etc.). Most of the set up should be for outside, but ideas for indoors are welcome!
- We are [or will be] using advertising through Facebook, word of mouth, and the website.
- Jessie will print out copies of the Journal Flyer to be distributed.

Finance: Michelle Hudgins

- Laura Waltrup, Treasurer, sent out financial information via email ahead of time. We are currently doing better than the budget for the year, but there is some concern about the summer "dip."
- Another letter was sent out to follow Rev. Amy's previous letter; this one was more of a "thank you" letter and included financial statements.
- Youth Group Leader: We have enough funds for the final quarter of the year to support this position. The need
 was about \$1,100 for the rest of the calendar year. The UMW gave \$4 to \$500, and there was \$600 left over in
 the wreath fundraiser fund. The funding for the position will go into the 2022 budget.
- Michelle is working on a pamphlet for Planned Giving.
- The fund balance report will be due in June. It was last done in 2018. We have volunteers for auditing internally this year, but finance will check with the person who audited us before to do the next external audit next year.
- Helping Up Mission has sponsorships available for city children to go to camps outside of the city. Outreach is sponsoring 5 days of camp; 15 additional days will be sponsored through the Lucy Harrell campership endowment.
- Linda Yost and Cherie Hughes will eventually resume capital fundraising activit(ies).

Staff Parish Relations Committee: Linda Yost

- The job description for the Youth Group Leader is complete. It has been/will be published in the Baltimore-Washington Conference E-Connection, the Wesley Journal, and our Sunday bulletins. The Leader must be at least 21 years old due to Safe Sanctuaries (can be a parent or any adult who wants to step up). It was noted that for driving, the Leader might have to be at least 25 years old. Parental involvement will still be needed. The job description should be published on our website, on Facebook, and so forth. [As yet there has not been any response. The goal is to have someone in position by September, 2021 (this information provided in advance of the meeting by Linda Yost).}
- The Annual Review of our Custodian, Calvin Lucy, was held. All SPRC members agree that Calvin has been exemplary in the last year.

Trustees: Linda Yost (minutes below provided in advance)

- Trustees met in person and virtually on May 5, 2021.
- Mike Sichel will contact both Carroll Harris and Sigmond to price out replacing the ac/heating unit in the Church office.
- Some gutters and downspouts have been replaced along the Educational wing outside of the Choir room. Hoping this will solve the leaking problem.
- Gordon Benson will be ordering 7 yards of mulch from Schaeffer. Gordon will email the Trustees with a few dates soon to do mulching work.
- Tommy Smith continues to raise funds for his Eagle Scout pavilion project.
- Gordon will spray the weeds in the parking lot with weedkiller.
- Culligan Water has placed new filters in the reverse osmosis water system.
- Girl Scouts have requested to meet again. All Trustees agreed that the GS will need to be responsible for cleaning the room(s) that they use including tables, chairs, light switches, doorknobs, and bathroom. Linda will reach out to the leader to let her know they can meet. After discussion, the leaders decided that, at this time, they will continue to meet outside, weather permitting. They have asked and been granted permission to meet this Friday, May 28th, from 4:30-7:30 p.m. in the social hall.
- The basement under the kitchen gets wet when it rains hard. The Boy Scouts have stored equipment there which would be detrimental if exposed to too much moisture. There is a possibility that some of their equipment could be stored in the parsonage garage. This will require further dialogue. [Further dialogue was held during the Ad. Council Meeting, and it was noted that the youth use parsonage garage when active.]
- The Meditation Garden near the cemetery is in need of attention. Both benches need repair and staining, and the gardens need weeding and replanting. Phillip Daugherty will contact Robert Kirby to see if the Scouts could work on it.

Lay Member to Annual Conference: Matt Sichel

- The Baltimore-Washington Conference (BWC) will begin sharing a Bishop with the Peninsula Delaware Conference. It is the first time in 30 years that the BWC has shared a Bishop. The root cause is that there are not enough members in churches in the Northeastern Jurisdiction (NEJ) (from Maine to West Virginia) to support all of the current Bishop positions. There are two retiring NEJ Bishops who are not being replaced. The sharing of the Bishop was discussed among the 2016 General Conference Delegation, which was able to postpone it, but that is not possible now. The Bishop is to begin receiving help from Erica Robinson Johnson, the Chief Administrative Officer of the two conferences.
- In the Peninsula Delaware conference, 15 churches have withdrawn from conference membership (disaffiliated). One of these churches is "progressive," while fourteen of them are "traditional." Previously, General Conference had made a provision from the 2019 Special Session to allow for disaffiliation of churches. However, because the provision was in question due to voting irregularities at the Special Session, the BWC did not move forward with the practical application of the provision for BWC churches. The Peninsula Delaware Conference did allow it. Since then, the Judicial Council has decided that it is "legal" to allow churches to leave (paragraph 2553 in the Book of Discipline). While lots of churches in many places [outside of the BWC] have done this (becoming independent churches), Matt Sichel is urging churches to stay until the passing of the Protocol for Separation, as the current disaffiliation process is not a great way to leave the denomination. While it is unsettling for some congregations to remain with the UMC for now, the requirements for the current provision are not necessarily in the best interest of the churches.

Updated Guidelines: The BWC has lifted COVID-19 restrictions for vaccinated persons; however, unvaccinated persons are still advised to be careful. Rev. Amy is counseling caution as we continue the process of getting things back to normal.
