

# Hello Wesley Family,

The worship committee is looking for a handful of additional volunteers to sign up to help create a prayer station for our Stations of the Cross, which will be held in our sanctuary on Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Volunteers are not required to be at church during the presentation on Friday; they just set up the station prior to 3 PM on Good Friday and tear it down the next day after 12 Noon. This is such a powerful ministry at Wesley. We hope you will consider helping out with the stations that remain. Below is a list of all of the stations and scriptures (some of which have volunteers and some of which do not), and there is also an idea of what a set up might look like. If you have any questions or need help with ideas, you can call or text Lisa Kemp at 410-259-5823.

# Stations of the Cross, Wesley UMC, 2022,

Station Title	Scripture	Point to ponder	Location
1) Pilate condemns Jesus to die.	John 18:33 –37, Matt. 27:11- 14, 24, 26	Are you King of the Jews?	1st pew on back wall
2) Jesus accepts his cross.	(John 10:17 —18), Matt. 27: 27-31, John 19:17	I lay it down of my own.	2nd pew on back wall
3) Simon helps carry cross	Luke 23:26, Mark 15:21	How can I help?	Windowsill on west wall next to sound equipment
4) Jesus speaks to the women.	Luke 23:27 –31	Weep for yourselves.	Large window on west wall
5) Jesus is stripped of His garments	John 19: 23-25	They did this to fulfill the Scriptures	Left kneeling rail under organ pipes
6) Jesus is nailed to the cross	Mark 15: 23-32	King of the Jews.	Right kneeling rail under lectern
7) Jesus cares for His mother	John 19:25 b –27	Woman, this is your son.	Wall space next to stairwell, east wall
8) Jesus dies on the cross	John 19:28 –34, Mark 15: 33 -39	It is accomplished.	Large window on east wall
9) Jesus is laid in tomb.	John 19:38 –42	There they laid Jesus.	Last small window on east wall

There will be a written guide for persons to read as they walk the stations. For each station, the guide (volunteer) will print the title, scripture, some questions for reflection, and a prayer with both scripted and open-ended prompts. This will be posted at the station.

Each station will be need to be decorated and have physical elements for people to interact with – something to "do." Example: Table draped with cloths, stones to indicate a "road" leading to a "hill," crosses laid all around on the table. Additionally, there are painted crosses. *The person is invited to choose one and carry it with him/her.* 

As he/she does, the guide can ask him/her some questions: "How do you feel carrying a cross - sad, angry, important?," "Is it hard to carry a cross?," "Do you want to do it?," "Would it feel good to do it for Jesus' sake?"







The Wesley United Methodist Men had a fine meeting on February 21st, which was attended by 10 members. Thanks to the Wilmers for the entree and others that pitched in with salad, drinks and dessert.

John Sies provided the devotional and reminded us how to earn your "get out of hell free" card.

Dean Brewer was our guest speaker. Dean provided background on his 40+ years in law enforcement, most recently as chief investigator for the Carroll County State's Attorneys Office. He talked about work (more recently training) associated with abuse and neglect of vulnerable adults in various facilities, assisted living, etc. Dean also shared some stories and photos of some of his experiences over the years (great stuff). The main focus was on security and safety in places such as Wesley Church. He covered quite a bit of territory and will send along talking points covered. The main thing seems to be planning and being prepared. The suggestion is to have medical and safety/security teams that can determine risks, identify equipment and training needed and generally be prepared if an adverse event were to occur.

I'm hoping for a good turnout as Dick always provides great insights into the state of the county, what's going on, and what's coming up.
