community today? Or will old maps bring about frustration, causing us to overlook changing patterns around us, cultural changes, and the dynamics of population growth and demographic change? In times of transition, we need new maps to help us navigate the roads ahead.

Since 1972, the United Methodist Church remains divided on how the church needs to respond to the LGBT community, particularly in areas dealing with ordination and clergy performing weddings for same-sex couples. There are those (progressives) who believe LGBT persons should be able to enter the process of ordination and that clergy should have the authority to perform same-sex weddings. And there are those (traditionalists) who believe that LGBT persons are not to be ordained and that clergy cannot perform same-sex weddings.

Where does Wesley church stand on this issue? As your pastor, I know our church will be facing difficult discussions, important questions, and weighty decisions in the next few months. How do we navigate the current situation facing the United Methodist Church? Will we remain United Methodist or decide to disaffiliate? The Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference has created clear guidelines for a local church to disaffiliate. It is important for us to know that a local church does not initiate this process by itself without guidance from the Bishop, District Superintendent, and conference leadership.



News from the Lay Leadership Development (Nominations) Committee

According to *The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church* (paragraph 258:1) the committee on nominations and leadership development is to:

- **Identify** the gifts and strengths of persons in the congregation
- **Develop** their gifts, skills, and nurture them in their mission or ministry roles
- Deploy persons according to their gifts and passion in areas of service within the Church, community, and world
- Evaluate the effectiveness of their service and provide necessary training and service

Wesley church is full of talented and gifted people who acknowledge God as the gift-giver. Apostle Paul wrote: "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but is the same God who activates all of them in everyone" (1 Corinthians 12:4-7).



We started our meeting reciting our UWF purpose. There was no program for today due to our yearly planning efforts.

- Jackie will provide the Thank Offering program at our next UWF meeting in October, everyone to bring their annual Thank Offerings at that time.
- Connie read from the September/October 2022 Response Magazine/Women in Mission. The UWF President 'Anise 'Isama'u wrote with regards to the women's organization United Methodist Women name change to United Women of Faith. 'Ainise 'Isama'u stated that for years, members and leaders communicated they were seeking ways to grow and invite new women to our organization. Surveys were conducted with Christian women both inside and outside our current church to see what they are seeking in the 21st century. The research showed our old name was keeping us from looking at the organization in new ways. Women felt not included or welcomed. Women felt that the organization needed to offer more and different ways to be a part of our sisterhood so that everyone could feel like they belong to this organization. With our new name, we open our arms wider and welcome even more sisters to our work together.

Christians are like pumpkins...

A 10-year-old little girl was asked by another classmate, "what is it like to be a Christian?" The girl replied, "It's like being a pumpkin. God picks you from the patch, brings you in, and washes all the dirt off you. Then he cuts open the top and scoops out all of the yucky stuff. He removes the seeds of doubt, hate, greed, etc., and then He carves you a new smiling face and puts His light inside of you to shine for all the world to see."

Outrageous Love Transforming Power by Terry Wardle (232.1) The seed of Christ's nature is present within every believer. We have the potential to become more and more like Jesus. This book surveys the life of Jesus to identify eight characteristics of Christ that are to be nourished and nurtured by the Holy Spirit in the believer's life. Being transformed into the likeness of Christ is the true mark of spiritual maturity.



Living a Blessed Life: Key Decisions That Create Genuine Joy by Joyce Meyer (Audio-Visual).

Jesus is the answer to the life you've always wanted. He promises all believers that if we will simply take His keys to life and unlock the right doors, we will enjoy an active, blessed, endless life in the kingdom of God. So what are these Biblical keys to life? In this four-CD series, Joyce shares many life-changing principles, including: the best way to keep your priorities straight, how forgiving your enemies can transform your life, why we need to boldly stand up for our Christian beliefs, and the importance of being a person of your word.

Just Like Jesus by Max Lucado (232). Where did we get this idea that we can't change? From whence come statements such as, "It's just my nature to worry." "I'll always be pessimistic." "I'm just that way." Such thoughts are not from God. He can no more leave a life unchanged than a mother can leave a tear untouched. His plan for you is nothing short of a new heart. If you were a car, God would want to control your engine. If you were a computer, God would claim the software and the hard drive. If you were an airplane, he'd take his seat in the cockpit. But you are a person, so God wants to change your heart.

Take a Closer Look by Bryan McAnally (240) Take a Closer Look features a reader-friendly interactive design so you can quickly identify profound biblical truths—and apply them to your life. When you take a closer look, you see what you've been missing. And you are changed—heart, soul, and mind.

Guideposts for the Spirit: Stories of Changed Lives by Peggy Schaefer (920). These are warm and uplifting stories celebrating transformational moments in the lives of more than fifty celebrities. Some of the authors include Colin Powell, Reba McEntire, Carol Burnett, Diane Sawyer, Martin Sheen, Robert Duvall, Jimmy Stewart, and Andy Griffith among many others.
