The Frank and Loretta Harris Music Scholarship program has been established in loving memory of Mr. and Mrs. Harris in dedicated thanks for their lifetime of love and support of music and musicians of Wesley United Methodist Church. Their loyal encouragement has provided musical experiences and opportunities for Wesley members to perform within the church services and in the local community.

The scholarships are open to Wesley member applicants of any age who are studying or planning to study music through private lessons and school lessons. All disciplines are welcomed, including voice, piano, organ, brass, woodwinds, strings, percussion, and composition.

They are also designed to partly include instrument repairs if needed.

Applicant members may also be pursuing college degrees or other suitable dimensions of the practice of musical craft after graduating from high school.

Each year, the recipients should be able to perform several times at Wesley Church during regular worship services or special occasions, of course in coordination with the Music Department. A dedication to musical leadership as a member of Wesley is an important goal to help to ensure that quality church music will be continued for the next generations.

The scholarships usually begin with gifts of \$400-\$1000, depending on the level of study. Each candidate is carefully considered in all aspects which combine to identify that person, their ability, level and dedication. Renewal of awards is considered yearly and strongly encouraged.



#### Minutes from the United Women in Faith: November 17, 2022


Wesley UWF met; there were 8 women in attendance.

Connie presented the Response moment taken from the United Women in Faith Response Magazine November/December issue.



- Methodist in Kent, Washington installed solar panels on their church roof, these solar panel are projected to offset three-quarters of the church's annual energy consumption. This was possible through a \$102,000 Grant from Puget Sound Energy. More than \$954,000 has been awarded this year to 13 non-profits, tribes and other community groups. To promote solar power among organizations serving low-income, Black or Indigenous people and people of color. Solar arrays across these 14 locations will help to generate roughly 514,000 kilowatt-hours annually. According to Puget Sound Energy that would power more than 50 average households a year. During the state's most recent biennial legislative session, which ended in March, lawmakers passed a bill that established an incentive program to fund the installation of solar panels in certain buildings across low-income communities.

Linda Yost and Connie Wiegel attended. Linda reported on the ceremony. There was a total of 89 women were in attendance. Linda shared the devotional given that day, the topic was "Deborah" Judges 4:4-9, she was described as a woman, wife, prophetess, poet, leader, and a judge whose actions and words consistently pointed to God.
- o October Meeting minutes were accepted by group as is.
- October Treasurer's Report -Connie gave a brief overview in the absence of Jackie Grabowski. The bake table made \$472.00 during the drive thru supper. Jackie will update Treasurer's report when she returns from vacation. Food from the supper was donated to the Westminster Rescue Mission a total of \$160.00 in food was provided by the UWF

- Coat Drive- asking our congregation to donate any unwanted, nearly new /slightly used coats to help provide coats to the needy in our communities. Donations will be accepted until December 8<sup>th</sup>. Donations help to support UWF missions.
- Save the Children project discussion revisited. A motion was accepted by our group to give a donation to help provide new books for children in communities where recent major flooding conditions occurred, with and loss and damage in West Virginia and Kentucky.
- Linda Hollman proposed a project need to help Shirley and David [...] in their time of need. Shirley is 56 years old, and she resides in a rehab center in York, PA. Shirley is suffering with bone cancer, her seventeen-year-old son, David, is currently living by himself; he has special needs. Shirley's family and friends help to attend to Dave's needs. After much discussion it was decided to provide a donation to the family to help David with food or other needs. A motion was accepted by our group to provide a donation of money that will be distributed to a family member that takes care of David's groceries in intervals as needed. The UWF will be sending flowers to Shirley in rehab to lift her spirits.

- Windows on Christmas by Bill Crowder (261) Windows on Christmas will revolutionize your appreciation of Christmas as you look at the events surrounding the birth of Christ from six different perspectives: the angels and the shepherds, Mary and Joseph, Simeon and Anna. See what they saw. Feel what they felt. Learn from their responses to these wonderful and powerful events.
- Christmas Miracles by Jamie C. Miller (240) At Christmas, our hearts are touched by reports of wondrous occurrences that make us stop, reflect, and hope. This luminous book shares true accounts of Christmas miracles—inspiring events that happened to real people at Christmastime—including: "The Stranger": A gentle, mysterious Christmas Eve visitor awes a family. "Christmas Saved My Mother's Life": A rabbi tells how his mother, fleeing the Holocaust, is spared on Christmas Eve. "First Christmas": Newlyweds take part in a Christmas pageant—and receive a lesson in timeless love.
- In Search of the Real Spirit of Christmas by Dan Schaeffer (232) Christmas seasons come and go, often leaving us with vague pangs of regret. Why does the Christmas spirit seem so elusive? The collection of quotes gathered in Christmas Reflections on the Joy of the Season will hopefully remind readers what the holiday season is all about.
- Christmas Poems by David Stanford Burr (800) Christmas is a season of celebration and remembrance, and its moods are as varied as the songs, stories, and poems it has inspired. From the joyous exaltation of "Deck the Halls" and "Angels We Have Heard on High" to the quiet reflection of John Clare's "December" and William Wordsworth's "Skating," Christmas Poems is a treasury of Christmas meaning, magic, and memories.

#### Administrative Council Meeting Minutes • October 26, 2022

The meeting was opened in prayer at 7:03 PM by Rev. Matt.

The next meeting will be via ZOOM on November 30th at 7 PM. Meetings from November through March will be via ZOOM; Jess Sichel will set this up.

A correction for the Charge Conference Minutes was raised: the Outdoor church pantry was established by the Outreach Committee.

#### Finance Report: Budget

- The proposed budget is underfunded. In addition to other things, a bookkeeper needs to be hired. There is concern from several in the group that the budget is not balanced.
- Lee Ann noted that the budget is very large and doesn't balance; she said that it is good practice to have a balanced budget. That being said, the budget is just a plan. Michelle said that she does not see an alternative. Vicky Wilmer stated that we need to be wise in spending.
- Denny Rill noted that the \$7-\$8,000 listed for the [sanctuary] air conditioning is not accurate. The figure is about doubled. The new estimate received recommended heat pumps.
- The question was raised as to whether we raise the budget or not. Michelle said that we could adapt the budget as we go along.
- A vote was taken, for which 8 were in favor, 4 abstained, and none voted against.

#### Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC)

Linda Yost, SPRC Chairperson, submitted the following report:

The SPRC of Wesley UMC reports on the disaffiliation process (separating from the United Methodist Church) as follows:

- A Sub-Committee was formed from the SPRC to compile information and educate the congregation on the process involved for Wesley UMC to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church.
- o Pastor Gary has been in contact with our District Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Ann Laprade, who provided him with the detailed process that a church needs to go through, step-by-step, to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church.
- After the Ad Council voted to go ahead with this process, this sub-committee organized three showings
  of the required webinar, "Stay or Go" which gave viewpoints and information regarding both the United
  Methodist Church and the Global Methodist Church.
- o Required book discussions of "Living Faithfully Human Sexuality and the United Methodist Church" have been scheduled for three Mondays in November (both afternoon and evening sessions.)
- An "Open Forum" has been scheduled for Saturday, December 3, 2022, from 9:00 a.m. 11:00 a.m. for members of Wesley to ask questions regarding the disaffiliation. Pastor Gary will facilitate this forum, along with members of the SPRC. Rev. Dr. Ann Laprade will be available to answer questions as well.
- A representative from the Global Methodist Church will be invited to speak to the Wesley congregation within the next couple of months.
- o A church conference will be called, likely in the early spring, for members to vote to disaffiliate or not. All votes are to be in person. No absentee balloting is allowed.
- o There will be more information forthcoming as we work our way through the process.

Your SPRC continues with its regular work of reviewing staff performance and filing Charge Conference forms.

There has been a proposal to hire a part-time Treasurer/Bookkeeper for Wesley. The SPRC will assist Laura Waltrup, current Treasurer, with the hiring process.

- A description of the bookkeeper position is being/has been drafted. Laura can help with the advertising. A vote was taken about the bookkeeper position, for which 11 voted "yay," 1 abstained, and none voted against.
- John Sies asked if the bookkeeper description mentioned being eligible to be bonded and signing privileges; it does.

#### Trustees: Denny Rill

- As previously discussed, Denny informed us of the cost of another camera. The new estimate is \$2943.19, which is about \$1,300 or so higher than the original estimate without the additional camera. Ad. Council had "capped" the total expense at \$2,500. Discussion ensued about camera coverage and cemetery vandalism/crime.
- A vote was taken about raising the "cap" to include the additional camera. 12 voted in favor, none were against, and none abstained.
- The Westminster Rescue Mission asked to use our facility here at Wesley and were approved for free use. Stephanie Halley will unlock the facility.
- The roof is in "limbo" between insurance and the contractor. There will not be a replacement of the metal roof, which was recommended. Hopefully, the roof will soon be done.
- Work at the Parsonage is ongoing. Ceiling tiles need to be installed (the framework is there). November 19th, help is needed to cut and put up the tiles.
- The HVAC system will be expensive; Trustees is pursuing a second quote.

#### **Christian Education:**

- The Fall Harvest Celebration went well (photos needed)
- There will be an Advent Carnival [Nov. 27th]
- The Christian Ed. team is looking at old programs from many years ago trying to find something different for the pageant, which will be 12/18/2022.

#### Outreach: (Please see minutes in November 2022 Journal)

- Last Sunday was the final Sunday to order soup from the Outreach Soup Sale, which will be on November 6th (this coming Sunday). Bread will be available, too.
- Operation Christmas Child boxes (and postage) are due November 6th, as well.
- The NESAP Food Drive donations will be taken over the Monday before Thanksgiving.
- Wesley is sponsoring "in-house" Christmas families this year—families that are known to the congregation. Extra things can be donated to NESAP.
- On December 4th, there will be local caroling to the homebound.
- On December 11th, the Cookie Walk will be held in the kitchen (order from the kitchen window). Folks are needed to make cookies and buy cookies.
- UM Student Day: Outreach has thirteen college student names. \$25 gift cards may/will be sent in the mail to support them. The decision has been made not to report the names and information for the college students to the Conference.
- The outdoor food pantry is stocked and used.
