From the Desk of the Pastor...

Friends:

January begins a New Year. The month of January derives its name from Roman mythology. Janus was a god of transitions, one known as an in-between god who straddles events from their beginning to their end. The Roman portrait of Janus depicts him having two faces — one looking back at the past and one pointing to the future.

s we look at the past, what things do we need to jettison to help us face the future?

The process of facing the future while looking back at the past is a good model for us during this time of transition at Wesley. As we look at the past, what things do we need to jettison to help us face the future? As we look towards the future, what important things do we need to hold onto from our

past which strengthen us in facing the future? If Wesley decides to have a congregational vote that determines whether to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church or not to disaffiliate, how will the decided vote effect Wesley's ministry and what relational impact will it have on the life of the congregation? No doubt, this will require serious reflection and deliberate soul-searching from us.

Let us briefly look at the first question. As we look at the past, what things do we need to jettison that will help us face the future?

In the movie, **Delores Claiborne**, Delores (*Played by the actor Kathy Bates*) works cleaning the house of a wealthy elderly woman who lives alone. The woman wants everything done one way – her way – the right way. Delores describes her as a "prisoner of her own ideas."

This can describe the church. We can find ourselves repeating the same patterns and ways of doing things. Over time, churches can become accustomed to doing things one way and one way only. From the past, we jettison only those

things that prevent our spiritual growth toward a greater love of God and love of our neighbors; such things as prejudice based on fear and a lack of understanding and an arrogance made possible by the void of humility.

Of course, it would be unwise to discard all that is in the past. We are indebted to those who have gone before us. There is a lot of good in the past and we need to build on their accomplishments.

This leads us to the second question. As we look towards the future, what important things do we hold onto from our past which will strengthen us in facing the future?

Responding to this question leads us in various directions. However, I would like for us to specifically look at theology and beliefs. Many questions at our Open-Forum held on December 3rd centered on doctrine and beliefs. They are important questions. *On January 14, from 1-3pm, at Wesley Church a presentation by Rev. Joe DiPaolo will be on the Global Methodist Church* (GMC), a new denomination that began May 1, 2022. (Details of the event are in this newsletter.) Our beliefs will be one of the topics addressed in his presentation. I am planning to attend on January 14th so I can listen and learn more about the GMC.

The late Bishop Yeakel often reminded us that every clergy person appointed to a local church becomes the "theologian-in-residence." I, too, believe our core tenets of faith are essential to understanding who we are and to knowing whose we are. So as your appointed pastor, I will be giving a presentation on Saturday, February 4, 2023, at Wesley Church from 1-3 pm to address why I think it is important to stay in the United Methodist Church and provide reasons why I have come to this conclusion. On a personal note, I want you to know that in doing this, I do not belittle the faith of those who may disagree with me. Disagreement happens in every church. When approached with humility and agape love, working through our disagreements can lead us to deeper questions about our faith and provide us an opportunity to understand each other.

So, what will the New Year bring for Wesley during this time of transition and change? The answer to this question will depend on the decisions we make. The good news, however, is we can face the challenges before us by placing our trust and faith in the God who sends us his Son, Jesus. We do not place our trust in Janus or any of Rome's pantheon of gods. Rather, we can claim the sacredness of our past, the availability of God's Spirit working through us in the present, and trust that the future of promise and eternal hope is in God's hands. We follow Jesus who comes as God's gracious gift that is both timely and timeless. Therefore, these words from the book of Hebrews bring us assurance, knowing that "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever" (Heb. 13:8).

From the Staff-Parish Relations Committee:

Wesley Church continues to discern the future of our congregation with regard to "Stay or Go" and the United Methodist Church. Our next opportunity for education about the choices ahead of us will be a presentation about the Global Methodist Church (GMC). On Saturday, January 14, from 1-3pm, we will be hearing from the Rev. Joe DiPaolo, currently the pastor of First UMC in Lancaster, PA and a member of the Wesleyan Covenant Association Global Council, who will be introducing us to the GMC.

The Wesleyan Covenant Association is the body which set in motion the formation of the GMC. The GMC is the new traditionalist Wesleyan denomination which began on May 1, 2022, as a connection for churches which have disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church and would choose a denomination that is focused on the authority of Scripture, classical Wesleyan theology, and traditional orthodox Christian beliefs. Come out and hear about one of the options available for Wesley Church should we approve disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church. There will be a time for questions and answers following the presentation.

The Frank and Loretta Harris Music Scholarship

The Frank and Loretta Harris Music Scholarship program has been established in loving memory of Mr. and Mrs. Harris in dedicated thanks for their lifetime of love and support of music and musicians of Wesley United Methodist Church. Their loyal encouragement has provided musical experiences and opportunities for Wesley members to perform within the church services and in the local community.

The scholarships are open to Wesley member applicants of any age who are studying or planning to study music through private lessons and school lessons. All disciplines are welcomed, including voice, piano, organ, brass, woodwinds, strings, percussion, and composition.

They are also designed to partly include instrument repairs if needed.

Applicant members may also be pursuing college degrees or other suitable dimensions of the practice of musical craft after graduating from high school.

Each year, the recipients should be able to perform several times at Wesley Church during regular worship services or special occasions, of course in coordination with the Music Department. A dedication to musical leadership as a member of Wesley is an important goal to help to ensure that quality church music will be continued for the next generations.

The scholarships usually begin with gifts of \$400-\$1000, depending on the level of study. Each candidate is carefully considered in all aspects which combine to identify that person, their ability, level and dedication. Renewal of awards is considered yearly and strongly encouraged.

A Bracelet with Eternal Value... Words from The Least of These Ministries



When we learn something, there is value in the lesson that is so much more than the knowledge we gain. Lives can be impacted when we pass on that knowledge to others. Our ministry staff recently held an activity with about 70 kids in Batey Santa Maria. The event focused on God's plan of salvation for His children. "It fills me with great joy and emotion to be able to teach that story of the plan

of salvation with the children of batey Santa Maria," said Ricardo, our Ministry Manager. He recalls learning this lesson when he was "very little." Ricardo led the event, along with Wilton, Pastor Ramón, and leaders from the local church. The event included worship, prayer, reading from the bible, and activities. Each child attending the event received an 'Evangelism Bracelet' that has several different colored beads, each representing an element of God's salvation plan. The bracelets were donated by a mission team earlier this year. "I remember a group of Missionaries that used to come with Steve Hull taught us how to make similar bracelets that symbolized the plan of salvation and told us the meaning of each color," Ricardo said. "It was an effective way to keep that story of salvation in our mind and heart." The kids were challenged to share the plan of salvation with their parents and neighbors, explaining the meaning of each color. Ricardo reports that by the end of the event, kids were sharing with one another about what they had learned!

Administrative Council Meeting Minutes • November 30, 2022

The meeting was opened in prayer at 7:09 PM by Pastor Gary.

Finance Report: No Treasurer's Report

Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC)

- Just prior to this meeting and during the first part of this meeting, there was an Open Forum planning meeting.
 - o The group is hoping for a good attendance.
 - o There are a lot of questions and is a lot of information.
 - Breakfast goodies will be served in the hall first, then there will be a bit of worship and a Question and Answer session in the Sanctuary
- At a previous Administrative Council meeting, we moved to education the congregation. Now, in a new motion, are we going to move forward to vote?
 - o It was mentioned that as representatives, we should talk to people and see what the thoughts of the congregation are.
 - We have not yet agreed to go to a vote to stay with the UMC or leave the UMC and go elsewhere.
 - Lee Ann asked if there are people who do not want to vote. Pastor Gary and Linda Yost affirmed that there are.
 - A relatively low number of people (20-25) participated in our recent education activities (book discussions, "Stay or Go" webinar viewing). It was also noted that individuals may be educating themselves separately.
 - Dave asked if it is up to the Administrative Council to determine if we vote. The answer, given by Linda Yost, was "yes," as we are the governing body. Per the District Superintendent, Ann LaPrade, there is no precedence for the D.S. being involved.
 - The Administrative Council must agree to call for a vote. If a vote is called, the deadline to vote is April 30th.
- Some questions were raised concerning the Open Forum:
 - Vicky Wilmer asked if the session will be recorded as requested. Discussion ensued on whether or not and how to record/transcribe/ZOOM the session. [The Open Forum was recorded and uploaded to YouTube on a limited view-ability, meaning individuals must have the link to view the recording. To obtain the link, please contact Linda Yost. Additionally, Jess and Matt Sichel will be working on seeing about a transcription of the YouTube video.]
 - O Discussion continued on the process of the presentation of the questions, some of which have already been submitted and sorted through and some of which will be brought in-person by the gathering. Discussion was also held about the format of the Open Forum—will there be a panel? If a question is asked, will multiple panelists be able to share perspectives?
- On January 14th, Joe DiPaolo from the Global Methodist Church will give a presentation at Wesley UMC.
- Reenie Harris, our incoming librarian for the Harrell Library, asked if copies of the "Living Faithfully" book (there are eight in the Library) should be advertised to the congregation; this idea received a positive response and Reenie was encouraged to let people know that the books are available. - About the vote to call for a vote: The Administrative Council decided to vote whether or not to call for a member vote to stay or go at the January Ad. Council meeting.
- Linda Just filed the last Arena form (Pastor's Evaluation).
- The SPRC has one more staff person to review.

Trustees:
