#### From the Desk of the Pastor...

#### Friends:

Summer is drawing near, temperatures are rising, and outdoor activities are again claiming our attention. We anticipate summertime because the season allows us to experience the wonders of nature and plant our hands in the fresh sod as we tend our gardens. It is a welcome change from the winter months which have confined our movements within the walls of our abode.

Yet as the temperatures rise, my hope and prayer is that we do not let our spiritual and religious commitments cool off. As pastor of thirty-nine years, my observation is that

the summer months are typically characterized by lower attendance at worship and a decrease in the amount of giving. This trend usually means a dramatic drop in church finances for the third quarter. Often this causes some level of anxiety for members of the Finance Committee.

I am praying that each of us will have a summer that renews our energies and offers us a time of re-creation. As you travel, I encourage you to visit other churches and I welcome any worship bulletins you might collect during your visits to other places of worship.

Remember – a long, hot summer does not have to mean a drought in our faith commitments. You and I can use the metaphor "long, hot summer" to inspire our level of commitment to Christ and the ministries to which we have been called. A few years ago, a member of the congregation I was serving gave me a small book to read entitled: 212 – the extra degree. The basic thesis of book is this:

At 211 degrees, water is hot. At 212 degrees, it boils. And with boiling water comes steam. And steam can power a locomotive.

#### Office Transition







#### Administrative Council Minutes • April 26, 2023

Attendees: Jan Kurtz, Chairperson, Brenda Kennedy, Lee Ann Crochunis, Roger Daugherty, Janet Martin, Jonathan Yost, Rev. Matthew Sichel, Jen Ejk, Connie Wiegel, Linda Hollman, Scott Palmer, John Sies, Denny Rill, Linda Yost, Michelle Hudgins, Rev. Gary Sheffield-James, Jess Sichel (and Laura Waltrup by phone).

Meeting was opened by Pastor Gary at 7 PM in prayer.

Jess Sichel shared and gave thanks for the gift she received for Administrative Assistant Appreciation Day!

**SPRC**: Four applications for the church secretary have been received; two have been reviewed. These were through Indeed. Also, a Bookkeeping group from California contacted Pastor Gary (which we are not interested in).

#### Trustees: Roger Daugherty

- First Issue: Rental of the Parsonage
  - What would be the a fair rental at Parsonage? Roger called a couple of different real estate companies. \$1500-\$1700 month would be fair if you get the right person.
  - The ceiling tiles are done [correction: ordered and in as of 5/24/2023], and everything left in the parsonage is for the Rescue Mission or for the person who will be renting the parsonage, if he wants it.
  - o Roger contacted the Revs. Stanley and Charles Harrell and asked about where the income from the rental had to go; according to them, it had to go to housing. Then, Michelle Hudgins said it could go into the General Fund. At the very least, the question needs to go through the District Superintendent. Per Michelle, the Book of Discipline does not say anything about the rental income from the parsonage having to go through housing (only the sale of the parsonage). Rev. Matt Sichel stated that the Baltimore-Washington Conference may have rules of their own. We should also contact the County Commissioners Tax Assessor's Office to discuss if there is an exemption for the property taxes because we are a 501(c)3.
  - o John Sies discussed some of the background of the property at Deer Park that was sold and not rented and the investment failure that occurred at that time. He advised caution on what is done with the money.
  - The question was posed to the Ad Council concerning what it wanted to do with the rental income? Could we ask \$750 month to help someone out?
  - It was noted that the rental contract should end on June 1st of 2024 because if Pastor Gary is no longer here,
     then the parsonage might be needed for the incoming Pastor. Michelle also said we would need to discount

- the rent because of the church use of the parsonage grounds.
- o Jan Kurtz offered to start the process, but she is going on vacation. The renter is interested in moving in right away. Janet Martin stated that a few years back, people were moved in very quickly. Perhaps we can say this is an emergency and the renter (Ryan) can make a donation until the finances are figured out. Ryan may need to move out of transitional housing very soon.
- o Ryan was agreeable to take care of the lawn over by parsonage; we would have to get a lawn mower (talking to Lee Smith was suggested). We've already contracted with the grass cutters to do all the grounds until the end of the mowing year. Laura—if we talked to the tenant and we have a deal about the parsonage—mowing company might be okay with that. The only thing that he would bring in is his bedroom set. We would move unneeded things out and take it to ReStore with him.
- o Linda Hollman asked, can we aim for May 15th? The Ad. Council seemed to agree with that.
- Discussion about the length of the lease and Ryan's need for stability (especially with his family) as well as the furniture ensued.
- The Motion from Ad. Council is: To allow Ryan to rent the parsonage for \$750.00 a month on an emergency basis with a termination agreement of 30 days notice and based on the District Superintendent's response about housing allowance. Vicky Wilmer moved to take up the motion; Linda Hollman seconded the motion. All votes were in favor except four abstentions. It was later noted that the \$750 does not cover the utilities.
- o Jan Kurtz will contact the District Superintendent; Linda Yost will be the back-up contact.
- John Sies noted that just in case someone didn't understand, the issue is not just the rental, but any income and whether it can be applied to the general budget as income or if it has to be held in escrow until such time it is needed as a housing allowance. Laura—understands that the money needs to be restricted; we have other restricted funds in the general account.
- Jan will talk to the County. Michelle stated that if we are renting the parsonage, then it may be seen as a forprofit situation. Laura Waltrup said that we can say that it would be a net-zero gain/loss or otherwise not cover our costs—definitely not for profit.
- Rental agreement—John Martin and Vicky worked on a previous rental agreement. Also, there was an agreement about making repairs and such. John Martin had talked with someone and gotten information about the form. Mike Sichel also worked on that.
- **Scouts:** Phillip Daugherty and the Scouts took care of weeding in the meditation area, in the pit at the parsonage, and tonight, as much as possible in front of the church. There may be some odds and ends to finish up.
- Rental of the Church Property: Roger visited with Julie Morgan, who is interested in running a newly established catholic style K-6 or K-8 school here. She would need eight rooms four under the sanctuary, four in education wing and the fellowship hall (needed for lunch and such; no kitchen except for basics—no stove, etc.) 60 students are signed up; Julie is expecting 75-80 total. A Priest would come in and the Sanctuary would be used once a month. All teachers would be finger-printed and have background checks. The United Methodist Church also has a form the teachers [and other adults] would each need to fill out. The school hours would be 8:45 to 3:15 PM; teachers would work 8 AM to 4 PM; the administrator would work 7 to 4 PM. At least half of the rooms would need to stay set up as much as possible (we would have to see the setup). Cleaning-wise, the school would wipe down the tables that were used and furniture and clean the bathrooms if there was a mess (would cleaning every week or even every day be necessary?) This is in its early stages. Discussion ensued.
  - o About \$5,000-\$7,000 a month would be the income from the rental.
  - o If there is a funeral, school needs to be shut down.
  - o Aiming for the 2024-2025 school year.
  - o There was some concern about the church's water supply; also, most schools have fill-up stations.
  - Can we handle this with our current septic system? Rev. Matt said yes; pump it more frequently. The key to keeping a septic system functioning is to keep it pumped. We have a contract with septic pumping people—as school is starting, they can come so often to check the system and can make recommendations for usage. Last time it was done was not that long ago, per Laura (by John Martin).

- Several questions came up:
  - \* What about Office Space for teachers—printers, copiers, (etc.)?
  - \* How about insurance? What do we do with insurance?
  - \* What about the Fire Marshall and health department inspections, Sprinkler system, (etc.)
  - \* With the money that would come in—same issue as parsonage.
- Motion from Trustees: To move forward with discovery, research, and conversation for the new school possibility. All in favor; none opposed; two abstentions.
- Roger Daugherty is resigning from all committees; Philip is resigning; Pat is resigning. Daugherty family will be leaving. Maintaining membership for now. Would Dean take over the Trustees Committee? Roger will contact.

#### Finance: Michelle Hudgins.

- Copies of the financial report were sent out to the Council via email. Highlights are the general fund, giving, and income. We are \$9,000 less than budgeted year to date—\$13,000+ down from last year. Expected lowered income. However, Operating Expenses are less \$5,000+; good job Laura.
- Laura has developed an alternate budget; we need to do a very fine job of managing expenses because there is no extra money. Laura sent copies of process for expenditures; any money that has to be spent goes through an approval process.
- Laura also stated that two things were mentioned at finance: first, related to Sunday School/VBS, we might have a lot of stuff that could be reused before we purchase extra stuff that is not needed. Secondly—thinking about the supper being cancelled; it could happen in fall; it is a loss of about \$2,500 [per supper]. Laura is thinking about
- having a no-supper fundraiser (like a no-bake bake sale). This would be asking people to make donations [maybe
  about the price they'd spend at the supper] to make up for not having supper. Wouldn't be a lot for each person—
  just a thought.
- Jonathan Yost asked what the major budget reductions are. Michelle Hudgins: Youth program and Youth Leader Salary (money not spent; no leader); Seminary support—\$7,000 to \$6,000; Christian Ed. reduced by \$500 (do we have an inventory?) Pastor's housing allowance, Pastor's pension and benefits, travel, and business expenses (Pastor Gary has offered to stay on—thank you, Pastor Gary!) Secretary's salary—reduce with the new person; church bookkeeper, reduced amount budgeted for new person because of timing; Nursery supervisor (no supervisor); there is more that can be seen on the paperwork available from Finance.
- Any other questions? Bookkeeping position went on Indeed on Monday; 12 applicants since then. Weeded to top 3, who will be talked with over the weekend.
- Discussion about secretary's income; Jess Sichel advised being careful about lowering too much, as current pay is significantly below equitable level for a secretary. Pastor Gary agreed.
- The motion came from Finance to accept the Amended Budget. Vote was in favor of revised Budget with five abstentions and one against. The motion carried.

#### Pastor's Report: Pastor Gary

- There will be a 2023 Summer Sermon Series on The Fruits of the Spirit (Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self-Control (see schedule elsewhere in this issue of the Journal.)
- The last day of Sunday school is May 21<sup>st</sup>. Summer worship time at 10 am will start on Sunday, June 4<sup>th</sup>.
- Pastor Gary has registered on the **Safe Gatherings** website to begin the process of getting a background check.
- He will be attending the **Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference** at the Hilton Hotel in Baltimore from May 31<sup>st</sup> to June 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- I will be on vacation from June 12 to June 26<sup>th</sup>. Guest preachers are needed for June 18<sup>th</sup> (Linda Yost) and 25<sup>th</sup> (Rev. Matthew Sichel).

#### **Christian Education:**

- Last day of Sunday School is May 21st. Pavilion activities, games, crafts, lesson (weather permitting).
- VBS—June 20-22<sup>nd</sup>. Wrap up activities and song the Sunday after? Sunday, June 25<sup>th</sup>. "Twists and Turns" Game theme. Fundraise for materials for things like CDs and such.
