From the Desk of the Pastor...

"Words kill, words give life; they're either poison or fruit – you choose."

Proverbs 18:21 - <u>The Message</u> by Eugene Peterson

Dear Friends,

Someone once said, "Choose your words carefully because someday you might have to eat them." Have you ever said something that you wished you could take back? Have you ever apologized to another person for words you may have used? I dare say we have all used words that have gotten us into trouble.

Proverbs 18:21 says, "Words kill, words give life; they're either poison or fruit – you choose." Here the psalmist makes it quite clear – the words we use have consequences. Words impact others – either positively or negatively.

That is an important principle to keep in mind as we begin a busy fall. Let me start first by sharing a word or two about the ministries happening here at Wesley.

I want to thank everyone who participated in the **group meetings** I facilitated in August. I am now in the process of tabulating all the responses I received from each group that addressed the three questions: 1) What does Wesley Church celebrate? 2) What do you see as the challenges Wesley is facing? and 3) How do you see the Holy Spirit leading Wesley in the future? I will share this with the Administrative Council and congregation. 
Pastor Gary will be leading this study. Please come and join with others as we explore our faith together. The first class will begin Sunday, September 10 at 9:30 am.

Update on Jerrett Peake



Jerrett Peake, WO₃ USMC, is retiring. August, 2003, a boy who has grown up here at Wesley, boarded a bus to Parris Island to become one of our finest – a U.S. Marine.

Twenty years later this boy has become a man and is standing tall as one of our finest, a Warrant Officer 3 in the United States Marine Corps.

Jerrett started out as a Private, just like most; he quickly proved himself and showed what he was capable of doing. Wesley Church has prayed for Jerrett as he navigated bootcamp, weapons training/development and several postings. Wesley prayed for him when he was in the desert – fighting for a cause many

didn't support. But you supported him, and he felt your prayers when he needed them the most.

Wesley celebrated when he was chosen to be one of the elite, a Warrant Officer – respected by enlisted and commissioned as "someone who knows their stuff."

You still pray for him over in Okinawa, where he has been for several years. You can send letters and notes of encouragement. You pray for him and his wife Sayaka when you see a storm pass over that tiny island and ask if they are okay.

Administrative Council Meeting Minutes • June 28, 2023

Attendees: Jan Kurtz, Janet Martin, Jonathan Yost, Pastor Gary, Connie Wiegel, John Sies, Scott Palmer, Denny Rill, Michelle Hudgins, Dave Hudgins, Laura Waltrup, Brenda Kennedy, and Vicky Wilmer



Pastor Gary opened the meeting at 7:05 with prayer. Jan thanked everyone for coming to this important meeting.

Laura shared with us several balance sheets that depicted the church's financial records over the last six months.

- She noted that currently we are under budget on our program expense, office expenses, and maintenance and repair budget. We have all been working hard to control spending.
- However, in the last 6 weeks our income has been down by approximately 26%.
- We have paid our apportionments through May, but we **will not** be paying our apportionments until further notice as we do not have the funds to pay them. Only 10% of our budget goes to apportionments.
- At the current rate of giving, we will not be able to pay our current incoming bills.

After much discussion, we all agreed that we needed to communicate to the church membership that we have a large shortfall that needs to be met in order for our doors to stay open. Pastor Gary and Michelle Hudgins will draft letters to send out to the congregation apprising them of our financial difficulties.

A motion was made by Laura that we re-appropriate the money from the wreath fundraiser (\$636.39), the youth program fund (\$3,805.92) and the praise team/contemporary fund (\$933.14) to the unrestrictive general fund to cover current and projected shortfalls to the budget. Dave Hudgins seconded the motion. The vote was unanimously approved.

A question was raised do we need to let the conference know that we will not be paying our apportionments. Pastor Gary will speak to the DS and make her aware of this fact.

<u>Parsonage</u>

We had to incur some expenses recently at the parsonage. We had to replace the dryer and the dishwasher. Currently the A/C is not working in the parsonage. Laura bought two window air conditioners for the parsonage. There was discussion on where we would get the money to pay for the dish washer and dryer.

Connie made a motion to use \$1,300 from the WIP fund to pay for the dryer and the dishwasher for the parsonage. Denny seconded it. The motion was passed unanimously.

Laura asked that we all be in prayer about the financial difficulties of our church and to share this information with other members.

There was a discussion about email difficulties. Some people are getting emails from the church, but others are not. Jessie will be working on this issue.

Dawn is doing a great job! She is working hard to learn the many tasks at Wesley.

~Pastor Gary closed the meeting in prayer at 8:30pm.


