From the Desk of the Pastor...

Friends,

I remember well the week that lasted forever. It was the year 1986 and I agreed to be a summer camp director for a week in August. When asked to be a director, I reluctantly answered with a timid 'Yes.' I had never attended summer camp as a youngster; nor did I even volunteer to be a camp counselor as a staff member. Because of no previous experience, I didn't have the foggiest idea of what to expect. You probably are wondering why I agreed to accept such a task. At the time, I was a newly ordained pastor and felt obligated to answer the conference's call to serve.

The theme for summer camp would be 'community.' After receiving a resource packet in the mail, I set out to build my staff. After making numerous phone calls asking for volunteers of which were answered by a long list of 'no's,' I finally created a staff not of my choice, but a staff comprised of those who finally agreed. My staff consisted of two adults (counting myself) and four teenagers. We managed to meet a couple of times before arriving to lead our appointed week at camp.

Finally, the week arrived. My first day I spent time talking to the parents of a child who was standing in front of me crying and demanding her parents to take her home. The parents refused to do so, and I was now in the position of convincing her to stay. The next day it started to rain, which continued off and on throughout the entire week. Thus, we spent most of our time in the dorms playing indoor games and singing songs. This routine gets old rather fast for 30 energetic middle school kids. We came prepared for activities designed for a 'discovery' camp; events designed to take place outside. I learned that week the meaning of the phrase, "Preparing for a rainy day."

The third night I spent time looking for two of my teenage counselors. It seems they were more interested in the two teenage boys who were working in the camp dining hall as dishwashers for their summer jobs. After managing to locate them and bring them back to the dorm, I was able to get a few hours of sleep.

I found myself praying for the week to end soon and being emancipated from my assignment as camp director. The week that was to build up community turned out to be one marred by having a dysfunctional staff, dealing with homesick middlers, and forced to alter our planned events due to constant rains.

Problems do arise and circumstances readily change. I also learned that the world does not conform to my personal feelings. A little girl's life was changed at summer camp, and she thanked me for helping make that happen.

As the season of thanksgiving nears, we, too, know the world isn't as it should be. Building community in the church, nation, and world is an enormous task and we face numerous detours and distractions. Yet we can show gratitude to one another and learn to see the best in one another. Let me be the first to begin: I thank each of you for helping me to grow and helping me to learn what it means to live in community.



All Saints' Day - November 5



Administrative Council Meeting Minutes • September 27, 2023

Committee Reports

- 1. Staff Parish Relations Committee –no report
- 2. Trustees: no report
- 3. The Finance Committee met last Wednesday via Zoom 9/20/2023.
 - a. Donations have increased a bit and the pew dedications received to date (\$3,700) have helped offset the deficits we incurred since March. You will see from the last report (income and expense by month) that August was the first month since January, that our income was more than expenses.
 - b. The key will be sustainability. While there is not an imminent concern for covering expenses, the Finance Committee does not believe that income at the current levels will be sustainable and will not cover our current expense levels.
 - c. We will be preparing budget scenarios for the Finance Committee to review in the coming week to be shared with SPRC and ultimately Ad Council to vote on in November.
 - d. The Finance Committee is planning on kicking off a pledge campaign to obtain committed support from our membership to financially support Wesley. Dave Hudgins can speak more to this.
 - e. Laura will be serving as Treasurer until year end reporting is completed (Statistical Report, W-2s, and assistance with contribution statements as necessary) anticipated through January/early February. We will be looking at how the day to day financial operations will need to change with respect to authorized bank signers, review and approval process for expenditures and check signing, reporting, etc...
 - f. We need someone familiar with QuickBooks who has the capacity to donate about 5 hours of their time each month to oversee the accounting functions and serve on the Finance Committee.
- 4. Dave suggested we do a pledge campaign. This could help us have a more sustainable program. Each week short testimonies and discussion about the money use. Do this over a series of 4 weeks. Put out quarterly statement to people about how they have done in relation to the church. Discussion that we should target people who are on the rolls but not attending.
 - a. We could discuss it on Harvest Sunday
 - b. Stewardship Sunday
- 5. Men's Group
 - a. Seven men attended breakfast fellowship at Bob Evans on 9/19
 - b. Pastor Gary provided the devotion
 - c. Business:



Orphan Stone Donations



Autumn has arrived, and the Wesley UMC Cemetery Committee is accepting donations for the repair of "Orphan Stones." Even though the cemetery is not responsible for repairs to the monuments, we have many older ones that have no family left to repair them—thus they are "Orphan Stones."

Time and weather have caused these older monuments to break, tilt, or fall. The earliest marked burial is 1841 and there are nearly 1,000 former members of our church buried in the cemetery. Our church has a wonderful history, going back over 234 years!

At this time, we have used many of the funds designated for Orphan Stones with repairs that need to be made to them. In honor of and in gratitude to those people who founded and sustained our church, and to keep our cemetery in good repair and appearance, we ask for your support. You may send your tax-deductible donation, made out to Wesley

United Methodist Church or put it in the collection plate at any time. Be sure to add your name to the outside of an envelope and if you have a regular church envelope, please include that number, also. Mark it for the "Orphan Stones" or Wesley Cemetery. 
Small Groups develop discussion skills and thinking, explore attitudes, and share and reflect upon experiences.
