The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Sacred Scripture: As I continue the catechesis
on the Mass, the Eucharistic Prayer follows the Pref-
ace. There are multiple Eucharistic Prayers for the pre-
sider of the mass to choose from. The missalette has
Eucharistic Prayers I, II, III and IV listed in the section
with the light gray page borders.

There is a lot going on with each Eucharistic
Prayer. We offer thanksgiving to God, especially ex-
pressed in the Preface but also throughout the Eucha-
ristic Prayer. We acclaim the Holiness and Glory of
God. This is where we also acclaim with action by
kneeling before our Lord. We invoke the power of the
Holy Spirit which is indicated by the altar server ring-
ing the bell as the priest lays his hands over the gifts of
bread and wine. We listen to the institution narrative
and witness the consecration of the bread and wine's
substances changed into the the body, blood, soul and
divinity of Jesus Christ. We remember, as Christ com-
manded us, the passion, death, resurrection and ascen-
sion of Jesus Christ. We offer Jesus to the Father and
also ourselves in union with Jesus. We make interces-
sion with the whole of Christ's body for the conver-
sion of sinners, strengthening of the living faithful and
the release of the suffering dead to heaven. We affirm
all that this Prayer has included with the prayer,
Amen.

This is why we have the saying that heaven
touches earth in every mass. If we could only see our
guardian angels exuberant in joy; If we could only see
the saints and Holy Angels in heaven all present sing-
ing the Sanctus; If we could only see the suffering
souls pleading to God for each of us since they can no
longer pray for themselves; If we could only see this,
our hearts would melt with love and our gaze captured
in the moment of joy with God; If we could see that
we are standing with Mary, Mary Magellan and John
the Apostle before Jesus dying for us on the hill of
Calvary then why would we see mass as a burden?

mass as the greatest act of love to God and our neigh-
bors.
