Sacred Scripture: As we continue the catechesis on apologetics, I would like to explain the reality that God doesn't change. Some religions believe that God the Father is an "exalted man" who once had a god above him but when he died and rose from the dead, he was judged worthy to become a god of his own section of the physical universe. Not everyone believes in something so radical but there are people who believe that the teachings of God are outdated and/or the truths of God can be adapted to the current circumstances an individual is living in.

God does not change. God is love and his love doesn't change. God is truth and his truth doesn't change. God exists outside of time therefore he has always known what will happen throughout the whole course of time. When God first created the universe he knew what each of us would be doing, where we would be doing it, when we would be doing it and why we would be doing it.

However time is not predetermined. God doesn't know the future because it already happened for him. God knows the future because he exists outside of time and is unchanged by the course of time.

There is another heresy called modernism which states just the opposite, that God's ways change in reaction to the evolution of man's development. Man doesn't evolve, he matures. Humanity doesn't become another species, we become what we were created to be. Morality doesn't adapt, we must find new ways to explain the ways of God because cultures change over time. The commandments and beatitudes and ways of Christ still resonate to the humble heart. God doesn't change, we must change to image God.
