

## Sacred Scripture

For this catechism I will be listing the Precepts of the Catholic Faith. As I explained before that we Catholics believe there is more to following Christ than what is revealed in Sacred Scripture. In the Gospel of John 16:12-13, Jesus tells us, "I have yet many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come." From this declaration, in union with the whole of Christ's teaching and revelation throughout the whole of Scripture, we believe that Jesus is also teaching that the Holy Spirit will preserve the Pope alone and the Bishops in union with the Pope from declaring something false pertaining to matters of faith and morals. God himself continues to give this grace today.

From the teaching of a gathering of all the Bishops in union with the Pope, we have the teaching of the Catholic Precepts. Precepts have been given since the Didache was written by the Apostles. Various Popes throughout the history of the church have given different sets of precepts depending on the needs of the time. We must not use the precepts as a way of doing the bare minimum. The first commandment tells us to love the Lord our God with our whole heart, our whole mind and our whole strength. Doing the bare minimum is not showing love. When we love, we give our all in the relationship.

In the following catechism, I will explain each one but I shall list them here. The number preceding is the number of the paragraph in the book, the Catechism of the Catholic Church. 2042 - You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation. 2042 - You shall confess your sins at least once a year. 2042 - You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least during the Easter season. 2043 - You shall keep the holy days of obligation. 2043 - You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence.
