Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

However, consult me about an examination of conscience for venial sins. The more we grow in the love of God, the more we are held accountable for our lesser sins. In catechism, I will explain the pronunciation of the prayer Lamb of God in ecclesiastical latin.

In English the prayer is:

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

In Ecclesiastical Latin the prayer is:

Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccáta mundi: miserére nobis.

Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccáta mundi: miserére nobis.

Agnus Dei, qui tollis peccáta mundi: dona nobis pacem.

Agnus is pronounced: Ah-knoose (the kn is pronounced similar to the kn in knowledge)

Dei is pronounced: Day-ee

Qui is pronounced: Quee

tollis is pronounced: toll-lease

Peccáta is pronounced: Peck-kah-tah with the emphasis on kah

Mundi is pronounced: Moon-dee

Miserére is pronounced: Me-zay-ray-ray with the emphasis on the first ray

Nobis is pronounced: no-beese

Dona is pronounced: Doe-nah

Pacem is pronounced: Pah-chim
