SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

Sacred Scripture: In this Catechism, I would like to take about the Octave celebration. In our liturgical calendar for the mass in English, we celebrate two octave celebrations: the octave of Christmas and the octave of Pasch. Octave comes from the latin word for eight. In liturgy, an octave is eight days, one day of festivity and the seven days that follow it. Each day is considered in union with the first day. The day of an octave is eight 24 hour periods of time. One way we show this distinction in Pasch is in the dismissal. After Easter, I chanted “Go in peace, Alleluia, Alleluia,” to which the people responded, “Thanks be to God, Alleluia, Alleluia.” This dismissal is used throughout the octave of Pasch after each mass.
