Sacred Scripture: As I continue on my catechesis on apologetics, I would like to talk about Apostolic succession. According to the Vatican II council document, *Lumen Gentium*, “In order that the mission entrusted to them might be continued after their death, [the apostles] consigned, by will and testament, as it were, to their immediate collaborators the duty of completing and consolidating the work they had begun, urgent them to tend to the whole flock, in which the Holy Spirit had appointed them to shepherd the Church of God. They accordingly designated such men and then made the ruling that likewise on their death other proven men should take over their ministry.” The authority of shepherding souls comes through the line of succession beginning with the 12 appointed by Christ.

Unfortunately many non-catholics reject this teaching. However, if we look to the Scriptures we see the succession from the apostles. In Acts 1:15-16, a council convened, led by Peter, to replace Judas with another member of the twelve for they were eleven. They prayed, discussed and drew lots and the lots fell on Matthias who was numbered among the twelve. Here we see the Apostles understanding that they have the responsibility to appoint a successor for a specific mission.

We also look to Paul’s first letter to the Thessalonians. In 1 Thess. 2:6,7 Paul identifies two men, Silvanus and Timothy as “apostles” who were ordained as bishops and regarded as having apostolic authority. The word apostle in the greek literally means “one who is sent.” In that sense all the baptized are apostles, but Paul is using the word apostle to refer to specific persons within the body of Christ. Those who have the authority through the laying on of hands by one with the authority from Christ to do so.

We can teach, we can prophecy, we can admonish with the wisdom of God through our baptism but that doesn’t mean we have the authority of the specific mission given through apostolic succession.
