Sacred Scripture:

As we continue on the catechesis of the mass, I would like to talk about the commingling and the Lamb of God. The commingling is when the priest takes a piece of the Eucharistic bread and mingles it with the Eucharistic wine symbolizing the union of the body and blood of our Lord Jesus in the Eucharist. We receive the whole Jesus, body, blood soul and divinity when we receive Jesus in the sacred hosts and also when we receive Jesus in the sacred wine. The commingling is also a sign of the unity of priests with their Bishop. The Bishop has the full authority of Jesus Christ the Head and all his priests share in that authority in union with the Bishop.

The Lamb of God echoes the proclamation of St. John the Baptist who announced the first coming of the Messiah by saying, "Behold the Lamb of God." By praying or singing this prayer, we proclaim the coming of Jesus to us in the Sacraments and in our hearts. We make a choice and express a desire in this prayer for Jesus to come to us and save us.
