

Sacred Scripture

In this Catechism, I will talk about the sin of gossip and the love of discretion. When Jesus suffered, died and rose from the dead, He did many things for us including restoring our reputations. This is why gossip is sinful and offensive to God. When we gossip, we undo the work of Jesus in the individual we gossip about. Also, if we love someone then we don't want to do any damage to them or cause them any hurt. Part of this is being discreet.

Some people use discretion to hid their sinful and sometimes criminal behavior. They may even gaslight their loved ones to manipulate them into keeping secrets. Everyone is responsible for their own behavior: good or bad. When we do bad behavior, we must endure the consequences responsibly.

Gossip is when we reveal a persons sins unnecessarily in order to either destroy their reputation or hurt them. Gossip could also lead to reporting lies about someone to either destroy their reputation or hurt them.

It is responsible to report criminal behavior to lawful authorities. It is responsible for students and coworkers to report behavior unbefitting of work ethics or respectful treatment of others to the appropriate supervisor. If we love the person, then there is a way to correct them with respect as taught by Jesus in the gospel we read this Sunday.

Gossip also breaks the fifth commandment, "Thou shall not kill." If someone gossips or has a habit of gossip, that person may have some anger in their heart that they are not processing in a healthy way. In such a case, it would be good to take this to prayer and ask the Holy Spirit for help. It may also be good to talk about this anger with a trusted friend.
