Sacred Scripture: During Lent, I will suspend the teaching on catechesis in apologetics to teach some basic Latin. The reason why latin is used in the mass is because when Jesus was crucified, Pilate had an inscription written in Hebrew, Latin and Greek placed on the cross. The inscription read, "Jesus the Nazorean, the King of the Jews." Since Jesus dying on the cross is what conquered the kingdom of Satan, all demons cannot stand the three languages of this inscription. Therefore we use Hebrew every time we pray "Alleluia" or "Amen." We use Greek when we pray, "Kyrie Eleison. Christie Eleison." We use latin throughout the mass.

Some people object by saying that they don't understand latin. Words are just symbols to convey ideas. It may take some exercise of our brains but we do so for the love of God.

To understand Latin, we must first understand who to pronounce the vowels. A is pronounced ah. E is pronounced eh. I is pronounced ee. O is pronounced oh. U is pronounced oo. The vowels are pronounced: ah, eh, ee, oh, oo. Pater in Latin does not rhyme with water. It is pronounced Pah-tehr. I will teach the responses in Latin using phonetic spellings to help. I hope everyone practices at home.
