YOU AND YOUR CHURCH V. THE WORLD

Our Parish can handle whatever the world throws at you—as a team—if we used the "church against the world" perspective.

In churches it is easy to fall into a mindset that it is us versus the world, even when we have been part of our local church for a long time. When new people come into the church and change the culture, or new things are developed we disagree with, or feeling not quite as connected as before, and feeling like we are fighting



against each other on everything. It is damaging the relationships within the church.

Here are three scenarios to make it work for you.

Your church vs. the situation

Imagine a stressful, disappointing, or unexpected turn of events that you have no control over. Maybe everyone gets sick and you have to cancel an activity that has been planning for ages. Or you fall and break your leg two days before the event. Instead of taking your negative emotions (frustration, anger, stress) out on others, it can be helpful to have something else to take the brunt of it — in this case the external situation. Unify behind how ridiculous your luck is, and help each other see the positive or humorous side of things. Be a source of support and comfort and enable reconnecting over this less-than-ideal situation.

You vs. another member of the congregation

Okay, so you're not really going against that person. Maybe that person

is throwing a antrum about one issue or another. Or someone expects you to do something time consuming when you have already had a long busy week. Or you don't think others are taking responsibility for the work of the church. Instead of taking frustration, fatigue, and general feelings of overwhelm out on each other, try channeling it into being a good teammate. Hype each other up and give each other the boost you both need to get through the challenge.

Your church vs. an imaginary third party

Instead of nagging others about those mundane yet irritating things they do (or don't do), come up with a fake character that you blame instead. Maybe it's Chaz the Freeloading Roommate who never packs or unpacks the dishwasher. Or the mysterious Bag Monster who leaves the Op Shop donations blocking the emergency exit. Maybe we might joke, "Looks like Chaz is at it again!" Or "Oh no, the Bag Monster needs glasses!" When we can communicate our minor annoyances with a sense of humour, we can prevent things from degrading into an unnecessary argument while still getting our point quietly across. We need to be sure we are having real discussions and taking responsibility for deeper conflicts as necessary at our Parish Community Growth Meetings.

The whole principle behind this is remembering that we are a team. While this is true all the time, leaning into this is especially helpful in situations when it's easy to slip into the opposite way of thinking. Maybe you can think od some scenarios in which you could utilize "us " thinking? against


