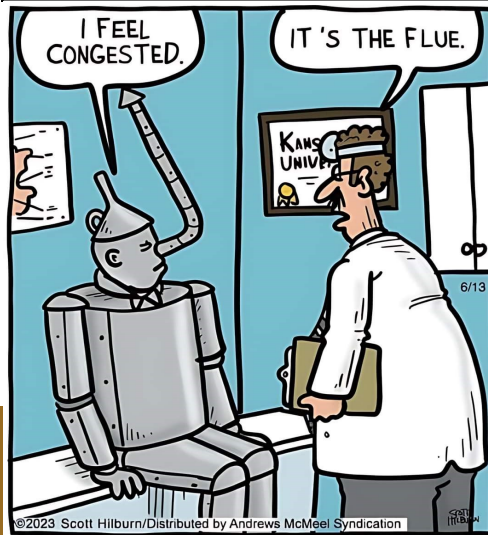

DIOCESAN REGISTRAR MALCOLM TADGELL RESIGNS

Malcolm Tadgell has resigned as Registrar of the Diocese and the Chief Executive Officer of the Melbourne Anglican Diocesan Corporation (MADC) and will conclude in the role on Friday 4 July. Interim Registrar and CEO appointments will be made for this time of transition and you will be advised in due course.

Malcolm began as Registrar in March 2020 (just prior to the first Covid-19 lockdown). In 2023 he then accepted the combined role of Registrar and CEO leading the Executive team at the Diocesan Centre. In that time he has led the move to holding our Synods online, the streamlining and digitisation of the Registry records, the development of the Governance Handbook, and guiding parishes with respect to land tax.

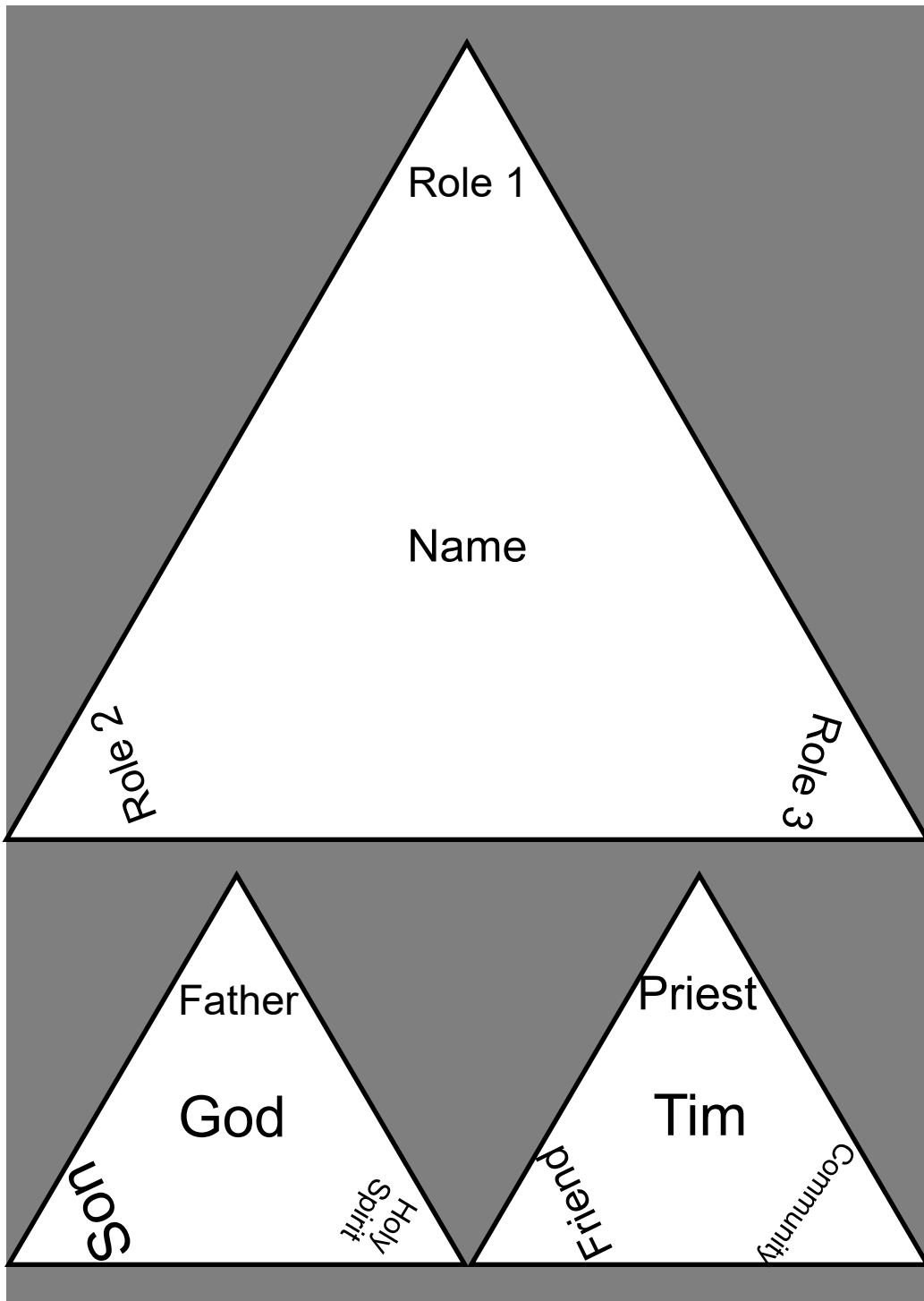
Malcolm has also played a critical role in the development of Safe Ministry in our Diocese, responding to Regulators including the Commission for Children and Young People and our ongoing response to Redress claims with compassion and great care.

He played a key role in bringing together the submission to the Yoorrook Justice Commission on behalf of the Dioceses of Melbourne, Bendigo, Gippsland and Wangaratta.

A particular gift Malcolm brought to these roles has been his ability to understand the needs and perspectives of parishes and our many stakeholders. As such his contribution to our governance bodies and assisting the Episcopate has been invaluable. I am sure you will join me in heartfelt thanks for the contribution Malcolm has made both as Registrar and CEO of MADC. The Anglican Diocese of Melbourne is richer for his service and well placed to welcome our new Archbishop-elect.

Malcolm has expressed his gratitude for the relationships he has developed and the many kindnesses that have been extended to him by innumerable people across our Diocese. He seeks to continue to participate fully in the life of the Church – not least as a valued parishioner of St George's Malvern!

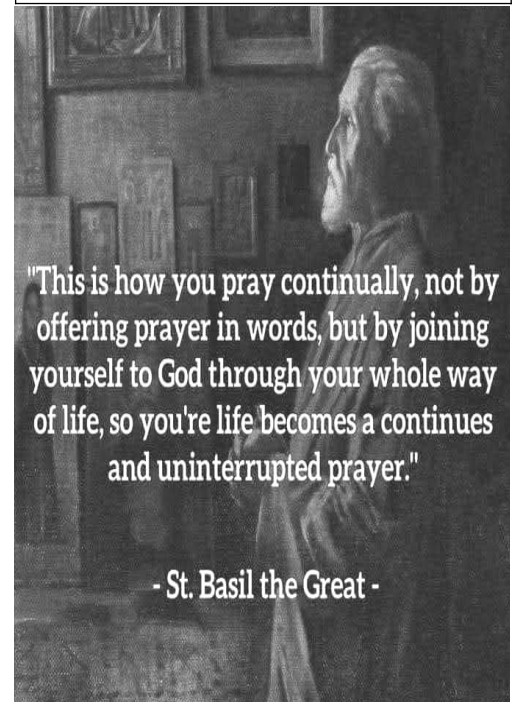
