

HOPE: FROM ISAIAH 40-55

Vivian Wang tells of her story of learning a deeper trust in God through difficulty.

I've often heard that suffering is the touchstone of faith. I believe many people choose to follow the Lord and have their faith refined in times of suffering.

I first came to know Christ through a friend who would invite me to her Christmas gatherings. There, I met many Christians and witnessed the flourishing of the church, which made me want to learn more about God. God prepared a lady to lead me in Bible study, and she always prayed for my problems. She would say, 'One day, you will understand.' When I was willing to open my heart and let Jesus be the Lord of my



life, I looked back on my journey and realised that God had showered me with grace in the midst of my suffering.

The test of faith also came to me as a Jesus' follower. In March 2023, my shop was relocating. Though I considered myself experienced and capable, this time I didn't handle the renovations like I did the previous times. Instead, I chose to let go of myself and entrust everything to God. Because I am His child, I believe that my Father in heaven will surely take care of me.

After much consultation and consideration, a contractor found me. I believed he was the person God had prepared. However, he created problems and continually wore me out. At the same time, I was working fulltime and studying part-time. I became physically and mentally exhausted. I lost my appetite and started having insomnia. Despite this, I

Worship Today: THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT

Sentence: 'As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts,' says the Lord. *Isaiah* 55:9



still believed that God would remove the suffering and bring everything to fruition. I prayed continuously, entrusting everything to God and seeking His will.

In the end, the contractor took almost all the money and never returned. A sister prayed for me and said, 'Don't lose faith in God.' As I left her house, I began to think, 'God didn't intervene in this unfair situation. Do I still trust Him? Do I still love Him?'

The very next day, God intervened. I met a friend I hadn't seen in years, and he resolved my electricity and air conditioning issues. Another friend introduced me to a plumber, who fixed all the renovation problems in a single day.

I see that for God, solving a problem can happen in a single day. More importantly, I've experienced that with God's grace, I can surely overcome suffering.

Indeed, 'I had heard of You before, but now I have seen You with my own eyes.'

Questions for reflection:

- 1. How do you reconcile the idea in Isaiah that the discipline through suffering and ultimate comfort come from the same source of God's heart?
- 2. Isaiah 40:1-11 reflects the exodus from Egypt under Moses. How does the 40 years in the wilderness reveal hope through God's discipline of suffering and comfort?
- 3. In what ways does Jesus as servant and his suffering and death on the cross give you hope?
- 4. In what ways does your life manifest that God brings you strength of faith and knowledge of God's grace through suffering? How does that give you hope facing difficulties in the future?
- 5. Can you think of someone going through a time of difficulty? How could you share that hope with someone who is going through a time of difficulty?

Pray:


God of hope,
